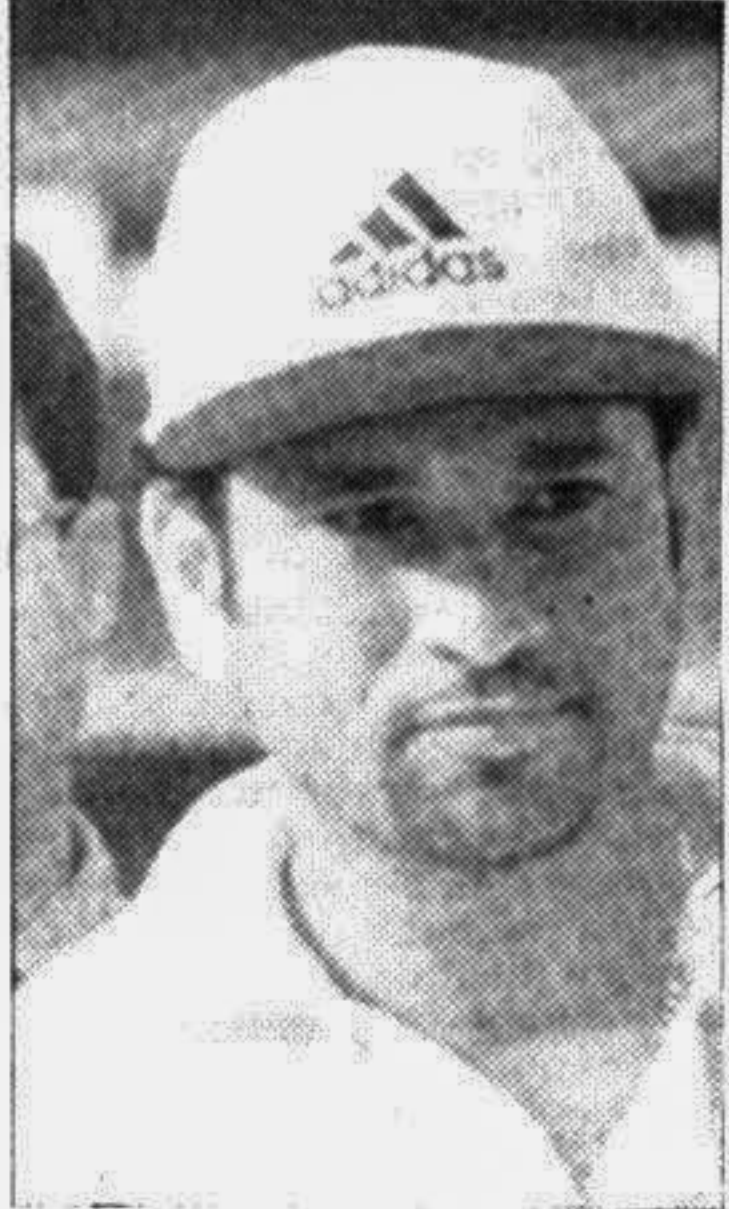
Nakata set to join Perugia

Brits salute Sachin

LONDON, July 22 (The Hindu/Internet): The usually taciturn Michael Atherton gushed "I do not think even W. G. (Grace) would have played like Sachin" and the British media heaped encomiums after Sachin Tendulkar came up with yet another exhibition of his mastery batting at the Lord's on Saturday.

The Indian genius, who led his Rest of the World side to an eventually easy win over the Atherton-led MCC with a riveting 125, was accorded a standing ovation by the 30,000 strong tradition-bound gathering as he walked back after his first century at the Mecca of cricket.



SACHIN TENDULKAR master used the stage... To confirm that those reports are true. After blond leg spinner Shane Warne compared Tendulkar to Don Bradman following his assault during the Aussie tour of India and Sharjah, Atherton and the British media equated him with Grace - the ultimate praise that can be expected from the English.

Tendulkar was the theme for Richard Hobson of the Times too: "In the years ahead, when those who were at Lord's recollect the events of Saturday, they will not think of Diana... Or W. G. Grace. The contest staged as a tribute to both developed from lethargic beginnings into a celebration of the gifts of one man."

