Margas signs for West Ham

LONDON, July 31: Chilean World Cup defender Javier Margas joined English Premier league West Ham in a two million pounds (3.29 million US dollars) transfer on Thursday. reports Reuters.

The London club also added to their defensive resources by recruiting Neil Ruddock from Liverpool on a three-year contract on a pay-as-you-play basis which could push the fee up to 550,000 pounds (904,900 dol-

Margas joins on a four-year deal from Deportiva Universidad Catolica de Chile. He speaks only a little English but has promised to take further

lessons. "This is a great opportunity for me and my family to come to England," he said. "I am delighted to be joining West Ham and I believe I can help the club

to become very successful." Margas, who dyed his hair red before Chile's World Cup quarter-final clash with Brazil, is now suggesting he will dye it in West Ham's colours. "If we reach Wembley, I will dve it

Antic declines Yugoslav job

BELGRADE, July 31: (Reuters/ Internet): Former Atletico Madrid coach Radomir Antic said on Wednesday he had turned down the job of Yugoslav national coach because he wanted to stay in Spanish club soccer.

"At this moment my commitment is to club soccer," Antic told a news conference in Belgrade. "My ambitions are still tied to Spain."

The current Yugoslav coach, Slobodan Santrac, wants to step down and suggested Antic as his successor last Friday. Antic was replaced by Italian Arrigo Sacchi at Atletico at the end of last season.

Santrac, who remains coach for the time being, has come in for harsh criticism in Yugoslavia for the team's overly defensive performance in the recent World Cup finals in France. The Yugoslavs were knocked out by the Netherlands in the second round.

Yugoslav federation general secretary Branko Bulatovic said the search would continue for another candidate to replace Santrac.

De Boers meet dead end

ZEIST, Netherlands, July 31: Frank and Ronald de Boer on Thursday lost their bid to cancel

six-year contracts with Ajax Amsterdam, a spokes-man for the Dutch football association said, reports AFP.

The association's arbitration committee ruled that the 27-year-old twins had not presented valid arguments to cut short their contracts, which were renewed for another six years only last year.

"They argued that they wanted to move to better clubs but the committee ruled that as both Barcelona and Ajax are top European clubs, the move would not represent a step up,' spokesman Rob de Leede explained.

Barcelona had reportedly been willing to pay 22 million dollars for the pair and provide them with a salary five times higher than the amount they currently earn.

"The De Boers also said they would earn more money elsewhere, but the committee dereided that this was not a good enough reason to break a contract," De Leede added.

Alcohol ban at Headingley

LEEDS, England, July 31: Yorkshire have decided to ban spectators from bringing alcohol into part of their Headingley ground for England's decisive fifth Test against South Africa next week, they announced today, reports AFP.

Following consultations with the police and other ground safety agencies, officials at the English county will pre-vent ticket holders on the notorious western terrace carrying in their own alcohol for the match.

However, the existing 'four can rule' will apply to fans in other areas of the ground. Fans are allowed to bring in four cans of beer each in those parts of the ground.

The western terrace has been the scene of alcohol-fuelled rowdiness and occasional vio-

lence in recent years. A Yorkshire spokesman said: "We remain committed to the principle of providing a comfortable and safe environment for the average spectator to enjoy international cricket at Headingley without being subject to the anti-social behaviour of the mindless minor-

These new measures are introduced as a major benefit to the well being of the vast number of genuine cricket supporters. Similar measure are being taken at other provincial Test match venues."

Chief inspector Ray Shep hered of the local police added: "A lot of time and money is spent on the event and we will not allow a handful of ill-behaved idiots to spoil it for everyone else.

"If they are not in the Headingley ground to enjoy cricket then we will try and make sure they don't get in at all."

Bartlett joins FC Zurich

NEW YORK, July 31: South African forward Shaun Bartlett, who scored two goals in the World Cup, has transferred to FC Zurich of the Swiss Fist Division. US Major League Soccer announced Tuesday, reports AP.

Bartlett played two seasons in MSL with the Colorado Rapids and New York-New Jersey MetroStars before returning on loan to the Cape Town Spurs in South Africa last fall.

He returned to South Africa to bolster his chances to play in the World Cup and scored twice for the Bafana Bafana against Saudi Arabia in 2-2 first-round draw.

The 25-year-old Bartlett. who scored 11 goals in 49 games in MLS, was transferred for 1.3 million dollars, according to a MLS source.

Ferguson has been chasing the Dutch strike star for three years - and now part one of his 25 million pound dream front pairing is complete.

