#### Transfer order of two Ctg customs officials postponed

CHITTAGONG, July 19: Authorities today postponed the transfer order of two officials at Chittagong Customs House in the face of agitation by the members of Customs Officials and Employees Coordination Council (COECC), customs

sources said. Commissioner of Chittagong Customs House, Abul Kasem said. "The order has been postponed till July 30 to facilitate the holding of COECC's biennial conference and it will again be executed after that date." He said the agitating members of the coordination council had sieged his office and staged demonstration today demanding postponement of the order till July 30.

Earlier, authorities issued the order of transfer and release of the two officials within 24 hours from the issuance of the order on Thursday last angering other members of the coordination council.

## Cairn poised to strike 'big' gas reserve at Halda

British company Cairn Plc is likely to strike a reserve in the Halda valley near Kaptai, where it completed

drilling a couple of weeks ago. Sources said, prospect of striking a 'big' gas reservoir there is 'very bright' as the drillers have found five zones containing 'gas sand' up to a depth of 4500 metres. They will soon start testing the 'gas sand' to confirm it.

The British company has already discovered and developed a gas field in Sangu (in the Bay of Bengal off Chittagong coast) in Block 16 and struck another gas field in Semutang expected high pressure zone'.

US company Occidental has also made a similar discovery in Bibiana in Block 12, which, the sources said, is 'very big' Bibiana's 'gas sand' has already been tested but Occidental is yet to make any official announcement regarding the dis-

Cairn is also working on some more exploratory gas wells in Sonadia and Mathabari in blocks 15 and 16. It made significant progress in Sonadia but stopped drilling there because it struck an 'un-

Sources said, Cairn is now mobilising a different rig for drilling in the 'high pressure

The sources also said that Cairn has purchased, for the first time, its own rig. But it is renting the rig out to a contractor. This has spoiled a chance to cut exploration costs, the sources said.

There is a 'big dispute' between Cairn and Petrobangla regarding escalation of the budget for Sangu gas field. Cairn has escalated Sangu's approved budget of 178 million US dollars to 264 million dollars. The See Page 12 Col 6

BNP chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia yesterday demanded unconditional release of all leaders and workers of her party and its front organisations, including vice-presi dent of Dhaka City Jatiyatabadi Juba Dal Nasiruddin Patwari,

reports UNB. In a statement, she alleged that the 'autocratic and fascists' government started repression on her partymen immediately after coming to power. In its two years' rule, she said, "the government killed more than two hundred leaders and workers and detained numerous ones under repressive laws.

She also accused the government of filing "false cases" against several thousand BNP men. "Many BNP activists had to leave their houses in the face of repression by Awami terror

Begum Zia said the terrorism and oppression by the ruling party are not only undemocratic, but also contrary to human rights. The fascist way of oppression resorted to by the AL government is unprecedented under any democratic system.