"When Sachin Tendulkar had his eye set, everybody swung behind him. If the last comparable occasion, the MCC bicentenary Test of 1987, was elevated by Roger Harper's run-out of Graham Gooch, then Tendulkar lifted this one with his whole innings.

"It became as much an exhibition as the collection of paintings in the Lord's museum commemorating the good doctor's 150th birthday." The Times said.

Superlatives were liberally used as Tendulkar audaciously went after the MCC attack that included Glenn McGrath, Allan Donald, Javagal Srinath and Anil Kumble.

"Such was his domination that Aravinda de Silva, an inch shorter than Tendulkar at 5ft 4in, was overshadowed by his partner despite playing delightfully for 82 from 79 balls. 50 of them in boundaries. But with Tendulkar in full cry, de Silva knew what a big crowd wanted and often handed him the strike at the first opportunity," the Sunday Times said.

Tendulkar's brilliance also overshadowed young Caribbean Shivanarine Chanderpaul's solid 127.

Coventry after mystery star

COVENTRY, England, July 22 (AFP/Internet): Coventry are set to spend the four million pounds (6.5 million dollars) they received for Romanian striker Viorel Moldovan on another big name World Cup star.

The English Premiership side have refused to reveal their intended target, but chairman Bryan Richardson believes the player could be at the club by the weekend.

"We are on the tail of a major signing which we hope to have tied up by Thursday or Friday of this week," said Richardson.

Spurs target Taricco

LONDON, July 22: English Premiership side Tottenham Hotspur look set to make a bid for Ipswich Town's star Argentine wing-back Mauricio Taricco it was revealed here on Tuesday, reports AFP.

The 25-year-old, signed for 175,000 pounds (260,000 dollars) from Argentinos Juniors four years ago, is highly-rated by Spurs' new chief scout Charlie Woods, who moved to Spurs from Ipswich earlier this month.

Ipswich chairman David Sheepshanks confirmed there has been an inquiry from Spurs about the former under-23 international.

"The ball is in Tottenham's court," Sheepshanks said.

Taricco who can play on either flank, is understood to be rated at around two million pounds by Ipswich.

Milan retains Weah's services

MILAN, July 22: Former world-footballer-of-the-year George Weah has extended his contract at AC Milan through to June 2001, the club revealed Tuesday, reports AFP.

The 32-year-old Liberian striker's previous deal ran out next summer.

Weah joined the Italian giants three seasons ago from Paris Saint Germain, but was plagued with injury problems last season as Milan came tenth in the Serie A to miss out on a place in Europe.

Trent Bridge Test begins today

Croft out, Salisbury in

NOTTINGHAM, England, July 22 (AP): Robert Croft — a hero when he batted gamely to salvage a draw for England in the third cricket test

against South Africa — was axed Wednesday for the England team for the fourth Test.

England, trailing 1-0 in the five match series, will only use one spinner for the Trent Bridge Test starting Thursday and Croft's inability to take wickets this series has cost him his place.

In search of some inspiration, England selectors selected leg spinner Ian Salisbury among a host of new and recalled players in a bid to provide bowling breakthroughs and batting strength.

Batsman Graeme Hick has been recalled, while left-arm medium pace bowler Alan Mullally and big-hitting Lancashire all-rounder Andrew Flintoff have also been added to the

England team. The inclusion of Hick might add strength to the fragile England batting, but his ability against quality fast bowling — Allan Donald and Shaun Pollock — could have an unbalancing effect at the same time.

Hick, 33, a 46-Test veteran, gets his first recall after two years to fill the batting position made vacant by the injured Graham Thorpe.

"I feel this is a fresh start because I have changed my attitude and approach to the game," Hick said at training Wednesday.

"I don't feel as anxious and uptight about playing for England as I have done in the past," Flintoff, 20, could go in at No. 7 for England which would force selectors to choose between two bowlers — most likely Alan Mullally or Angus Fraser.