The second part involves prising £16m-rated Dwight Yorke away from Aston Villa. Kluivert and Yorke are the

star names that have taken pride of place in Ferguson's little black book as he scoured the world for fresh talent. Until now, they have been out of reach of the manager who

has acquired the likes of Eric

Cantona, Ryan Giggs, David Beckham, Paul Ince, Mark

Hughes, Roy Keane and Peter Schmeichel. But now, beaming with smiles aboard the bus ferrying United's squad to their training facilities at Brondby, he is so

close to his dream.

Edwards, after his hundredth and more phone call of a transfer busy day, admitted: "It has always been Alex's dream pairing to have Kluivert and Yorke up front."

The only downside of Ferguson's elation will be the possible departure of Andy Cole, his record 7 million pound buy from Newcastle three-and-ahalf year's ago.

Villa boss John Gregory will not budge from his standpoint that Cole is the only one he is interested in if a player-pluscash deal is struck between the two clubs for Yorke. Ferguson has always stood

by Cole and he dropped out of the chase for Chile ace Marcelo Salas last Christmas when his man hit a rich streak of form. Now the United boss might have

Twelve months on and the Italians could not wait to send him packing. But Kluivert's magnificent performances in the World Cup rocketed him back to the heights of mega-

Ferguson, on World Cup duty for Independent TV, was totally convinced that Kluivert, who powered Holland into the semi-

finals, must be his man. His power in the air. strength on the ground and venom of shot will send a chill down every Premiership de-

fender next year. Not since Hughes's shock departure to Chelsea has Ferguson had such a robust, rugged type.

Kluivert fills the void perfectly. And as for Yorke, the little Tobago-born striker is the natural choice to link up with Kluivert. Ferguson has been a long-time admirer and two months ago made no secret of the fact that Yorke was earmarked as an urgent acquisi-

The double signing will be a big relief to Ferguson, who has found in the last two years that the name of United is not enough to tempt the biggest stars to Old Trafford.

Money has been no object when transfer fees have been discussed, with Ferguson this summer having unlimited pow-ers to splash out up to £30m as United, once more, chase the historic double of a European Cup and Premiership crown. But when it comes down to

the nitty gritty of wages, Ferguson has missed out. Argentine duo Gabriel Batis-

tuta and Ariel Ortega wanted far too much cash, with demands of £40,000-a-week tax free. Ferguson did not get Brian Laudrup or Alan Shearer for

Euro Super League makes FIFA edgy



LONDON, July 31 (AP): It doesn't even exist yet. But the prospect of a League looms so

breakaway Super large over European soccer that FIFA is already warning

The British media is convinced the league will be set up within two years, backed by pay-per-view TV and persuasive commercial giants such as Italian TV magnate Silvio Berlusconi

According to the papers, established UEFA-backed competitions and domestic leagues will be powerless to stop clubs such as Inter and AC Milan, Juventus, Real Madrid, Barcelona, Bayern Munich, Manchester United, Arsenal and Liverpool from joining the Super League by the year 2000.

While speculation abounds amid reports of secret meetings, the clubs are saying nothing. Only those against the concept are making any noise about it. FIFA, soccer's world govern-

ing body, has warned that anyone who takes part in defiance of UEFA will be banned from playing at any other level of the game, from domestic leagues to the World Cup. "If this league were to be run

or led by elements outside the football community of UEFA or the national associations, or without their backing, we would not permit it," said FIFA spokesman Keith Cooper.

"If a league were set up in defiance of UEFA it would lead to the suspension of the clubs concerned and their players.

"Any players would be banned from playing any kind of professional football, including international matches, until the suspension were lifted. That's the barrier they have to cross.

UEFA, which stands to lose the most in terms of prestige, issued a statement Thursday saying that the feedback it had received from the individual national associations indicated the clubs weren't interested in the Super League.

"UEFA takes it for granted

that the clubs in question will not make any commitment to any such private party which would jeopardise their future participation in national and international competitions," the statement read.

The idea of a Super League has been talked about in secret for some time.

According to the tabloid Daily Mail, meetings took place at the London offices of a firm of lawyers as recently as last week between club owners and legal representatives of Super League backers.

The meetings were in such secrecy that security staff made sure that the floors above and below the rooms were off limits to staff and documents relating to the discussions were shredded.

Several press reports suggest Berlusconi, owner of AC Milan and a former Italian Premier, is the leading mover behind the Super League. His TV companies likely would profit hugely from pulling Europe's biggest clubs into one star-studded competi-

Critics say that such a league would make the rich clubs even richer while the vast majority which don't play in the Super League would lose TV revenue and prestige. They would also be competing for UEFA competitions which wouldn't have the gloss of big-name involvement.

Because Super League speculation has been around for more than a decade, UEFA has taken steps to strengthen its own competitions to keep them more attractive to the big clubs. It created a league system

within the Champions Cup so that the leading eight clubs go automatically into the last 24 and play in groups before reverting to the knockout formula from the quarterfinal onwards.
