

India commissions new warship

CALCUTTA, Aug 10: India's defence minister George Fernandes today commissioned a new warship into the navy and said he expected an early decision on building an aircraft carrier, reports Reuters.

The 1,400-tonne corvette 'Kora', built by the state-run Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers, is armed with long range sea-skimming missiles and can carry attack helicopters, a government statement said.

"The ship is one of the most powerful of its kind in the world." Fernandes said at the commissioning ceremony in the eastern city of Calcutta.

Fernandes said the government would soon take a decision to build an indigenous aircraft carrier.

EU states worried as Italy to free hundreds of immigrants The new law, which came into force last month, requires

ROME, Aug 10: Italy, swamped by a flood of illegal immigrants, was bracing itself today for the release of hundreds of refugees held in detention centres, dubbed by the Italian media as 'the great escape,' reports Reuters.

Under a tough new law, any illegal immigrant not sent home within a month will be released and given 15 days to leave the country, but many Italians fear the refugees will ignore the order and disappear without trace.

Italy's European Union partners are also worried that, once freed, the illegal immigrants will take the opportunity to make their way to other member countries. The 30-day deadline for the

first wave of 'clandestini,' who were detained after washing up on Sicilian shores last month, expires on Wednesday. "In two days the 'great escape'

Many fell into the canal, and many were hits," said Khaleda, a landless peasant who had participated in the protest.

She said the police were firing at them from hardly twenty meters away. "I was with Zaheda because we were good friends. I picked her up from the canal and, in wet clothes, we shouted slogans and walked towards the police who were firing hundreds of shots. "Seconds later, a shot
