

LONDON, Aug 14: England coach Glenn Hoddle has been 'unprofessional' for criticising England players and Manchester United manager Alex Ferguson in his controversial new book, according to players' union boss Gordon Taylor, reports AFP.

Hoddle has revealed behindthe-scenes details of how Paul Gascoigne lost control after being told he was being left out of the World Cup squad.

And he has also been critical

of Teddy Sheringham, Chris Sutton and Ferguson in the book which has been serialised in The Sun, Britain's best-selling national newspaper.

Brazil enter US Women's Cup soccer

CHICAGO, Aug 14: South American champions Brazil will join Russia, Mexico and the host United States in next month's exhibition US Women's Cup, the last major women's soccer event in America before

Although the Olympic champions United States plans two foreign tours and 14 international exhibitions in 1999 before the June 19-July 10 World Championship, this will be its last event in a World Cup format prior to the quadrennial tourney.

By virtue of winning the South American championship in March, Brazil already has qualified for the 16-nation World Cup field while Mexico enter CONCACAF qualifying later this month.

Russia are in second place in their European group, and al-ready have assured themselves of at least entering the continent's playoffs for a World Cup

The four European group winners qualify automatically for the World Cup while the four runners-up enter two-leg playoffs to determine two others.

on Mexico on Sept. 12 in Foxboro, Mass, prior to the Major League Soccer contest between new England and Columbus, to open the tournament.



a good hand with excellent support in Spades and a slam interest. Note

that a mere 4 Spade bid by South would have been passed, if North held a minimum hand. A good contract of 6 Spades was reached

THE PLAY

East found the killing lead of a Heart. The declarer was faced with possible losers of a Heart, and a trump. He went up with the Ace of Heart and examined the options. He could take the Spade finesse, and if it worked, he could throw the Heart loser on the third Diamond, or he could finesse J of Clubs, and if it worked, he could do the same on the King of Clubs. But if the finesses failed, his slam would go down the drain. He therefore chose the third option which was to play the Diamond suit to slap a Heart on the third Diamond. In order to play a bit safe, he played the Ace of trump in the hope that the Queen of Spade might be singleton. When this did not happen he played the Diamond suit which enabled him to throw his Heart loser as the Diamond suit broke perfectly. A good-bid contract well played.


