

Rain mars **Boston Cup** matches

BOSTON, Massachusetts, Aug 13: Austrian seventh-seed Barbara Schett beat Romania's Catalina Cristea 6-0, 7-5 in the only match completed here Wednesday at the 164,250-dollar WTA Boston Cup, reports

Rain wiped out play after shortening Tuesday's session. allowing only the first secondround match to be concluded.

NEW DELHI, Aug 13: Batting sensation Sachin Tendulkar has been bestowed with the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award, the highest recognition for achievement in sports in India,

for the year 1997, reports PTI. Veteran athletics coach Joginder Sigh Saini has been named for the prestigious Dhronacharya award and 21 sportspersons, including crick-eters Ajay Jadeja and Saurav Ganguli have been selected for the Arjuna award for 1997, it was officially announced here on Wednesday.

The President will give away the awards at a special function to be held at the Rashtrapathi Bhavan on August 29.

The 25-year-old Tendulkar who has installed himself as the world's best batsman will receive a cheque for Rs one lakh, a scroll of honour and a

Tendulkar, who is already the joint record holder for most number of one-day centuries and became the second youngest India captain in 1996, is the fifth recipient of the award instituted in 1991-92.

Chess maestro Viswanathan Anand was the first awardee followed by former world billiards champion Geet Sethi ('92-93), sailors Homid Motivala and Pushpendra K Garg ('93-94). top woman weightlifter Karam Malleswari ('94-95) and tennis star Leander Paes ('96-97).

Joginder Singh Saini is the 13th recipient of the coveted award which carries a pursue of Rs 75,000, Dhronacharya's statuette and a scroll.




