



Joseph Blatter, Debski said that if Poland were banned from international competition, the ministry would take world soccer's organising body to an international court. "The representatives of FIFA and UEFA threatened to exclude

Polish teams....and if this happens the Polish side will seek to resolve the dispute in a civil suit in a court to international arbitration," Debski wrote in the letter. Debski said his actions were

carried out within Polish law and that if he reinstated PZPN officials he would violate domestic regulations. The crisis underlined the

poor state of Polish football, after being one of Europe's leading soccer nations in the 1970s and early 1980s, the national side failed to qualify for the last three World Cups.


