The Hall of Fame is part of a plan to transform the former headquarters of the Greater London Council on London's south bank of the Thames.

Rufai's excuse

LA CORUNA, Spain, July 21: Nigeria goalkeeper Peter Rufai claimed "political pressures" forced him into playing in the World Cup, reports Reuters.

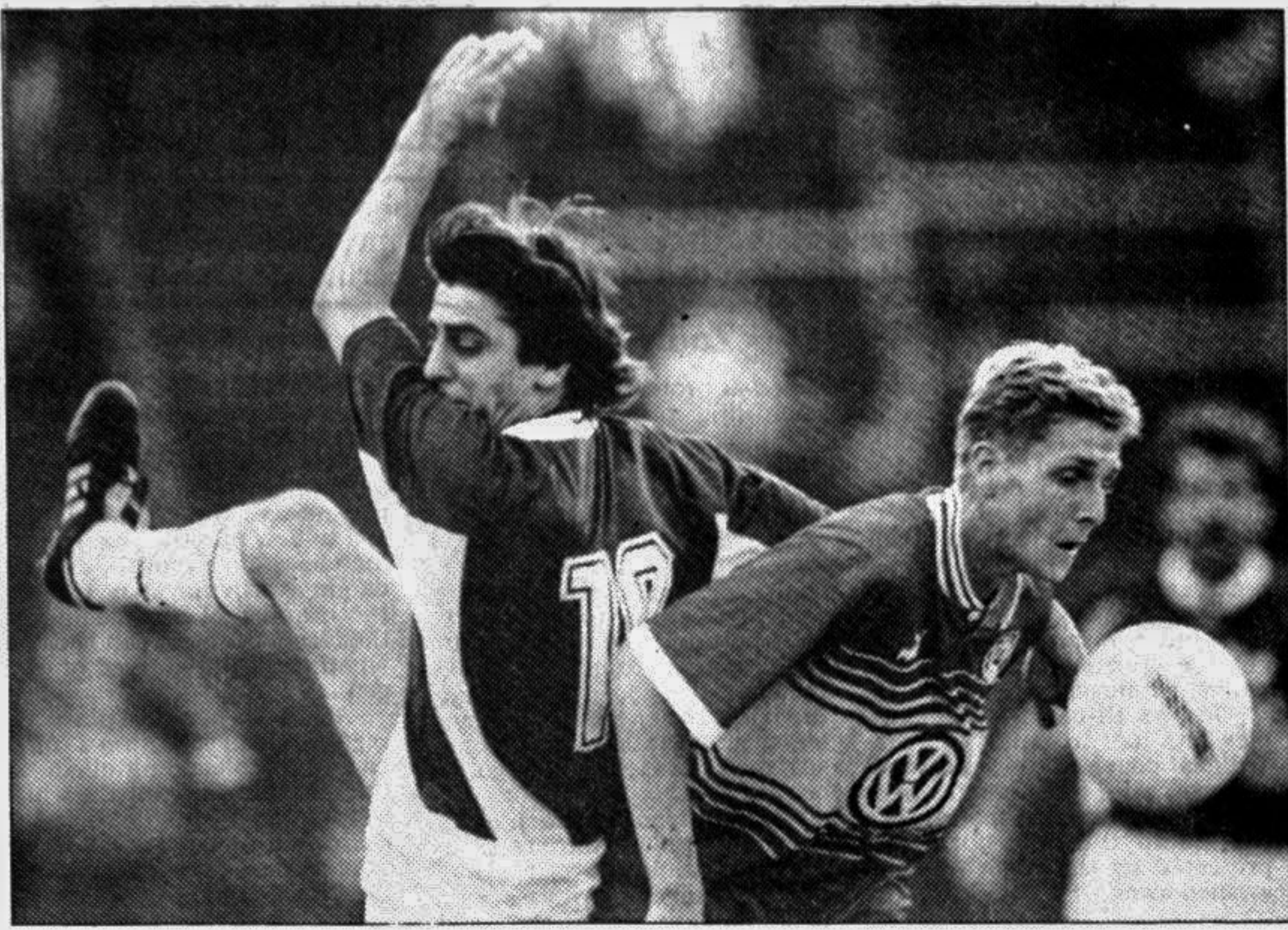
Rufai, second-choice goalkeeper at Deportivo Coruna, came in for some heavy criticism following Nigeria's surprise 4-1 defeat by Denmark in the second round.

