Sang's future mobility uncertain

NEW YORK, July 27: Paralysed Chinese gymnast Sang Lan begins rehabilitation here today but probably will never walk again despite successful spinal stabilisation surgery. her doctor said here Sunday. reports AFP.

Sang underwent the seven hour operation Saturday only a few hours before her parents arrived here from China to see their only daughter and add messages of hope from friends to gifts from around the world.

Physician Vincent Leone, who performed the operation, said the surgery enabled Sang to regain some strength in her shoulders and bicep muscles but she had shown no improvement in hand or wrist mobility.

Three titanium plates with screws were inserted into Sang's neck to stabilize the spinal section damaged Tuesday when she fell on her head during a Goodwill Games vaulting competition


Bone fragments from Sang's left hip were used to rebuild broken vertebrae in a spinal fusion process. The operation allows Sang to sit up in bed, which she was unable to do before surgery

The implants basically prevent her head from falling off her shoulders," Leone said. Rehabilitation will involve range of motion exercise to keep joints from contracting, then gradually try to increase the strength and motor function of

her upper extremities. The doctor said it was too early to tell if an experimental nerve regeneration drug being administered to Sang is working because so many nerve endings must heal.

Sang, now wearing a beck brace, will remain at the hospital for another week. No decision has been made by her parents yet about whether to stay here, move Sang to another hospital or return home to China.

Leone said earlier in the week that familiar surroundings might help recovery, but added that she has done well so far here.

Battle for the ashes

One by one, sporting venues decide to butt out

Sport's Faustian deal with the tobacco industry is gasping its last. Outdoor sporting venues are increasingly following the lead of indoor venues in banning patrons from lighting up, while sporting organisations, of course, have spent most of the past decade weaning themselves off tobacco sponsorship.

Wednesday's decision by the Sydney Cricket Ground Trust to ban smoking from the SCG and Sydney Football Stadium follows the lead of the Melbourne Cricket Ground and the WACA Ground in Perth, both of which have enforced smoking restrictions since 1996.

The movement is growing. Tennis NSW will announce today that next January's adidas International at White City. and all subsequent major events including the Davis Cup. will be smoke-free at centre court for the first time. The Brisbane Cricket Ground Trust is reviewing a proposal to expand its non-smoking areas. The MCG, which has stepped up its smoke-free ratio from 30 per cent in 1996 to 70 per cent now, intends to be 100 per cent smoke-free for the 1999 foot-

ball season. Only motor sports, horse racing, golf and suburban football remain as the major professional sports over which patrons can smoke as well as

The chief executive of Tennis NSW, Barry Masters, said his executive had decided in June to ban smoking at White City events after "strong demand from tennis fans, in the form of a large number of phone calls and letters, to make centre court smoke-free. We had record crowds at the International last year, and without a doubt 60 to 70 per cent of them would be in favour of this decision," he said. "Even though we're an outdoor venue, spectators can cop all of someone else's smoke. So we decided that the centre court, including boxes, would be nonsmoking and there would be

designated areas outside, such as the marquee, where smoking is still allowed.

Dr John Lill, secretary of the Melbourne Cricket Club, said a total smoking ban was opposed by the Victorian Cricket Association, which "worried about the effect on attendances" at

Byshovets' faith in veterans

MOSCOW, July 27: Russia's new national coach Anatoly Byshovets is set to recall Andrei Kanchelskis, Sergei Kiryakov and several other foreign-based players who had fallen out with his predecessors, reports Reuters.

"Kanchelskis has confirmed his desire to play for the national team." Byshovets, the Zenit St Petersburg and former Soviet coach appointed under Kremlin pressure last week. told Sport-Express newspaper at the weekend

The 29-year-old Rangers winger had told previous coach Boris Ignatyev in March that he no longer wished to play after Russia failed to qualify for this year's World Cup.

Kanchelskis had made clear he was unhappy with the way the team was being run but said last week he was ready to return on sale on August 1," he said. under a new trainer, although at that time the favourite to get the job was national youth team coach Mikhail Gershkovich.

More dramatic would be the recall for Kiryakov, who last played for Russia at Euro'96. when he was sent home in disgrace after then coach Oleg Romantsev accused him of undermining morale. Kiryakov's German club Karlsruhe SC were relegated last season.

Also ripe for reprieve are the Celta Vigo pair of Alexander Mostovoi and Valery Karpin. both of whom were acrimoniously dropped by Ignatyev after a draw against Cyprus in March last year that ultimately cost Russia their World Cup qualification

Victoria's Sheffield Shield matches.

Dr Lill also said the total ban would leave "a management problem" of issuing pass-outs to smokers who could leave the MCG to smoke outside. Among outdoor venues, Melbourne has lagged behind only the WACA, which introduced a near-total smoking ban for the 1996-97 cricket season.

