A good number of Germans and expatriate Bangladeshis attended the cultural function held in the university, city of Heidelberg, according to a message received in the city yester-


The musical soiree was performed by a eight-member team of Bangla Shur, a cultural organisation, now on a visit to Germany at the invitation of NETZ, a German NGO.

Dacoity in city

A gang of dacoits at gun point took away gold ornaments, cash and valuables worth about Tk 1.5 lakh from a house at Mohammadpur in the city early yesterday.


