#### Ranariddh tells voters

# US, other states will reject Hun Sen's bid to snatch victory

PREY VENG, Cambodia, July 17: Opposition leader Prince Norodom Ranariddh told Cambodian voters Friday that the United States and other countries would reject any bid by his arch-rival, Hun Sen, to rob him of victory in elections July 26. reports AP.

Ranariddh hoped to assure voters jittery of post-election violence that casting a ballot for his royalist FUNCINPEC party would not lead to a new round of armed conflict in the country's turbulent politics.

The prince finished atop UNsponsored elections in 1993 but was forced to accept a co-premiership when Hun Sen threatened civil war. The power-sharing arrangement ended in pitched street battles last year when Hun Sen seized power in a bloody takeover.

"If you want to vote for FUNCINPEC and people scare you that there will be a war if we win, don't worry," Ranariddh said. "The Friends of Cambodia, especially the United States, will not tolerate those who lose the elections refusing to transfer power.

The Friends of Cambodia are a loose group including the United States, Australia, France, Japan and several other countries who put pressure on Hun Sen after last year's coup to allow the Prince to return from exile and contest a new election.

## Dowry identified as main cause of repression on women

The speakers at a seminar yesterday underscored the need for awakening religious morality in society against repression

on women, reports BSS. They said freedom of women cannot be ensured without establishment of human rights for all.

The seminar, titled "Repression on Women and its Remedy," organised by Nari Adhikar Andolon,' was addressed by Dr UA B Razia Akhtar Banu. Dr Syeda Asgari Ahmed Rashida Ameen and Rasheda Begum. Dr UK Rawjatur Rumman presented the keynote paper. Prof Cheman Ara, president of the organisation presided over the function, held at Jatiya Press Club in the city.

The speakers identified dowry as the main cause of repressions on women across the country. They sought cooperation of conscious civil society for campaigning against dowry.

Hun Sen noted that security in the elections has been better than in many other Asian countries

Both Hun Sen and Ranariddh said that in the event of an inconclusive election result, they would be willing to form a coalition with the third major candidate, prominent dissident Sam Rainsy, a onetime finance minister and FUNCINPEC member.

The Prince said he would be willing to enter a partnership with Hun Sen's formerly communist Cambodian People's Party, if a new leader replaces

Hun Sen. Hun Sen said his top priority if victorious would be to revive the economy. Cambodia is one of the world's poorest countries. and his coup resulted in aid cuts and lost investor confidence at the same time that richer Southeast Asian countries suffered economic meltdowns

# India's lower house approves budget

NEW DELHI, July 17: India's powerful lower house of par-liament approved the first bud-get of the Hindu nationalistsled government Friday, ensur-ing passage into law of proposals to protect domestic industry against foreign competition and spend more on infrastruc-ture, defense and nuclear energy, reports AP.

India economic future was not threatened by anti-nuclear sanctions imposed by the United States and others, Finance Minister Yashwant Sinha in his speech urging lawmakers to adopt the finance bill. They followed with a voice vote of approval.

"No projects will be allowed to suffer on that account," Sinha said of sanctions. "We can stand up to any international blackmail. The country has the capacity."

He estimated India stood to lose dlrs 1.5 billion in international assistance as punishment for conducting nuclear tests in May.

The lower house of parliament passed the budget and its approval by the upper house next week is a mere formality before it becomes law.

Before the vote, Sinha offered a few amendments to the budget he first outlined to parliament June 1. Among the changes was an additional four per cent import duty, which he said the domestic industry needed as protection for some time before it could take on international competition.

India began dismantling state controls seven years ago following a socialist-patterned economy for more than four

The 1998-99 federal budget contained a 14 per cent increase in defence expenditures and a hefty 68 per cent hike in spending on atomic energy. The defense expenditure was raised to 412 billion rupees (dlrs 10 billion) from 361 billion rupees

(dlrs 8.6 billion) last year.
India will spend 611 billion
rupees (dlrs 1.5 billion) — a 35 per cent increase from last year - on the key infrastructure areas of energy, transportation and communications.

