Henry for Arsenal



No stopping for Matthaeus

BONN, Aug 8 (Reuters/Internet): Germany's most capped player Lothar Matthaeus said he might continue his international career.

"There is a 50 per cent, maybe a 51 per cent chance that I will carry on," the 37-year-old Bayern Munich libero told daily Muenchner AZ in an interview on Saturday.

Matthaeus, who became the only outfield player to play in five World Cup finals this summer in France, said he had spoken to Germany head coach Berti Vogts.

"He called me and we talked for some 20 minutes," said Matthaeus, who has appeared 129 times for his country. "We talked about the World Cup and other things but not so much about my future in the national team We'll do that next time he Carachan Munich."

Vivas, a hard-tacking wingback who joined Arsenal on Thursday, has stoked up the Charity Shield by condemning Manchester United midfielder Beckham for his kick on Diego Simeone.

He said: "It certainly got easier for us the moment Beckham was sent off. That swayed the game our way.

It was one of the best matches of the World Cup. There was a great crowd, the atmosphere was terrific but Beckham's sending off changed England."

Vivas was due to take the sixth Argentian penalty in the shoot-out that decided the second round game, but David Batty's miss for England spared him that ordeal.

FIFA boss wants Africa to host WC 2006

LONDON, Aug 8: FIFA president Sepp Blatter sees no danger that South Korea will pull out of staging the next World Cup and indicated the 2006 tournament should be held in Africa, reports AP.

Blatter, recently elected head of soccer's world governing body, says he is not concerned about the ability of South Korea and Japan to host the event for any reason, economic or bad

"The FIFA contracts for the basic finance support of this competition — television and marketing rights - are already signed and ensured, so we do not have any concern about the

economic situation." he told BBC radio on Friday. The Koreans suggested the month-long competition be put back to September to avoid the rainy season. But Blatter confirmed the 2002 World Cup would not be rescheduled because the dates - in the summer months of June and July — had

been agreed. Blatter also revealed Africa was a "logical" choice to host the 2006 World Cup. South Africa had applied to become the first African nation to stage the competition and faces opposition from front-running can-

didates Germany and England. "I would say it the conditions are fulfilled by one of the associations bidding in Africa, then logically FIFA should give the World Cup to an African country," he said.

1994 to take up a position as technical director for the country's soccer programme, with his main focus being on reaching the World Cup finals. This unprecedented

achievement came in France '98 and his adopted countrymen have hailed Simoes as a national hero. But it has not always been

smooth sailing for Simoes in Jamaica, especially in his relationship with sections of the media. Last May, in an angry response to a newspaper article about his salary, the Brazilian announced that he would not renew his contract when it expires in October. Since then there have been

many calls for him to reconsider and he has been hinting at a possible change of heart, especially since the World Cup where Jamaica lost to Croatia and Argentina but defeated Japan to record its first victory at this level. Simoes was named in the

country's annual national honours list on Independence Day on Thursday, whereby he is to be made a commander of the order of distinction.