But the veteran Rufai, on his return to La Coruna late on Monday indicated he was forced to join the Nigeria squad despite not being prepared mentally and physically for the tournament.

"When the season finished I was planning to go on holiday to Cuba with a friend. I stayed out late, went to a disco and didn't think of going to France," he said.

"But I received a phone call that obliged me to join up with the squad."

Rufai indicated that he was under "political pressure" adding: "I didn't have any option but to go. I wasn't prepared for the tournament and so I didn't play at the level I hoped."

English refs to pull up their socks

LONDON, July 21: English referees have vowed to crack down on players who dive or feign injury next season, reports AFP.

They hope to prevent the cheating which marred the World Cup from spreading to the English game.

They will also take strong action to cut down on the number of dangerous tackles in the game next season, although they insist that they will continue to use their discretion.

The 18 Premiership referees met the Premier League's referees' officer, Philip Don, on Monday.

"We believe that clear action should be taken to stop the practices of holding, pulling, diving or the feigning of injury," Don said.

"Our referees are determined to act to prevent such unsporting behaviour developing in our domestic league.

"Equally strong action will be taken to punish careless and reckless tackling where undue force may endanger the safety of an opposing player.

"However, our referees are being encouraged to make a distinction between such foul tackling and firm but fair play," he added.

Two incidents in the World Cup in France highlighted the problem with cheating - Argentina's Diego Simeone crashed to the ground when given a tap on the leg by England's David Beckham and Croatia's Slaven Bilic also went down in agony when France defender pushed him away in a penalty area scrimmage. Both Beckham and Blanc were shown the red card.

Bredon Batson, deputy chief executive of the players' trade union, the professional footballers' association, welcomed the referees' stance.

"We certainly don't want to see some of the over-reaction that we saw in certain matches from certain players during France 98 in our game over here," he said.

"We fully support what the referees are doing, we want them to be left to get on with their jobs and for players not to try to get opponents booked or sent off."

Wardlaw sets his target

SYDNEY, July 21: Australia are expecting to win about 26 track and field medals at September's Kuala Lumpur Commonwealth Games, head coach Chris Wardlaw said Tuesday, reports AFP.

A poll among coaches of individual athletes found they expected a total of about 30 athletic medals, and Wardlaw said he would be very disappointed if the team collected less than 22.

Based on last year's rankings, if Australia won 26 medals, 10 of those would be gold.

Australia won a high of 12 golds at the 1962 and 1994 Commonwealth Games, with a low of eight in 1974.

"If we win 26, we're doing as well as we ever have, or marginally better," Wardlaw said.

"There are significant advantages for us in Kuala Lumpur - it's in our hemisphere and we have the capacity to acclimatise and prepare in (tropical) Darwin.

"We should learn a significant amount for Sydney in 2000 and we must take any advantages."

"It's very difficult to cross time lines and prepare adequately," he added.

Wardlaw, who has coached a number of elite Australian distance runners including Steve Moneghetti, said the conditions in Kuala Lumpur, while humid, "were not hellish as some people might anticipate."

Australia's long-term plan is to be ranked in the top five in world athletics by 2000, which would equate to about six medals at the Sydney Games.

Australia is currently ranked between 14 and 18.

The last time Australia won six Olympic athletics medals was in Mexico City in 1968.

Two years ago in Atlanta the only medalists were Cathy Freeman (400m silver) and Louise McPaul (javelin silver).

The Commonwealth Games team will be announced after the trials early next month.