Sinha also promised a has-sle-free procedure for foreign investors who have complained that bureaucratic red tape presents a huge obstacle to doing business in India.

Sinha already has announced opening the govern-ment-owned insurance sector to competition from private In-dian companies. The govern-ment was considering the question of allowing foreign com-panies in the insurance sector, the minister told Parliament on Friday.

## Korean textile mills to go on production in Nov

A 25 million US dollar composite textile mills, owned by South Korean entrepreneur, in Savar Export Processing Zone will come on stream in November, it was disclosed during a meeting in the city with the visiting deputy minister for foreign affairs and trade of Republic of Korea.

Shin Shung-on while talking to the BSS at the residence of Korean ambassador said the mill, as part of the relocation of Korean industries is expected to help Bangladesh overcome the restriction imposed by European community in enjoying facilities. Daeyu Bangladesh Ltd, a Korean company, owns the textile mill.

Tae Kyu Han, ambassador of ROK was present during the interview. He said that except energy sector - exploration of gas and power generation - Korea is the number one investor in

#### US approves thalidomide for use against leprosy

WASHINGTON, July 17: Thalidomide, a drug that caused nightmarish birth defects in the 1950s, has been approved for use against leprosy in the United States, the drug's manufacturer said on Thursday, reports AFP.

Celgene Corp said the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has approved the drug's sale for treatment of erythema nodosum leprosum, a severe and debilitating condition associated with leprosy.

Thalidomide, which was used outside the United States in the 1950s to treat nausea in pregnant women, caused numerous deformities in children born to the women taking it. Celgene said it licensed

rights to thalidomide from the Rockfeller University, in 1992 and began ueveloping the drug for AIDS-related, dermatological and cancer-related conditions.

The company said it was king precautions to ensure the drug is not taken by pregnant women. Doctors who prescribe it and pharmacists who sell the drug will get educational materials.

Before a prescription is filled, a copy of an informed consent form must be presented at the pharmacy. The prescriptions will be for 28 days with no automatic renewals.

## Troops ordered to crack down on looters in Indonesia

JAKARTA, July 17: Indone-sia's military chief Friday ordered his troops to crack down on looters after mobs raided farms and plantations, reports

Disputes over land ownership have also flared recently, including one between a group of disgruntled villagers and ex-President Suharto over a cattle

Poor farmers have also tried to take back land now used as a golf course near Jakarta.

"The government will not tolerate looting or the taking of others land because this is against the law," said military commander Gen Wiranto, who is also defense minister. "I have ordered the security forces throughout the country to anticipate and prevent this kind of action from happening.

"I ordered them to take action and to arrest those involved," he said.

Lawlessness has increased after a wave of riots and protests in May helped force Suharto to quit after 32 years in power. Crime has been exacerbated

by the worst economic crisis in

30 years, which has resulted in soaring inflation, mass unemployment and growing poverty. "Although the country is dealing with an economic crisis and even if people are hungry, no one should do just what they

want and take the property of others by force," Wiranto said. On Wednesday police fired warning shots to stop a crowd from stealing thousands of dollars worth of shrimp from

Hundreds of villagers plan to sue ex-President Suharto for allegedly seizing their land and

building a prestigious cattle ranch there in the 1970s, The Jakarta Post reported Friday. Over recent weeks villagers

have clashed with security guards at the ranch.

The villagers claim 300 hectares (740 acres) of Suharto's 700-hectare (1,730-acre) Tri-S Tapos rancy belongs to 500 people in Cibedug village, about 50 kilometers (30 miles) east of Jakarta.

The ranch sits in lush, hilly country and is considered one of Indonesia's foremost cattle breeding and producing

ranches. They said they had farmed the land for many years before they were pushed out with no compensation.

Suharto has not commented on their claims.
