

Ravindu gets green signal

NAIROBI, Aug 2 (India
Abroad News Service) Promising
young batsman Ravindu
Shah, who started in Kenya's
Upton, won over India at Gwalior,
has been cleared to play for
Kenya at the September Commonwealth
Games, though he
holds a British passport.

Commonwealth Games vice
president Charles Makora, who is
from Kenya, told IANS that the
English cricket authorities gave
Shah, who is of Indian descent,
the green signal on the grounds
that although he held a British
passport, he was born in Kenya
and was a resident of the country.

Shah's inclusion in the
team had been in doubt because
it was feared that he might be
debarred from featuring in the
September 11-23 Games. He
plays for a leading Kenyan club,
Nairobi Gymkhana, and has a
number of good performances to
his credit.

A right-handed batsman,
Shah made his one-day international
debut for Kenya during the
recent Coca-Cola Cup triangular
series involving India and
Bangladesh. His first international
match was against Bangladesh
at Hyderabad in May.

The youngster posted his
personal highest score of 70
runs in Kenya's upset 69-run
victory over India at Gwalior. He
has so far played five international
one-dayers and has an
average of 42.60.

According to International
Cricket Council (ICC) rules, a
player must be in continuous
residence in a country for four
years to be eligible to play for
that country. Shah apparently
satisfies this condition.

About the possibility of his
actual selection to the team,
Kenya Cricket Association (KCA)
chairman Jimmy Ryani said it
would all depend on his
performance in the local circuit.
"He is being carefully watched
by the selection committee
members who will have the
final say," he told IANS.

Former West Indian star
Alvin Kalicharan will be the
new coach for the Kenyan team.
Kalicharan has been
contracted after the sudden
departure of former Indian
all-rounder Roger Binny "who had
to leave because he said he was
starting his own coaching camp
in Bangalore," Ryani said.

The Kenyan team has traditionally
had Indian coaches,
among them former Test players
Hanuman Singh and
Sandeep Patil who are still held
in high esteem by both local
administrators and cricketers.

baseline.

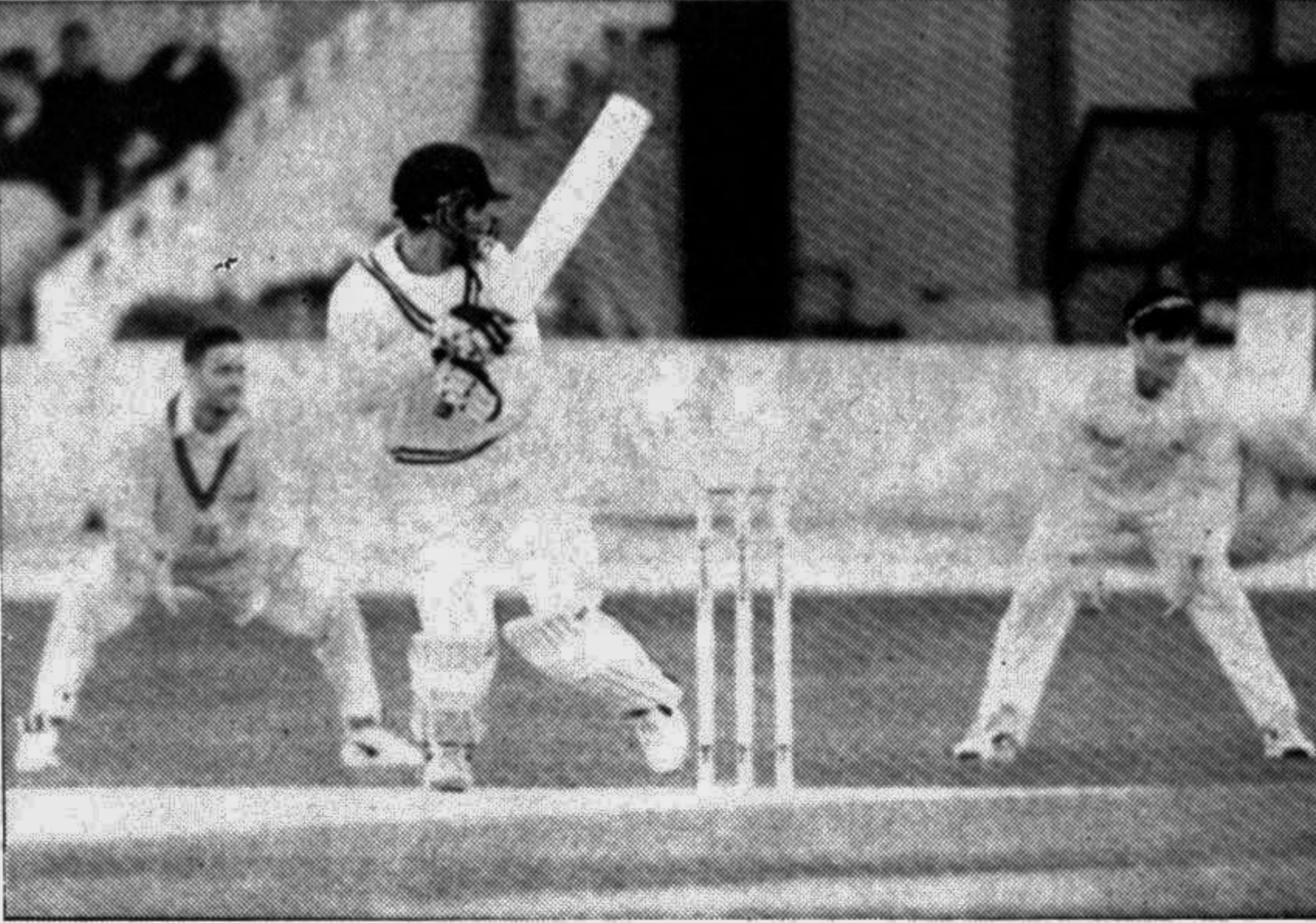
Marin saved five set points

Woolmer wants more from third umpire

CHELMSFORD, England, Aug 2: South African coach Bob Woolmer on Saturday called for extended use of the third umpire in Test matches ahead of next week's decisive fifth Test against England, reports AFP.

