





Next day he went out and smashed a glorious, unbeaten 118 against the West Indies, added a swashbuckling 90 next game at The Oval and made 141 against the South Africans in the first Test of the winter tour.

Sadly, that was the last of only four centuries so far for England. The same hagging problems with short-pitched bowling undermined him and he has spent the last two years waiting for the chance to make vet another new start. "I never really doubted that I

would get another call and I can't remember when I have been so excited about a game", he said.
