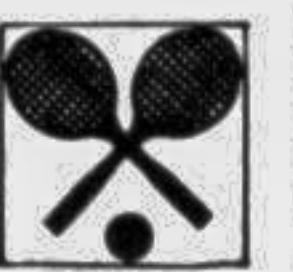

Sugiyama, who upset former world number one Steffi Graf last week at the Toshiba Classic in San Diego, said the Spaniard's speed was a determining factor.

Seles, seeded fourth, needed 49 minutes to eliminate Paulus in the 450,000 dollar tournament.

No 5 seed Nathalie Tauziat of France defeated countrywoman and doubles partner Alexandra Fusai 6-3, 6-3.

Temperatures on court during the Seles-Paulus match reached the mid-90s, which apparently helped Seles. She lost only eight points on her serve in the match.

"My back is a lot better. The heat today helped," Seles said. "I played solid tennis. With Barbara, it's hard to know what she'll do because she hits heavy top spin from either side of the court."

Seles received treatment after the Toshiba Tennis Classic last week where she lost in the semifinals to eventual winner Lindsay Davenport.

Australia happy with preparations

MELBOURNE, Aug 13: Australia's cricketers are expecting a smooth tour of Pakistan next month following a pre-tour scouting mission by team officials, reports AFP.

Team manager Steve Bernard and Australian Cricket Board operations manager Richard Watson have returned after inspecting facilities for the Pakistan itinerary ahead of the tour, which begins on September 23.

The Australians have been monitoring developments in Pakistan since nuclear tests there in May in response to tests by India.

The team was particularly concerned about the venue for the second Test, the troubled northern city of Peshawar from October 15-18. But that, like the other venues, has been given the all-clear.

"It should be a well run tour," Bernard said here today. Bernard also said the Australian team's travel arrangements had been finalised, unlike in India where the team's itinerary constantly changed on their tour there earlier this year.

"We have one bus trip while we are there, but all the rest will be by plane and the Pakistan Cricket Board have been very cooperative," Bernard said.

All the grounds and accommodation were also up to scratch including Peshawar where we don't envisage any problems.

Australia's first tour of Pakistan since 1994 begins on September 23, with the first warm-up match beginning two days later in Rawalpindi.

The team will play three Tests before travelling to Bangladesh for what is being billed as a Mini World Cup.

Australia will then return to Pakistan for three one-day internationals before arriving home just over a week before the start of the first Ashes Test against rejuvenated England in Brisbane on November 20.

Sampras sails, Agassi fails



MASON, Ohio, Aug 13: Pete Sampras marked his 27th birthday with an easy victory, but old friend and rival Andre Agassi could not share in the fun, falling in a third-set tiebreaker Wednesday at the ATP Championship, reports Reuters.

Top seed Sampras scored a fast 6-4, 6-2 win over 68th-ranked Martin Damm, while 10th-seeded Agassi, who returned to the top 10 rankings

this week for the first time in more than a year, fell to 44th-ranked Vince Spadea 6-2, 0-6, 7-6.

Agassi labelled his conqueror a "tour journeyman" and said he was embarrassed, but it was Spadea who came up biggest in the later stages of the match.

"It's not an insult, it's a matter of fact," said Agassi, noting that the 24-year-old Spadea just cracked the top 50 last month. "You're still pretty good. There's only 50 people better than you."

"It doesn't speak for his potential, just his results."

Spadea preferred not to get into the issue of the "journeyman" tag Agassi put on him. "I'm not a confrontational kind of person," said Spadea, after niching only his third win ever over a top 10 player.

While nine of the top 10 players in the world came to the ATP Championship this week, nine of the 16 seeds have already departed by the end of the second round.

Joining Agassi on the sidelines Wednesday were Spanish trio Carlos Moya, the fourth seed, ninth-seeded Alex Corretja and 12th-seeded Albert Costa.

The Agassi and Spadea match was a strange one hour, 45 minute meeting with the first two sets being completely lopsided and the third set turning into a nailbiter.

Spadea was toying with Agassi in the first set, leading 4-1 and even having two points for 5-1.

In the second set, Agassi lost only three points in three service games as he won all six games to level the match.