Following the controversial, incident-packed fourth Test at Trent Bridge Woolmer said there is too much pressure on umpires and that an experimental period of using more technology could be the way forward.

"Let's have a look at it. There's no reason why we can't experiment just to see," said Woolmer speaking after play on the second day of South Africa's final warm-up match was washed out by a thunderstorm.

Umpire Marven Kitchen gave controversial decision against South African batsmen Jacques Kallis and Jonty Rhodes before England triumphed by eight wickets to level the series and Kitchen was later reported as saying that it may be his last Test.

"It's been a traumatic week for umpires but we lost the Test match because we batted badly in the second innings, not because of the umpiring," said Woolmer.

"It's horrible to hear Merv Kitchen saying he doesn't want to do this. No one wants to hear that his career may be over because of the pressure he is under.

"We have got to find ways of helping him, helping everybody. We are all in it together." Like England, South Africa are pondering what line-up to take into the Headingley crunch match.

Woolmer said, "We won't make any decision until we have a look at the wicket. There's talk of us playing five seamers. We have that option and Brian McMillan would come into the frame if we want that way.

South Africa's bowlers were restricted to just 127 minutes of cricket on Saturday before the heavy rain came to hold up the Essex first innings at 102 for three; 304 behind the touring team's total.

Shaun Pollock removed Essex's Ian Flanagan early on, and Makaya Ntini flattened Darren Robinson's off-stump and generally bowled at a sharp pace without having too much luck.

Al-rounder Ronnie Irani, a member of England's Test squad in 1996, hit an eye-catching 33, including a six off McMillan which soared into an adjoining garden in an over which brought him 13 of his runs.

Woolmer appeared to give opener Gerry Liebenberg a vote of confidence, saying, "We don't need to panic over the opening batting.

"Liebenberg has scored runs but not at Test level. It's not a matter of technique, it's a matter of temperament in dealing with the situation.

"He's a determined lad and there's no reason why he shouldn't do it.

"We are 1-1 in the series when we could have been ahead but that's the game of cricket. You have got to sustain it over five Tests.

Croft left on sidelines

LONDON, Aug 2: England left off-spinner Robert Croft today in naming their 12 for the final Test against South Africa, reports Reuters.

The match, starting at Headingley, Leeds, on Thursday, will decide the series currently level at 1-1.

There were no other changes from the squad for the fourth Test at Trent Bridge, Nottingham, where England won by eight wickets to set up the decider.

Croft had been one of 13 players originally selected for Trent Bridge but was released early to play for his county Glamorgan.

Leicestershire's left-arm seamer Alan Mullally was 12th man on that occasion. Now the selectors must decide whether to play him instead of leg-spinner Ian Salisbury at a ground which traditionally does not favour spin.

Middlesex captain Mark Ramprakash is suffering from tonsillitis but is expected to be fit.

Indians to start off the experiment

HYDERABAD, Aug 2: Sweeping changes in the laws of cricket on the basis of International Cricket Council (ICC) cricket committee recommendations, ratified by the ICC umpires and accepted by Broad of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), will come into effect from September 1, reports PTI.

The ICC umpires conference, held at Lord's last month, dealt with changes made by the ICC cricket committee to lift the standard of playing conditions on an initial three-year experiment on various aspects such as hours of play, extra time, use of lights, fieldsmen leaving field, mode of delivery, penalty, ball lost or becoming unfit for play, negative bowling outside the leg stump, unfair play, batsmen damaging the pitch and restrictions on the placement of fieldsmen.

ICC umpire from India, V K Ramaswamy, who was one of the delegates, said these recommendations will curb negative attitude of playing teams and give more powers to umpires to take stern action against playing teams and players in future.

One of the important decisions of the committee was to take stern measures on suspect action of bowlers, Ramaswamy said.

If it is a clear case of suspect action, the umpire after only one warning may remove the bowler from bowling. If the offender continues with his suspect action bowling and if it is a doubtful case, it should be brought to the notice of match observer or referee for the BCCI to take further action in this regard, the ICC umpire added.

Lara's silence still unbroken

Trinidad, Aug 2 (The Express/Internet) July 31 has come and gone. But the Trinidad and Tobago Cricket Board still has not had word from current national captain Brian Lara.

The Board had written to the T&T skipper seeking a firm commitment on his availability as skipper of the national team for the Red Stripe Bowl One-day tournament in October.

Asked whether he was disappointed that Lara had not yet responded to his board's request, TTCB president Alloy Lequay was guarded.

"I will still give him a day or two," he told the Express yesterday. But while the board wait in expectation, a potential replacement is waiting in the wings - Phil Simmons.

He has said he is available to captain the team if Brian is not," Lequay disclosed.

Simmons, who took T&T to the one-off Red Stripe Cup final in 1996, was also vice-captain of the team that finished joint fourth with Barbados this year in the President's Cup.
