Ershad's remark amounts to contempt of court, say top lawyers

Some leading lawyers of the country yesterday condemned the statement of former president HM Ershad in which he said that he had set up seven benches of the High Court but they were "spoiled by the conspiracy of a group of people including President Shahabuddin

Ershad's statement was published in an English daily yesterday. The lawyers in a joint statement said. The statement prima facie amounts to gross contempt of Court as it casts serious aspersions on the historic Judgement of the Appellate Division in the Eighth Amendment case, and on the judges, one of whom has been named. who were parties to that judge-

NGO activities in 3 hill dists suspended

KHAGRACHARI, Aug 11: The government has suspended all activities of Non-Government Organisations (NGOs) in the three hill districts, reports

Official sources here said the NGO activities were restricted by an order issued by the district administration.

The order was issued following a directive by the Home Ministry. Special Affairs Division conveyed the directive to the district administration.

However, the suspension will be in force until a new guideline for the NGOs is formulated, the sources said.

When contacted, an official of the BRAC working in Khagrachari said it had suspended all its activities in the district.

Body to probe destruction of valuable nat'l documents formed

The government yesterday formed a three-member probe body to investigate the destruction of valuable national documents during the tenure of the

past governments, reports BSS. An official handout said that the Ministry of Information was informed that a number of documents, posters, films, still photographs, audio and video tapes, press photos, documentary films and special news bulletins related to the history of the liberation movement, War of Independence, life of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and his contributions to the nation were destroyed during the tenures of past governments.

The high-powered probe body, headed by additional secretary of the information ministry, will submit a detailed report, identifying the persons responsible for the incidents by August 31.

Full-scale gas supply from Sangu

Consumption & payment to be difficult for govt

The government will face extremedifficulty in consuming and paying for gas from the Sangu field when its British developer Cairn Energy starts. supplying the full quantum of gas from December next. sources said.

Cairn Energy intends to increase gas supply from Sangu from December to 160 million cubic feet gas per day (mmcfd) from the present level of 60 mmcfd, Simon J Thomson, assistant to the Chief Executive of Cairn, told The Daily Star during a visit last week.

Petrobangla sources, on the other hand, said that the existing infrastructure could not even properly distribute the 60 mmcfd although there was a huge gap between demand and

In order to consume Sangu gas, production in several gasfields under Petrobangla have been reduced.

"It would be impossible for Petrobangla to actually consume and utilise Sangu's 160 mmcfd gas in December without further reducing gas production at the state-run gasfields," said a source. He added that the situation would have been much productive had the government implemented projects like the Meghnaghat power plant ear-

The gas produced at the state-run gasfields like Titas, Bakhrabad and Jalalabad is cheaper than Sangu gas by about 100 per cent.

As per the agreed gas pricing formula, the price of Sangu gas during the June-August quarter is around 2.25 US dollars (or around Tk 110) a unit (one thousand cubic feet). In contrast, the local sale price of gas is Tk 56. Therefore, greater quantum of gas purchase from Sangu would mean a bigger loss for the country. The loss would See Page 12 Col 3

Akram is now under treatment at the prison wing of PG Hospital. He was brought to the hospital on Monday as he fell sick. He is on a three-day CID remand since Sunday.

CID Investigating Officer of the murder case yesterday submitted a petition before the court saying that Akram was handed over to prison custody as he was sick.

According to court sources, the report from Pallabi thana mentioned that AC Akram's father was a food inspector in Calcutta. Later, in his retired life, he was a Union Parishad Chairman in Tangail. It added that AC Akram is a first class government official and his relatives are in prestigious po-



Unusual rush of patients at ICDDR,B

An unusually large number of diarrhoea patients are seeking treatment at the ICDDR B in the city over the last two weeks.

"At this time of the year, we don't receive so many patients, We received 614 patients on Monday and discharged 434 of them the same day," said Dr Md Abdus Salam, Chief Physician of the ICDDR,B the only specialised hospital for treatment of diarrhoeal diseases.

Dr Salam said, this is definitely an unusual number of cases. Normally, diarrhoeal epidemic is noticed during September and October. To handle the situation, additional funds are being sought from donor agencies.

"Normally, we require 1.2 million US dollars annually to provide hospital services here. But due to the unusual rush of patients, we may have to seek at least half a million dollars extra," he added. During a visit to the hospital

Rain: Major rivers swell again

Monsoon rain across the country raised water levels in most points of the major rivers in all the four basins yesterday and officials feared that the flood situation in central districts may deteriorate again. report agencies.

Flood Forecasting and Warning Centre said the Brahmaputra-Jamuna and the Padma recorded rise at all but one point. The rivers of Meghna basin also rose in most points in Greater Sylhet. The rivers in the southeastern hill basin, however, saw both rise and fall at different points. The forecast said the flood

situation in the Ganges basin, including the districts along the Padma river, is likely to deteriorate 'slightly' today.

It said Brahmaputra-Jamuna would continue to rise in downstream areas including at the Aricha point. The situation in the upper part of the Meghna basin in Greater Sylhet may remain static but the situation is likely to improve a little in areas from Bhairab Bazar to downstream.

Drug dealers kill boy, now threaten mother

A vicious gang of drug dealers who had beaten to death a 15-year-old shoe factory worker on July 23 in the city's Siddique Bazar area for his alleged refusal to work as a 'carrier', are now threatening the boy's mother for filing a case against them.

The boys mother, Anwara Begum, filed a murder case with the CMM's court yesterday after Kotwali thana refused to accept the case.

The gang, allegedly led by Ripon and Suruj, both residents of Alubazar at Haji Osman Ghani Road, is well known to Kotwali police which had refused to accept the murder case. Anwara Begum told some newsmen who visited her at her house yesterday. The widow said her only

child, Abdul Kuddus, who had never seen his father who died when she was eight month's pregnant, was beaten by the drug dealers, tying him to a lightpost on July 23 morning when he was on way to the shoe factory at Siddique Bazar.
