



Taliban capture another town

KABUL, Aug 11: The Taliban militia captured another strategic town in northern Afghanistan today, continuing advances following the capture of the biggest city in the north. reports AP.

The Taliban captured Talogan, located some 250 kilometers north of Kabul, after a brief battle, said spokesman Abdul Hay Muttayn from Taliban military headquarters in the southern city of Kandahar. Opposition spokesman Zahbet Saly confirmed the city had fallen, saying his forces retreated about 20 kilometers east.

The fighting is over now and Taliban fully controls the city," he said. Taloqan is the capital of Takhar province, a stronghold of powerful anti-Taliban commander Ahmed Shah Masood

The Taliban said their early morning assault on Talogan easily smashed the opposition's front line. But opposition spokesman Saly said the fighting raged all night and casualties were high on both sides.

Shibir-BCL clashes leave 8 hurt at IU

KUSHTIA, Aug 11: A series of clashes between Pro-Awami League Chhatra League and Islami Chhatra Shibir on the Islamic University campus today left at least eight people injured reports UNB.

Police said the clash erupted in the morning when a Shibir activist Syed Ahmed, was assaulted allegedly by BCL men as he tried to enter the campus during a strike called by the Chhatra League.

The BCL today enforced a two-day strike at the university protesting what they said the killing of BCL Sports Secretary Khurshid Harun Mamun by Shibir men. They alleged that Shibir activists killed Mamun by throwing him out from a running bus.

As the news of attack on Syed spread across the area, the Shibir supporters streamed out on the streets and locked in clashes at Sheikhpara Bazar and near the main gate of the campus at about 2:30 pm.

pm when a gang of five armed men came unsuspiciously, entered the small office room of M/S Ree-Ad Enterprise, distributor of Arong dairy products. They tied up the four inmates of the office and then ran away with the cash and goods in about half an hour, witnesses

Just across the road, armed police were guarding the residence of Finance Minister S A M S Kibria.

Four persons, including the owner of the business Zahid Hasan Rana, were sitting inside the room at that time. The strangers asked the four that they were looking for one Shahidul, police added.

The robbers took away Tk 1,41,800 an a wrist watch worth about Tk 4,000 at gunpoint and left the office after the half-anhour operation.

During the clashes, both the groups chased each other, exploded crackers and ransacked several vehicles. Shibir activist Hasanul Banna alias Chapal and six passers-by were injured in the clash.

Of the injured, Syed Ahmed was admitted to the university medical centre while Banna to Jhenidah hospital.

A heavy contingent of police was deployed on the campus and its adjacent areas as tension was running high there. Meanwhile, classes and

university could not be held today due to the BCL-called strike. Later in the afternoon, Shibir held a press conference and denied the allegation that they killed Mamun. They called for forming an enquiry committee to probe the incident.

But due to technical problems, it started supplying 60 mmcfd from June 8.

The performance of the Sangu system, which includes four operational wells, a 48-km

plant at Chillimpur, remains satisfactory. But Petrobangla sources said that the supply was interrupted several times in the first month due to technical problems. During the month of June, Sangu lost about 48 hours of production because of such problems.

While admitting that there were some problems, Richard Heaton said that Sangu lost much less than 48 production-While Cairn got the credit for

completing development of the

faced a major confrontation from Petrobangla over an inflated budget. When Cairn started developing Sangu in early 1996, the government approved a budget of 178 million dollars submitted by the British company. The budget was revised three times

before the final approval. In late 1997, Cairn came back to Petrobangla with a revised budget of 264 million dollars. The budget was revised as Cairn had changed the configuration of the Chillimpur Gas Processing Plant, the pipeline and other systems. After an initial argument with Petrobangla over some "false expenditures", Cairn again revised the budget and came back with an outline of 247 million

dollars.

Ever since, Cairn remained

firm on its revised budget saying that its original budget was prepared on 'wrong assessment'. On the other hand, Petrobangla is not showing much interest to conduct further negotiation over the issue. The budget hike, when ap-

proved, will have a negative impact on the profitability of Bangladesh's share of gas as Cairn would repatriate the full amount in seven years from gas sales to the government. Petrobangla sources further said that Cairn could have had

easily kept the budget limited

within 178 million dollars if it

had not changed the pipeline

and gas processing plant configurations. "Cairn did not even discuss these issues with Petrobangla. The pipeline they have installed now has a capacity to supply 500 mmcfd gas and the processing plant can handle

The approved budget aimed at setting up of pipeline and processing plant having capacities to handle at least 100 mmcfd less gas.

"Typically, a partner does not undertake the task of a contractor. In Sangu. Brown and Roots — a company many times bigger than Cairn — was the contractor for setting up the pipeline, platform and the processing plant. As a result, Brown and Roots is controlling every aspect of the gasfield although Cairn is the operator." said a source.

"In such situations, we have reasons to believe that Cairn is not in control of the budget," the source noted. Richard Heaton, however,

denies that Brown and Roots is controlling the gasfield. "It will not impose over-expenditure on the project. Because it is not profitable for it. The increase of budget means lesser profit for Cairn and its partners. Therefore, the question does not arise that Brown and Roots imposed the budget hike."