"It's been very successful. said Dean Picters, the WACA's sponsorship manager. "We have reviewed the policy each year. and the feedback shows that the vast majority of patrons are pleased with it.

Bob Carr, the general manager of the Brisbane Cricket Ground Trust, said a current proposal to extend non-smoking bans from enclosed areas to the majority of open-air seating - which still allow smoking would need the joint support of the Brisbane Lions. Queensland Cricket Association and the Trust to come into effect.

"At this stage, the coming cricket season will be the same as last year because tickets go "So we're looking at the next AFL season at the earliest.

Stadium Australia has sur veved its members on the smoking issue for the Olympic stadium, and a spokesman said a policy would be set in late 1998 which would be "sensible and reasonable and in tune with the membership."

Racing and motor sport venues remain convivial for smokers because the patrons move around the venue, instead of being restricted to the one seat. On golf courses, meanwhile, wind is likelier to blow the smoke away, and it is hard to see a sport banning smoking when many of its participants pull between shots.

Drapper was trying to become the first Australian to win in Washington since Tony Roche in 1972, some two years before Draper was born.



Spirit of the game

of grace and refinement on the cricket field today. It reminisces about days of old before high fives and vociferous appeals, before sledging and loud rejoices at the fall of a wicket. It harks back to a time when the gentlemanly spirit in which the game was played would put to shame, if not all, then most of the players today. I was unabashedly raised on one-day cricket and as such.

have hardly ever seen anything other than undiluted aggression on a cricket field. My daily dose of dissent has dulled my senses to the finer points of what was once a gentleman's game. In fact, I do echo the shock he feels at the thought of bowlers being congratulated simply by hand-shakes at the fall of a wicket when the game was played three to four decades ago. Old footage of these games simply serve to reaffirm what we already know that the change in attitude of the players, in not an all too long period of time, is drastic, to say the least, and a little bit disturbing. Maybe these changes were

unavoidable with the onset of one-day cricket. All of a sudden when the monetary stakes are much higher and when the tempo of the game increases manifold, is it but inevitable that these changes occur? But to blame this all on one-day cricket would be nothing short of ungrateful. For it is this medium of the game that almost single-handedly rescued cricket from what many saw as its inescapable death. From the increasing trend of insipid matches petering away to draws after five entire days of play, the fast-paced result-oriented one-day matches breathed the much-needed life into a game

which was stagnant for too long. Cricket was, in reality, struggling, prompting a magazine none other than The Cricketer to ask on its July '84 cover, 'Is Test Cricket Dying?". In fact, that is what seemed to be happening with crowds on the wane when confronted by either hopelessly one-sided victories or dull draws. The game was floundering with the lack of excitement in it, and it was almost single-handedly the work of Kerry Packer that saved it. The large crowds that flocked too see an almost unholy perversion of a once noble game (in coloured clothing, white balls and night cricket), assured the sponsors that there was money in this new spectacle. This ushered in an unprecedented revolution in cricket, an era in which we bask today.

Indeed even the changes in the makeup of the crowd seems to uncannily mirror many of the changes on the field. The sedate cricket enthusiast clapping calmly at the occasional boundary has been replaced by the soccer fan style fanatic, replete with face paint and out-landish attire. This new breed's over enthusiasm does seem to spill over onto the field, much as they do themselves, to personally congratulate the players. This new phenomenon does worry another experienced cricket journalist, no less than Omar Kureshi. "These freaks," he writes, "have no place on the cricket field."

But that is not to think that the cricketer of yesteryears was no less aggressive than those of today. From 'Fiery' Fred Truman to Lord Learie Constantine (who himself professed that when batting, his sole purpose was not to score a century but to hit the ball to all corners of the field), who can argue that these cricketers were no less competitive than today's players. They simply conducted themselves in a manner more befitting a true cricketer of the day. Yet spirit is what the game of

cricket is all about. Yes, it is about winning and losing, but more importantly it is about the spirit in which it is played. Cricket embodies a wealth of ideals and attitudes that unfortunately these days only seem to be found in the footage of those old games. The laws of cricket themselves refer to 'the spirit of the game,' yet leave this spirit undefined. The very fact that we now seek to define this spirit reflects on the state of the game today. The greatness of the game is that it has survived so much more than this present predicament. From Bodyline to Gatting-Rana. from South Africa to the bribery scandal, cricket has eventually emerged the victor. The current state of the game does upset the purists but there is little doubt that the game will carry on. But I wonder, for the players today, would a victory be so sweet if not ob-tained in the highest standards of civility, sportsmanship and dignity that cricket sets for us
