Southgate, 27, who was also Public Enemy No. 1 after his penalty shoot-out miss against Germany in the semi-final of Euro 96, said: "The next few weeks are not going to be very nice for David.

"The poor lad has already gone through far more than I ever suffered, but I can still give him some good advice because of my own experience.

Under the proposal, youth soccer teams from French cities that hosted England and Scotland games during the France '98 World Cup will be invited to visit major clubs in England and Scotland.

The young French players will be invited to watch Premier League teams in action, attend top-level coaching sessions and meet stars from teams like Arsenal, Chelsea, Manchester United, Celtic and Rangers.


