Graf, Coetzer reach final

MAHWAH. New Jersey. July 19: Steffi Graf continued her comeback from knee surgery Saturday, losing the first set but rallying to defeat Fang Li in the semifinals A and P Classic Saturday, reports AP.

Grafs 3-6, 6-2, 6-2 victory moves her into the final against Amanda Coetzer, who beat Wimbledon Champion Jana Novotna, 6-3, 7-6 (7-5) in the second semifinal.

Graf, who is still working her way back, double faulted four times in the first set, driving forehand after forehand into the net.

"Physically, I felt fine," said Graf, also battling a sinus infection. "I haven't really played that much the last 10 days because I was sick and I was really tired in the second set, but looked across and saw she was more tired than me."

Graf, currently ranked 57th in the world after spending a record 332 weeks at No 1. opened the second set by winning the first three games and 13 consecutive points. She began to wear Li down by moving her all over the court in the 90plus degree heat and confusing her with an array of slicing backhands.

Li, who is ranked 42nd, was in the semifinal because Amy Frazier turned down an automatic bid she earned by winning the USTA Challenger of Mahwah on Friday. Frazier was declared the winner by walkover when Li failed to show up on time for the final Friday because she was confused about the starting time.

Novotna was also tired after a busy five weeks, during which she won three consecutive tour naments and five titles, including her first Grand Slam singles title at Wimbledon. But she ran out of gas against Coetzer.

Novotna. No 2 in the world. fought back from down 5-4 and a service break to force a second-set tiebreaker. But Coetzer. who is ranked eighth, hung on, lacing six forehand winners in the tiebreak alone, including

one on match point. "I already felt tired yesterday and I felt really sluggish on the court," said Novotna, who plans to take several weeks off before beginning her preparation for the US Open. "Plus. Amanda played a really good match."

New York Games open

NEW YORK, July 19 (AP): Let the games begin.

No, not those games. The other ones - The Goodwill Games, touted as the alternative to the Olympic experience that offers money, as well as gold medals, to winners.

On Saturday in lower Manhattan, revelry, fireworks and songs opened the games' 15 days of multi-sport competition.

More than 1,300 athletes from 60 countries, representing sports like swimming, gymnastics and ice skating (yes, even in the summer), are expected to compete in the Games.

The audience at Battery Park City had a clear view of the Statue of Liberty as they awaited entertainment as mixed as the competition: teen singing-sensation Brandy, pop stars Hootie and the Blowish, Ray Charles, and a few Broadway stars.

"New York City is the most diverse city in the world, it's the best-known city in the world, and it's undergoing a remarkable renaissance," mayor Rudolph Giuliani said. "There's no more appropriate place for this year's Goodwill Games than right here in the city that's known far and wide as the capital of the world - New York

The crowd, which police estimated at 8,500, went wild with the appearance of the Goodwill Games Dancers performing with a group of kids dressed all in white -the Junior Division Students of the Alvin Ailey American Dance Center. As the two groups danced, Natalie Cole and gospel singers BeBe and CeCe Winans sang "In the Eyes of a Child."