The recall of 28-year-old Salisbury, who played against Pakistan two summers ago, would indicate England are clinging to the belief that the South Africans are vulnerable to leg spin.

However, South African coach Bob Woolmer said his team was not susceptible to leg spin.

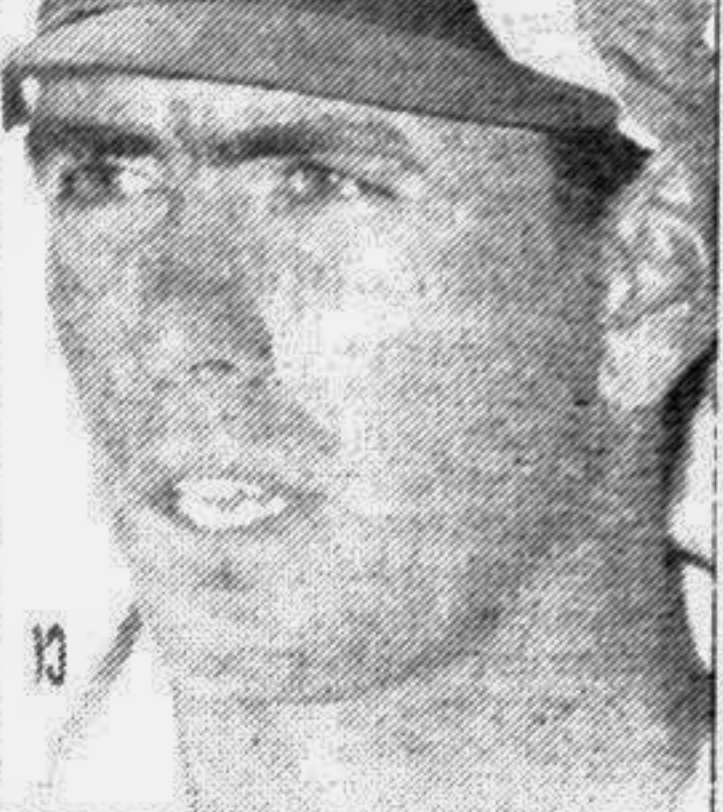
"We have played enough cricket against India, Pakistan and Australia in the last year or so, so I can't see him (Salisbury) being a threat," Woolmer said. "He can't be better than Shane Warne or Mushtaq Ahmed or Anil Kumble," Woolmer added.

Mike Atherton, who suffered a bruised right thumb while batting for Lancashire on Monday and Mark Ramprakash (tonsillitis) trained without any problem Wednesday.

South Africa have their share of injury concerns with Lance Klusener undergoing surgery in Pretoria on the ankle

injury he sustained during the third Test at Old Trafford and fast bowler Makhaya Ntini nursing an injury.

However, Shaun Pollock has recovered from the quadriceps strain which ruled him out of

the third Test and will add some fire power to the Proteas batting and bowling attack.

South Africa are expected to wait until just before the toss on Thursday to decide on the fitness of Makhaya Ntini.

Peter Pollock, South Africa's convenor of selectors, joined the tour party this week, but hasn't decided on a replacement for Klusener.

"The guys on tour are the best we have," he said. "That's why they were selected in the first place. There's no cause for panic."

Peter Pollock, father of paceman Shaun, played a major role in South Africa's triumph over England at Trent Bridge in 1965 when he took a 10-wicket haul for the match.

Golota defeats Sanders

ATLANTIC CITY, New Jersey, July 22 (AP): Andrew Golota won another one. And he didn't need bites.

head-butts or below-the-belt blows to do it. Not that it was a clean fight: The street-fighting Polish heavyweight beat newcomer Corey Sanders to a bloody pulp Tuesday before winning a unanimous 10-round decision.

Golota, whose low blows cost him consecutive 1996 losses to Riddick Bowe, dominated the bigger Sanders from the start. He opened a deep gash in his eye in the second and keeping him at bay with thundering three-punch combinations throughout.