Agassi, who titles in Washington DC and Los Angeles this summer, looked on his way to victory when he broke Spadea for a 5-4 lead in the final set.

Spadea slammed his racket to the ground after losing his serve in the ninth game and went on to break Agassi back in the 10th game.

"I played a pretty lose game and he stayed solid from there on in — it was embarrassing," Agassi said. "I really played not a good breaker."

Sampras, who won a fifth Wimbledon title last month, said he planned a quiet birthday celebration with his actress girlfriend Kimberly Williams, a dinner out and maybe a little dessert for a treat.

He could give himself a substantial gift at the end of the tournament should he advance to the final match. He needs to either win this tournament or reach the final with enough bonus points to recapture the number one ranking he lost this week to Marcelo Rios.

A unique English season awaits

English soccer has a different look for the new season kicking off this weekend but the same names are likely to come out at the top.

Defending champions Arsenal, runner-up Manchester United, third-place Liverpool and fourth-place Chelsea are likely to fill the top four places again when he season ends in May.

But in which order? If last weekend's Charity Shield is a guide, Arsenal still appear to have the measure of United after a 3-0 victory at Wembley. The Gunners beat the Reds at home and away last season as they wiped out United's 12-point lead to clinch the title.

Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger has barely made a change to his lineup, only adding unheralded David Grounion to the growing list of French players on his roster.

But Wenger did sell Wright to West Ham on the basis that, the 34-year-old striker — Arsenal's all-time leading scorer — wouldn't have been guaranteed a starting place because of the form of Dutch World Cup star Dennis Bergkamp and French forward Nicolas Anelka.

Manchester United Manager Alex Ferguson was annoyed at seeing the league title slip away last season after four triumphs in five years but was even more furious that his team tumbled out of the Champions Cup at the quarterfinal stage.

So Ferguson spent 10 million pounds (16.5 million dollars) on Dutch World Cup player Jaap Stam, a world record for a defender, and added Swedish winger Jesper Blomqvist.

But Ferguson was turned down by AC Milan's Patrick Kluijver and is still chasing Aston Villa's Tobagan striker Dwight Yorke, priced by the Birmingham club at 16 million pounds (25.4 million dollars).

Liverpool's biggest and most surprising recruit was former French national team coach Gerard Houllier. The Merseyside club, whose last of a record 18 league titles was back in 1990, named Houllier to work alongside current manager Roy Evans, who came in for criticism last season.

With 18-year-old striker Michael Owen still getting rave reviews for his standout World Cup performances, Liverpool have the potential to win the title. But the Anfield club has spent several seasons promising much but, achieving little.

Cup Winners' Cup holders Chelsea had another busy summer in the transfer market and has added some more big names to their already powerful roster. Danish striker Brian Laudrup, French World Cup star Desailly, Spanish defender Alberto Ferrer and Italian striker Pierluigi Casiraghi have joined the Blues, and Denis Wise might find himself the only Englishman on the team.

Newcastle, a major flop last season after finishing runners-up the previous two, doesn't look any stronger despite the arrival of French World Cup player Stephane Guivarch. Many critics say the fans may lose patience with manager Kenny Dalglish if the club doesn't make the top six, especially since the Magpies went close to relegation last season.

The same applies to Everton and Tottenham, two big clubs which are expected to be in the top six instead of the bottom six.

Everton now have experi-

enced former Glasgow Rangers manager Walter Smith at the helm and he has recruited John Collins from Monaco. But Spurs, still with Christian Gross in charge, has been very quiet in the transfer market.

The surprise of the season could be West Ham.

The arrival of Wright, Liverpool's Neil Ruddock and Chilean World Cup defender Javier Margas has strengthened a team which performed well last term to finish eighth under Harry Redknapp.

Leeds manager George Graham has barely altered his squad which looks unlikely to improve on last season's fifth-place finish, although former England international winger Lee Sharpe is back after virtually a year out with injury.

Blackburn manager Roy Hodgson has to justify spending 7 million pounds (11.5 million) on Kevin Davies despite the striker's spectacular goals for Southampton last term, and will do well to repeat last season's sixth place.