About 30 Australians are expected to be named in the Oceania team to contest the World Cup in Johannesburg from September 11-13, before flying directly to Malaysia where the athletics competitions starts on September 16.

Swedes fall in Stuttgart

STUTTGART, Germany, July 21 (AFP/AP): Wild card Hendrik Dreekman earned a slight measure of revenge for Germany after the weekend's Davis Cup quarterfinal loss to Sweden, ousting Mikael Tillis from 6-3, 6-0 in the first round of the one million dollar Mercedes Cup here Monday.

Neither world number 100 Dreekman nor Tillis was chosen for the Davis Cup encounter won by Sweden in Hamburg on Sunday.

But the German victory did get Scandinavian off to a poor start at the 20th edition of the Mercedes ATP clay court event.

Slovak Dominik Hrbaty completed the misery for Sweden, beating Magnus Norman 6-3, 6-2.

German Jens Knippschild followed through for the home nation by eliminating compatriot Michael Kohlmann, a qualifier ranked number 152 on the ATP Tour, 3-6, 6-3, 6-3 to reach the second round.

At least nine players in the Mercedes field took part in Davis Cup quarterfinals between Italy and Zimbabwe, Spain and Switzerland and Germany and Sweden.

Boris Becker, Germany's team manager and doubles player, was opening today in the first round against Italian Andrea Gaudenzi, who spearheaded Italy's 5-0 rout of Zimbabwe in Prato.

Italian Davis Cup teammate Davide Sanguinetti was to play against Frenchman Guillaume Raoux.

Knippschild will have his own worries in the form of top seed and world number two Marcelo Rios in the second round. The leading seeds all get

byes at the 56-man event. Rios, with a chance to take back the tour's world number one ranking from Pete Sampras, is seeded to face Spain's French Open champion Carlos Moya in the Sunday finale at the Weissenhof club.

Knippschild is not worried about playing the Chilean. "I haven't had a lot of chances to train in Germany in recent weeks due to bad weather," he said. "But I'm fit and like my chances. Of course he is favoured. But I'll give it my best."

Becker reached the final earlier this month in Gstaad, Switzerland, losing on a high-altitude clay court to Spain's Alex Corretja.

But the Stuttgart race is unlikely to be to the German tennis icon's liking, while Gstaad was so high up it played as fast as a hardcourt, one of Becker's preferred surfaces.

American wrestlers to go to Iran

TEHRAN, July 21: American wrestlers will attend an international tournament in Iran in September, months after a groundbreaking visit by a US team which launched exchanges between the two hostile countries, reports Reuters.

Iran's official news agency IRNA reported on Monday the United States was among 25 nations which have already said they would attend the World freestyle wrestling championships in Tehran on September 8-11.

Cultural, academic and sporting exchanges have expanded modestly since January, when moderate Iranian President Mohammad Khatami called for breaking down the "wall of mistrust" between Tehran and Washington through people-to-people contacts.

The February visit by the US team was the first since the 1979 Islamic Revolution which toppled the late US-backed Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi. The American athletes were warmly received by Iranian fans.

France still undecided

PARIS, July 21: France's soccer federation said Tuesday it has again delayed the appointment of a successor to Aime Jacquet, who resigned as French coach after winning the World Cup, reports AP.

The French Football Federation (FFF) had hoped to name a new coach last week. Then, on Friday, it said the appointment would come by the middle of this week.

Having met over the weekend, FFF officials decided they need more time and will likely make the appointment Monday, said FFF spokesman Roman Laisne.

Novotna needs a break

PRAGUE, July 21: Wimbledon champion Jana Novotna today ruled herself out of the Czech Republic's Federation Cup play off against Italy, saying she needed a rest, reports Reuters.

The hectic schedule of world number two Novotna, who has won the Wimbledon singles and doubles titles as well as Eastbourne and the Czech Open in recent weeks, finally caught up with her last weekend.

Novotna lost on Saturday in the semifinals of the A and P Classic in the US in stifling heat.