Yet Sanders somehow stayed up and even won a couple rounds.

"I could not believe how durable, how unbelievable Corey Sanders' chin was," Golota said, his white shorts tinted scarlet by Sanders' blood.

"How can you hit a guy like that and have him not go down? I give him credit," Golota said.

Judge Kason Cheeks scored it 97-93, Debra Barnes had it 100-90 and Paul Vent 99-90, all for Golota. The Associated Press favoured Golota 97-93.

The victory boosted Golota's record to 31-3 and earned him a homecoming. He has already signed to fight former two-time champion Tim Witherspoon on September 4 in Wroclaw, Poland.

Sanders, a 21-year-old from Washington, DC who has been fighting for only three years, dropped to 16-6.

Early on, it looked like it would be all Golota.

He backed the 6-foot-6 (1.98-metre), 262-pounder (199 kilos) into the ropes early in the second round and unloaded five consecutive rights to his head, opening a gaping cut over Sanders' left eyebrow.

The blood from his cut drenched Golota and rained down on the USA Network television crew sitting ringside, prompting them to run from their seats.

But referee Tony Orlando didn't halt the fight. It turned out to be a wise choice. Sanders survived and even rallied briefly, unleashing a couple of left-right combinations as if to serve notice that he wasn't done yet.

After Sanders got out of trouble, Orlando called a time-out to have ringside physician Dr Richard Sneyar check the cut. The doctor let the fight continue.

In the third, Sanders con-

nected with a huge right to the head and then two left jabs to follow it opening a cut over Golota's left eye.

Slow footed and lacking ring savvy, Sanders made up in heart what he lacked in experience. He appeared to run out of gas in the middle rounds, but just when Golota looked like he

was taking over, Sanders would rise up out of his crouch and deliver two or three snapping punches.

"I couldn't let my trainers down," he said. "They worked so hard for me. I needed to win the fight."

Hick for lucky seven

LONDON, July 22 (The Mirror/Internet): Graeme Hick launches his seventh Test comeback tomorrow charged with halting England's collapse cricket.

That is some responsibility for a batting enigma who former chairman of selectors Ray Illingworth once accused of lacking the bottle for a fight.

The run-hungry Worcester batsman plays in the crucial Fourth Test at Trent Bridge at number six in the order, ridiculously low for the only man still playing to have scored 100 hundreds.

But as he comes in for the injured Graham Thorpe, Hick is only too happy to get the chance to shore up a side that collapses like a deck of cards.

He said: "I am just happy to be in the side. I have been asked to bat there and do a job. When I have done it in the past it felt totally alien to me and sometimes uncomfortable. This time I will take that experience in my mind and be better for it."

Test matches are generally won not through dramatic last-day run-chases, but by piling up a minimum of 350 in the first innings. The crushing indictment of England's horrendous run is that they have failed even to reach 200 in the vital first knock nine times in the last 13 Tests, yet England are still only one down with two to play.

Now Hick has the chance to

once again revive his career. It was on this ground three years ago that an angry Hick used illingworth's barbs to produce a superb unbeaten century against the West Indies pacemen and spark the best run of his under-achieving international career.

Sadly, that was the last of only four centuries so far for England. The same nagging problems with short-pitched bowling undermined him and he has spent the last two years waiting for the chance to make yet another new start.

"I never really doubted that I would get another call and I can't remember when I have been so excited about a game," he said.

Hick has been in magnificent form with Worcester this season and reached his 100 hundreds in style by scoring a century in each innings against Sussex.

But the crushing indictment of him is that only four of those tons have been in Test matches — two against South Africa, one against the West Indies and a Test-best 178 against India. He was denied a fifth against Australia in Sydney four years ago when Mike Atherton pointedly declared when he was on 98 as a protest at selfish batting as England were chasing quick runs.

Hick demanded a meeting, and if he didn't exactly dangle illingworth from the dressing-room coathook, he let Ily know exactly how he felt. Next day he went out and smashed a glorious, unbeaten 118 against the West Indies, added a swashbuckling 90 next game at The Oval and made 141 against the South Africans in the first Test of the winter tour.

