Pierce will face secondseeded Lindsay Davenport in Sunday's final. Davenport advanced with a 6-4, 2-6, 7-5 victory over fourth-seeded Monica

Pierce, down one set and 1-4 in the second set, fought back to force a tiebreak. After Pierce took a 4-1 lead in the tiebreak, Hingis won five consecutive points, setting up her first match point.

But Pierce hit a tremendous swinging forehand volley to cut the lead to 6-5. Pierce saved another match point when she hit a swinging backhand to tie the score 6-6.

After Hingis got to match point for the third time, Pierce hit a forehand volley to pull even at 7-7.

Pierce went ahead 8-7 on an easy forehand volley at the net before winning the set when Hingis put a forehand into the

Hingis held serve to start the third set, but Pierce dominated the rest of the match as she reeled off five straight games. Pierce closed out the match when Hingis hit a backhand into the net.

"I just kept focusing through each point," said Pierce, who has won five of eight career matches against Hingis. "I kept

ATHENS, Aug 9: Russia staged a thrilling comeback to beat the United States 66-64 in the last seconds of their World Basketball Championship semifinal on Saturday to book a place in today's final against Yugoslavia, reports Reuters.

The Yugoslavs, champions in 1990, clinched their slot with a 78-73 overtime victory over Greece, to the massive disappointment of the 18,000 crowd at the Olympic Indoor Stadium. The dreams of the US non-
