New York Games open

NEW YORK, July 19 (AP): Let the games begin. No, not those games. The other ones — The Goodwill Games, touted as the alternative to the Olympic experience that offers money, as well as gold medals, to winners.

On Saturday in lower Manhattan, revelry, fireworks and songs opened the games' 15 days of multi-sport competition. More than 1,300 athletes from 60 countries, representing sports like swimming, gymnastics and ice skating (yes, even in the summer), are expected to compete in the Games.

The audience at Battery Park City had a clear view of the Statue of Liberty as they awaited entertainment as mixed as the competition: teen singing-sensation Brandy, pop stars Hootie and the Blowfish, Ray Charles, and a few Broadway stars.

"New York City is the most diverse city in the world, it's the best-known city in the world, and it's undergoing a remarkable renaissance," mayor Rudolph Giuliani said. "There's no more appropriate place for this year's Goodwill Games than right here in the city that's known far and wide as the capital of the world — New York City."

The crowd, which police estimated at 8,500, went wild with the appearance of the Goodwill Games Dancers performing with a group of kids dressed all in white — the Junior Division Students of the Alvin Ailey American Dance Center. As the crowd danced, Natalie Cole and gospel singers BeBe and CeCe Winans sang "In the Eyes of a Child."

"It's really exciting to have one of the world's best sports events right where you live. I love it. It's like waking up one day — and Godzilla's in your backyard," said Stoya Ruach, 12, who lives on Manhattan's Lower East Side.

She's rooting for American and Canadian gymnasts, partly because she got a chance to meet some Canadian athletes in the VIP section.

The Goodwill Games were founded by billionaire media mogul Ted Turner as an olive branch offering to athletes after the Olympic boycotts in 1980 and 1984 by the United States and the Soviet Union, respectively.

Some of the proceeds will go to The Boys and Girls Clubs of America to develop programmes and activities for youngsters.

Vice President Al Gore also got into the act. During a Saturday morning visit to The Children's Aid Society Boys and Girls Club in Harlem, he taped a message to the athletes to be played at the opening ceremonies.

Gore refereed a relay race along with Olympic gold medal hurdler Allen Johnson and former NCAA half-mile champion Joetta Clark, both of whom are expected to compete.

The vice president even managed to shoot hoops with teen-agers, drawing cheers from the crowds when he sank two consecutive 3-point shots.

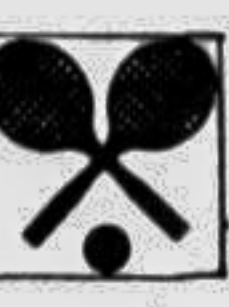
Ottey plays down hype

NEW YORK, July 19: Merlene Ottey, now a roving ambassador for both her sport and country, discounted on Saturday prospects of a world 100 metres record on the opening day of the fourth Goodwill Games, reports Reuters.

Ottey, still competing at the highest level at the age of 38, takes on American World champion Marian Jones at the start of the four-day track and field competition today.

Jones has been the track athlete of the season so far, clocking the second fastest 100 metres ever in Chengdu, China, in May with a time of 10.71 seconds.

USA, Italy enter last four



INDIANAPOLIS, July 19 (AP/Reuters): Jim Courier replaced an injured Richey Reneberg and teamed with Todd Martin to beat a Belgian team as the United States moved into the Davis Cup semifinals.

Courier and Martin, who had played only two matches together, defeated Belgium's Xavier Malisse and Johan Van Herck 5-7, 6-2, 6-7 (2-7), 7-6 (7-5), 6-1.

The victory gave the United States a 3-0 advantage in the best-of-5 quarterfinal. The US will now play Italy in the semifinals Sept. 25-27. The matches will be played in the United States at a site to be determined.

Both teams changed doubles teams one hour before the match.

Courier, who helped the United States sweep the opening singles, made his Davis Cup doubles debut after doctors determined Reneberg sustained a partial tear in his left knee during practice here. He will have arthroscopic surgery on the knee and is expected to be sidelined 3-6 weeks.

