LONDON, Aug 3: South African fast bowler Allan Donald could face a fine or suspension after criticising the umpiring decisions during the fourth Test against England, reports

As his team prepares for the fifth and decisive Test starting Thursday at Headingley, Donald faces possible sanctions from the International Cricket Council after criticising fourth Test umpire Mervyn Kitchen.

The ICC code of conduct for bids players from commenting on umpiring decisions but Donald broke the rules over the weekend by criticising several decisions during England's eight-wicket win at Trent Bridge.

It was Kitchen's admission that he made mistakes during the match and was considering his future at Test level which prompted Donald to say umpiring decisions had swung the game in England's favour.

Donald said he played in previous matches under Kitchen's adjudication and had the utmost respect for him but he suggested if Kitchen had doubts he should retire.

English player Mark Ramprakash was fined 25 per cent of his match fee and had a one-test ban suspended for six months after the ICC ruled he disputed an umpiring decision during the second Test at Lord's.

Tiriac's denial

BUCHAREST, Aug 3: Former Romanian tennis star Ion Tiriac has denied that he was in any way involved in an inquiry into the tax affairs of former Wimbledon champion Boris Becker, whom he used to coach and manage, reports AFP.

In interviews published in Romanian newspapers today, Tiriac denied he had spoken to investigators looking into Becker's affairs.

"Neither myself, nor any of the companies that work with me have been at all involved in these fiscal investigations," Tiriac said.

Germany's tax authorities carried out an extensive search operation last week in connection with its investigation into possible tax avoidance by Becker.

The investigation, launched in 1996, is looking into an alleged fraud by three-time champion Becker and Tiriac, committed between 1990 and 1993.

Last year Becker declared himself exhausted by the inquiry and threatened to deprive Germany of "Becker the milking cow" by moving to live in another country.

Tiriac, currently president of the Romanian Olympic Committee, said the aggressive way in which Becker was being persuade amounted to a violation of his rights.

HANOVER, Germany, Aug 3: German police have arrested a German football hooligan suspected of being one of the main culprits in a vicious assault on a French gendarme during the World Cup, German prosecutors said today, reports AFP.

Christopher R, 23, from Erkner, East Germany, was picked up in Berlin on Friday. He is wanted for attempted murder and malicious wound-


Prosecutors said he was one of the four main attackers of gendarme Daniel Nivel, who was clubbed to the ground and savagely kicked into a coma by a gang of German hooligans after the match between Yugoslavia and Germany in Lens on June 21.

Three other hooligans - Andre Z. 27, Tobias R, 24 and Frank R. 30 - were already under arrest and in custody here. Karl-Heinz Elschner, 26,

who was one of two Germans arrested by French police, walked free from jail with his lawyer on July 29 after paying a 10,000 dollar bail. He has been charged with attempted murder.

The gendarme, a 43-year-old father of two, remains in a coma and is believed to have suffered irreversible brain damage.



SYDNEY, Aug 3 (The Sydney Morning Herald/ Internet) Athletes who test positive to performance-enhancing drugs may soon have their names revealed immediately after they return a positive test in a bid to end damaging media speculation about the identity of drug cheats. The planned amendments to

the Australian Sports Drug Agency Act, timetabled for the spring parliamentary session, have the support of the Federal Minister for Sport, Andrew Thomson. Under existing ASDA legis-

lation, the offending athlete is notified after he or she has tested positive to an A sample, but the national sporting organisation is not informed until after the B sample has been tested and the athlete has an

opportunity to challenge the re-

The gap between the testing of A and B samples can extend to three months - during which time totally innocent parties might come under suspicion. The nine-year-old ASDA act is being redrafted to allow ath-

letes the right to waive an analysis of the B sample and dispense with the seven-day submission period, when the athlete is invited to present evidence to challenge the validity of the test. Such a move would mean an

organisation like the National Rugby League would be informed of a positive A at almost the same time as the athlete's name is recorded in Canberra's Register of Notifiable Events. The NRL will spend \$500,000

on drug tests in 1998, at a cost of \$440 per player test, yet has

been continually embarrassed by leaks, citing the case of a three-month gap between one positive A test and final confirmation from ASDA.

Clubs are further embarrassed by relying on the protocol-conscious NRL or a guiltstricken player for information.

Recently, a report of an alleged steroid positive to a former Newcastle player resulted in the managing director of the Melbourne Storm, John Ribot, asking each member of his first-grade team hours before a match whether they had received any communication from ASDA

ASDA's first contact with a player who has tested positive to an A sample is by telephone, advising him of a forthcoming registered letter.
