GENEVA. Aug 5: Scottish Premier league club Rangers and Turkish side Altay were both fined 25,000 Swiss francs (16,850 US dollars) fines by UEFA's control and disciplinary committee on Tuesday, reports Reuters.

Rangers were punished because of their fans' misbehaviour during a UEFA Cup first round qualifying match against Irish side Shelbourne on July 22.

Altay were fined 20,000 francs for failing to control their fans and a further 5.000 for "improper conduct" by their players during an Intertoto Cup clash against Italy's Bastia.



WEST PALM BEACH, Aug 5: Muhammad Ali has stopped an experimental treatment for his Parkinson's disease, saying he felt used by the Boca Raton clinic where he went for help, reports AP.

For more than a decade, the former heavyweight champion has suffered from the disease that slowed his reflexes and made it difficult for him to talk. Ali had received five days of treatments at the clinic before deciding to quit.

Ali criticised Jerry Jacobson, a retired dentist and oral surgeon with whom Ali began treatments July 28, for not respecting his privacy. "I feel was used to promote their clinic," Ali said in a statement.

Jacobson, who said he has invented a breakthrough technology for regenerating nerve cells, said he was both hurt and saddened by Ali's reaction. "I feel really awful ... it's just






