Gough took five for 36 as Worcestershire were skittled for 94 at their Worcester headquar-

The innings and 160 runs success left Yorkshire joint third. Gough's figures, added to his four for 30 haul in Sunday's one-dayer, means he is full of confidence for this week's deciding fifth Test against South Africa on Home turf at Heading-

ley.
"I have been bowling well all season and now I am getting figures to prove that I am on song," said Gough. His victims included Test players Graeme Hick and Tom Moody.

Scottish all-rounder Gavin Hamilton did the rest of the damage with four for 17.

Worcestershire said today that they have agreed a new one-year contract with Tom Moody to keep their Australian captain at the English county side next season.

The deal will go ahead whether or not Moody is included in his country's squad for the World Cup in the early part of the summer.

Yorkshire took 24 points from their fourth win of the season but remained 42 adrift of leaders Surey who beat Sussex with a day to spare.

Nivel regains

consciousness

LILLE, France, Aug 4: A French policeman has awoken from a coma, six weeks after being clubbed over the head by German thugs during the World Cup, hospital officials said Tuesday, reports AP.

Daniel Nivel, 44, regained consciousness on Monday, and was taken off a respirator. He was expected to begin rehabilitation in the next few weeks. Lille hospital said in a statement.

"Daniel Nivel spends several hours per day in an armchair. the statement said. "He suffers serious problems concerning understanding and speech and will need extensive rehabilitation.'

The hospital added that Nivel also was suffering from muscular problems on his right

Nivel was attacked by a group of German fans shortly after a June 21 World Cup match between Germany and Yugoslavia in this northern French town.

At the time of the attack, Nivel was guarding a police vehicle near the stadium. He was hit on the back of the head with an iron bar. Four suspects are in custody

in Germany, facing charges of joint attempted murder and causing serious bodily harm as well as disturbing the peace. Another suspect is being held in France.

German prosecutors say they believe they have most of the suspects, but added that their investigation remained open.

Crafter said Tuesday he wanted more information about the technology.
"I suspect a number of those

sorts of things are in the embryo stage for lbw decisions," Crafter said. "I wouldn't want to see the human element completely taken out but I would like to see

what is being proposed. It's important in cricket, and modern sport in general, that the right decisions are given. "The lbw is a decision that relies entirely on the umpire's

discretion, but it's not black and white."

LONDON, Aug 4: England's top clubs should follow the example of Manchester United and Liverpool and invest in home-grown youth rather than simply write out cheques for top foreigners according to players union boss Gordon Taylor, reports AFP.

Taylor, the Professional Footballers Association chief executive, says he is appalled by the number of foreign imports playing their trade in the English Premiership.

Of 52 summer transfers, 26 involved players from outside the British Isles, a situation Taylor believes cannot be allowed to continue.

"You couldn't have a finer example of youngsters being given a chance than Manchester United and Liverpool, who supplied virtually half the England team during the World Cup," explained Taylor.

"If there were any doubts about the benefits of a youth system then they should have been obliterated by the success of Michael Owen.

He becomes the eighth new signing at Ibrox since Dick Advocaat took over as manager and set about building a team to win back the Scottish title it lost to Celtic last season.

Hendry started his professional career at Dundee in 1983 before moving to England to join Blackburn in 1987. He left Ewood Park after 102

Hendry helped Blackburn win promotion to the Premier League at the end of the 1991-92 season and played a major role in the side's Premier League title in 1995.