Belgium changed its previously announced lineup with Van Herck replacing Filip Dewulf.

Andrea Gaudenzi and Diego Nargiso beat brothers Byron and Wayne Black of Zimbabwe in four sets Saturday to put Italy into the semifinals for the third straight year.

The Italian duo started slowly on the red clay in this town near Florence, but eventually took control of the doubles encounter and triumphed 1-6, 7-5, 7-5, 6-3 in a little under three hours.

"Fortunately, Andrea and I were able to calmly work our way back into the match. We beat a strong pair," Nargiso said.

The doubles win added to Italy's two straight-set singles victories from Friday to give the hosts an insurmountable 3-0 lead in the best-of-five quarterfinal and rendered Sunday's reverse singles a formality.

In September, Italy will meet the winner of the quarterfinal between the United States and Belgium.

The Blacks dominated the first set. But Gaudenzi, the weaker of the two Italians in doubles play, picked up his game.

Gaudenzi and Nargiso repeatedly exchanged laughs and playful back-slaps during the match.

"We had a lot of fun, we joked around out there," Gaudenzi said. "We feel less tension when we kid around. We played very well against two great players."

On Friday, Gaudenzi, ranked 35th by the ATP, beat Wayne Black 6-3, 6-3, 6-4, while Davide Sangulietti, a Wimbledon quarterfinalist, defeated Byron 6-3, 6-3, 6-0.

Andrea was tired after yesterday so we really wanted to win today," Nargiso said. "It could have been tough tomorrow."

But the veteran German considered the German team unlucky. "We should have won the first three sets," he said.

"Somehow we were not able to take advantage of the small chances those are the points that make a difference in close matches like this. They came up with the better shots."

Becker, who at age 30 has retired from Grand Slam play, said he wasn't disappointed with his own game but admitted his double-faults in the third set tiebreak and in the fourth set to give Sweden a 5-4 lead were serves he wished he could have had again.

"I played not the best of service games," he said. "But our performance was excellent. We played great. They are one of the best doubles teams in the world. It was a very close match and we have to hold our heads high."

The match will be decided today in the reverse singles when Germany's Nicolas Pietrangeli faces Bjorkman and Haas squares off against Sweden's Thomas Enqvist.

After Haas has beaten Bjorkman on Friday Enqvist defeated Pietrangeli to even the score at 1-1.

The victorious nation will play either Spain or Switzerland in the semifinals.

Elsewhere, Switzerland stayed alive against Spain in its World Group quarterfinal at La Coruna, Spain when Marc Rosset and Lorenzo Mantia defeated Julian Alonso and Javier

Sanchez-Vicario in a five-set doubles marathon 3-6, 6-3, 6-4, 6-7, 6-2.

Spain leads 2-1 and still needs one more victory in Sunday's singles when French Open champion Carlos Moyia plays Rosset and Alex Corretja faces Ivo Heuberger.

The Philippines and Hong Kong split the last two singles matches Sunday, giving the Philippines a 4-1 overall victory in the Asia-Oceania Zone Group 2 competition.

Melvin Tong scored Hong Kong's only victory point when he beat Joseph Lizardo 7-5, 6-4 in Sunday's first match at the Victoria Park court. Bryan Junio then beat Hong Kong's Shane Barr 6-2, 6-2.

Sunday's singles were meaningless after Michael John Misa and Adelo Abadia had defeated Hong Kong's Barr and Andrew Brothers 7-5, 7-5, 6-4 in the doubles Saturday, giving the Philippines an unbeatable 3-0 lead. The Philippines won both the opening singles matches on Friday.

Hong Kong is relegated to Group 3 following its defeat. Venezuela led Haiti 2-1 Saturday after winning the doubles match on the second day of the Group II American Zone semifinals.

In four sets, 6-3, 6-4, 4-6 and 6-4, Venezuela's number one player Jimmy Szymanski and number two player Kepler Orlandina, teamed up to beat Haiti's number one player Ronald Agener and Haiti's number two player Bertrand Madsen.