Aston Villa finished in such good form it gained a UEFA Cup place. Although Yugoslav striker Savo Milosevic and Irish defender Steve Staunton have gone, Villa places much faith in its young signing from

Bolton, Andy Thompson, and John Gregory's team is capable of repeating last season's seventh place.

Derby County, under veteran Jim Smith, and Leicester, guided by one of the most promising managers in the game, Martin O'Neill, can't afford to be among the big spenders and have made few changes. Both are likely to repeat their mid-standings positions, although Derby's elusive and unpredictable Costa Rican forward Paolo Wanchope could push his team close to a top-six place while Leicester may struggle to hang on to talented striker Emile Heskey.

Coventry, also expected to be among last season's strugglers, played impressively and wound up 11th under Gordon Strachan. It has added talented Croatia defender Robert Jarni to the squad while letting go of Romanian striker Viorel Moldovan.

Of the newcomers, division one Nottingham Forest will struggle to survive, especially if it winds up playing without its 58-goal strike partnership of Kevin Campbell and Pierre van Hooydonk.

Manager Dave Bassett sold 24-year-old Campbell to Turkish club Trabzonspor and that prompted 34-goal Van Hooydonk to refuse to play for the club.

Big-spending Middlesbrough flopped in its last promotion to the top flight and there will be huge pressure on manager Bryan Robson not to repeat the club's 1996-97 disaster. Gascoigne, playing Premier League soccer for the first time since 1991, will hog the spotlight especially after missing a World Cup place on fitness grounds.

The third promoted club, Charlton, is already a strong favourite to go back down. The south London team gained its Premier League place through the playoffs and, like Barnsley last season, will struggle to restrict the powerhouse teams to less than three or four goals.

Other teams likely to be fighting relegation are Sheffield Wednesday, even with highly-rated former Barnsley manager Danny Wilson in charge; Southampton, despite hiring experienced Mark Hughes and Stuart Ripley, and cash-strapped Wimbledon, which has virtually the same roster as last season.

Dumitrescu moves back to Steaua

BUCHAREST, Aug 13 (Reuters/Internet): Romanian forward Ilie Dumitrescu returned to Steaua Bucharest on Wednesday after being released by his Mexican club Atlante.

Dumitrescu, 29, who scored 71 goals in 163 appearances for Steaua in his first spell with the club between 1988 and 1994, will be eligible for the second leg of the European Cup second round tie against Panathinaikos if his registration is completed by Friday's deadline.

Dumitrescu, who has also played for FC Olt, Tottenham Hotspur, Sevilla and West Ham will link up with fellow veterans Miodrag Belodedici and Marius Lacatus at Steaua.

Edmundo certain of Nike foul play!



SAO PAULO, Aug 13: Voicing what many Brazilians already believe, midfielder Edmundo says it was a contract between the Brazilian confederation and Nike that resulted in Ronaldo playing in the World Cup final despite illness, reports AP.

"The Nike business is true," Edmundo said in a taped interview published by Brazilian

newspapers on Wednesday. "There's a contract that (says) Ronaldo must play every game for the full 90 minutes."

Speculation about Ronaldo's appearance and performance has raged since the final whistle on July 12 in Saint-Denis, France, where the French ran over Brazil 3-0 to win the World Cup title.

The mystery started when Edmundo appeared in the starting lineup instead of Ronaldo,

who was listed among the substitutes, issued more than an hour before kickoff. Then, 15 minutes later, just as inexplicably, a new starting lineup was issued with Ronaldo instead of Edmundo.

An uninspired performance led to questions and revelations in post-game interviews that Ronaldo had vomited earlier in the day but was cleared by doctors to play.

Coach Mario Zagallo admitted, "Ronaldo shouldn't have played" but then erupted into a tirade when someone questioned why he re-inserted the 22-year-old striker into the starting 11.

At the time, Zagallo said he decided to start Ronaldo to restore the confidence of the squad.