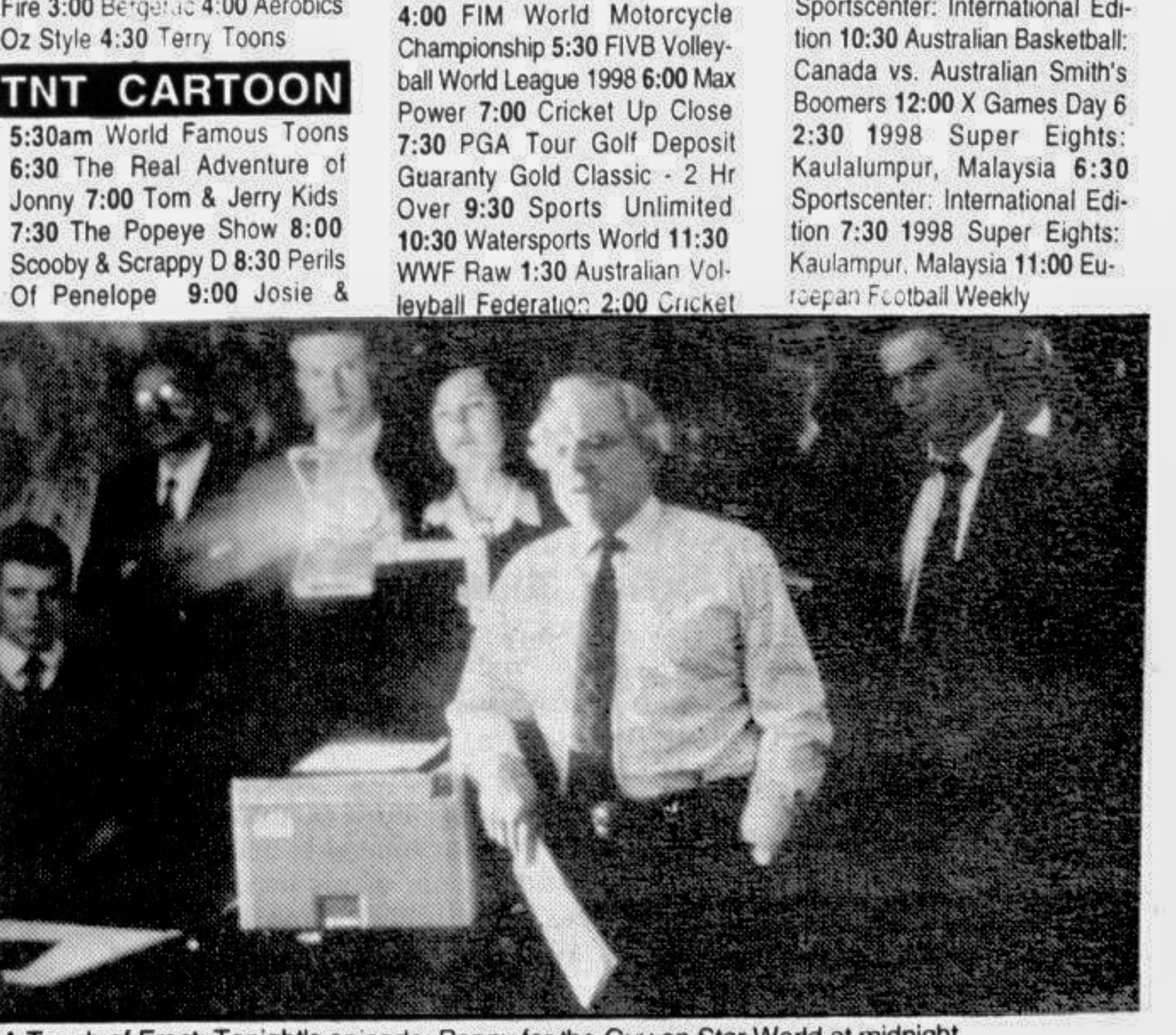
