

Spl Immigration Appeals Commission set up in UK

The Special Immigration Appeals Commission came into being in Britain on August 3, reports UNB.

The Commission has been established by the government in response to criticism made by the European Court of Human Rights in the case of Karamjit Singh Chahal, said a press release of the British High Commission yesterday.

It said the Commission will deal with appeals in a small number of cases where the Home Secretary personally directs that a person be deported from the United Kingdom on the grounds that this would be conducive to the public good.

Sartaz Aziz new Pak FM

ISLAMABAD, Aug 6: Pakistani Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif named new men today to direct the key areas of finance and foreign affairs as his government struggled to ward off economic collapse and repair international ties strained by his nuclear tests, reports AP.

An information ministry spokesman confirmed the longrumoured changes late today. Former finance minister Sartaj Aziz was shifted to foreign affairs, while respected economist Hafeez Pasha was named special finance adviser. Pasha is not in parliament, and so could not be named minister.

The outspoken Gohar Ayub, who as foreign minister had had tough words for neighbouring India after it conducted nuclear tests in May, was moved to minister of water and power.

According to British High Commission sources, the Special Immigration Appeals Commission Act 1997 (SIAC) does not give a right of appeal to all people who have been excluded from UK on the personal direction of the Home Secre-For the most part, those will

have a right of appeal against exclusion to whom certain European law considerations ap-

The SIAC Act 1997 received Royal Assent on December 17.



The furnace oil was sent recently for use at the Khulna Power Station.

When contacted, Chief Engineer of Goalpara Power Station Mohammad Golam Mostafa said that the furnace oil was found to be adulterated after laboratory tests.

The furnace oil, carried by MT Madina, anchored at the Goalpara Power Station jetty on July 25.

The PDB authorities alleged that excessive water has been mixed with furnace oil which is dangerous for use in power generation. The use of adulterated fuel causes serious damage to the power generating units, a PDB source said.