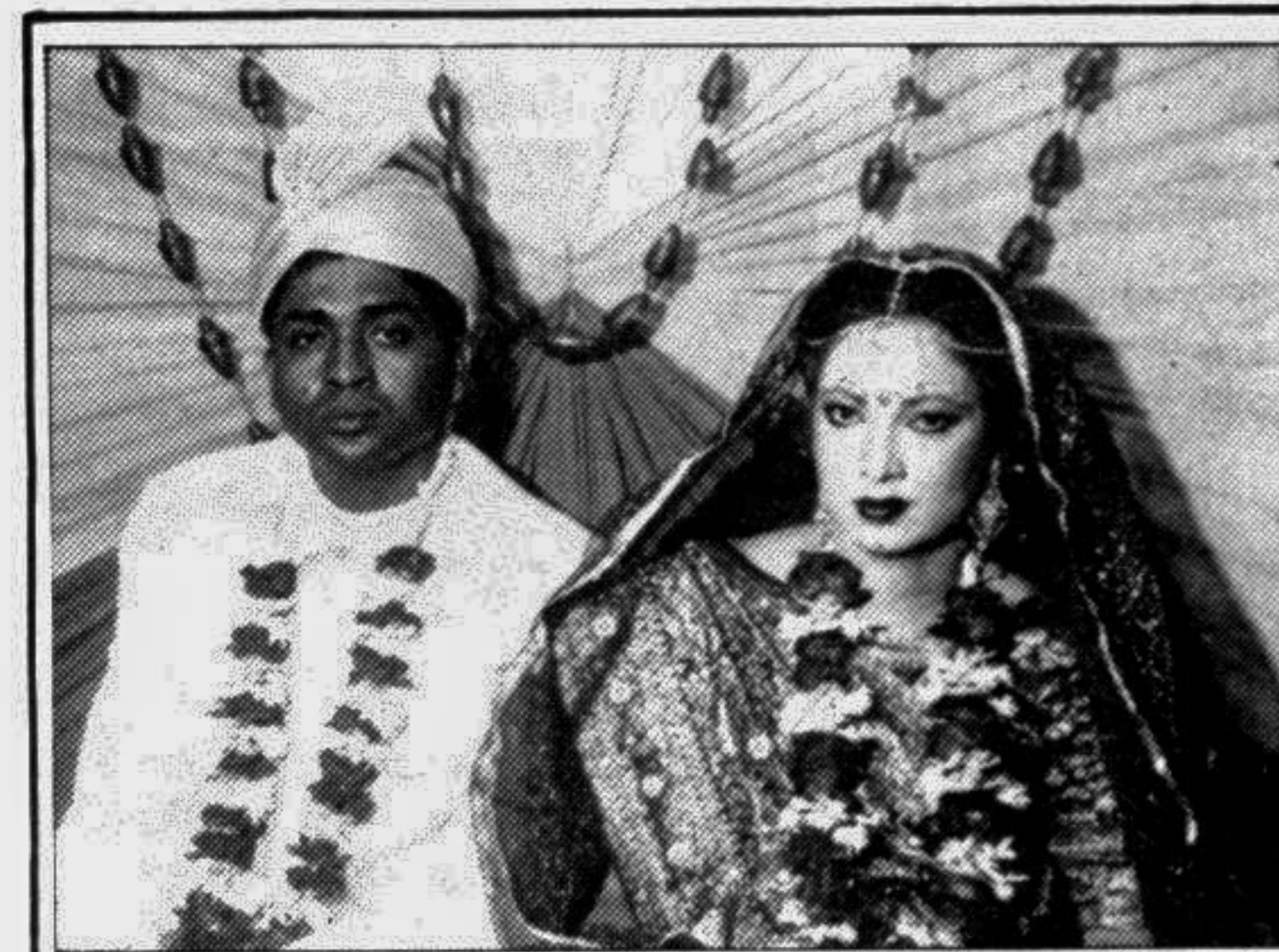
Ronaldo later said he had gone into convulsions before the game, and rumours flew that he played under orders from above.

US sportswear maker Nike, which paid more than \$200 million to the CBF in 1996 as part of a 10-year sponsorship deal, became an obvious target of the speculation.

During the week preceding the start of the World Cup, some players groused at having to appear at a Nike promotional event in Paris, saying they were ordered by Nike to break off practice to attend.

But a Nike official said the event was scheduled months before the team's arrival and that it did not order training to be cut short.

Nike again was forced to deny the new rumours, with an official quoted in Wednesday's reports as saying it would be "madness" to interfere in such a situation.
