Greatbatch hangs up his bat

WELLINGTON, Aug 14: Former Test batsman Mark Greatbatch announced Friday his retirement from all first-class cricket, reports AP.

Lefthander Greatbatch played 41 Tests and 84 one-day internationals from 1988 until 1996. He hit three Test hundreds, one of them on his debut against England at Eden park in Auckland

Another century came in a memorable 146 over almost 11 hours to save a Test against Australia at Perth in 1989.

Greatbatch scored 2,021 runs

in tests at an average of 30.62. His big-hitting exploits were one of the enduring highlights of the 1992 World Cup in Australia and New Zealand. He scored 2,206 one-day runs, with two centuries, at 28.28.

In 169 first-class matches, Greatbatch made 9,856 runs at 38.05, with a highest score of 202 not out.

Greatbatch is a fulltime employee of the Central Districts Cricket Association, where he is director of coaching and development.

Expressing surprise at news reports from Australia naming some leading players in the Indian squad. Lele made it clear to PTI that it was an official championship to be conducted by the Australian Cricket Board (ACB) and only the BCCI had the right to pick the national team. "The team is yet to be cho-

He added thus refuting news reports from Perth that the Indians were first to name their team for the tournament to be played at Perth's WACA ground.

The reports had said that Australian cricket appears set to be haunted by Sachin Tendulkar again with the Indian batting maestro confirmed to play in the Super Eights championship in a high-quality In-dian team also including skipper Mohammad Azharuddin. leg spin ace Anil Kumble and pace spearhead Javagal Sri-

The reports had also said that Super Max 8s refer to the new rules created specifically for the tournament, which will feature eight of the Test playing nations.

Khaled Mahmud and Naimur Rahman should bat lower down the batting order as they are doing now and they add depth to the Bangladesh batting. Naimur Rahman seems to be a matured player now and he can bowl a few overs of off-spin. Khaled Mahmud is a good allrounder and his performance has been good against different opposi-tions. Minhajul Abedin and Faruque Ahmed are two veteran players and they have ample experience. But so far Minhajul Abedin has not played a major part in any international match for Bangladesh. Being the seniormost player of the side a lot is expected from him.

Mohammad Rafique's performance in the international level has been good. He can become a tight bowler if he concentrates more on his line and length.

The imminent tournaments for Bangladesh would be the Commonwealth Games in September, 1998 where they are placed in Group C. Bangladesh would play against South Africa A and Zimbabwe A and Barbados. Dhaka would host the seventh Asia Cup cricket.

Sometimes there is a lack of commitment in the Bangladeshi players. Very recently in the tri-nation tournament Bangladesh's loss to Kenya in the second encounter between the two sides revealed it. There is also dearth of determination and positive atti-



In the latest bizarre chapter of a saga that began when Tyson bit Evander Holyfield's ears 13 months ago, Tyson's advisers on Thursday abruptly withdrew his application for a New Jersey boxing license.

They then turned to the state that banned him, appealing for Tyson's return to the ring.

"Maybe he came back to his senses and decided the best way to go about this was to come back to the state that revoked his license," said Dr Elias Ghanem, chairman of the Nevada Athletic Commission. "We have a very fair commission. And we make decisions on the spot. We vote on it on the spot and we don't delay our de-

The move came on the eve of a meeting of the New Jersey Athletic Control Board, which two weeks earlier listened as the former heavyweight champ asked for his license back - but also got angry and cursed in front of the regulators.

"We were surprised to get it today, but we will set up a hearing and it will be a fair and impartial hearing," said Marc Ratner, executive director of the Nevada Athletic Commission.

Ghanem said Tyson was making the right move in returning to the state regulators who revoked his license.

"It wasn't a smart move for him in the beginning," Ghanem said, referring to the New Jersey application. Nevada was taken by sur-

prise when Tyson applied last month in New Jersey. State boxing regulators had expected all along that he would reapply for his license in Nevada after a mandatory one-year wait. Asking New Jersey for the li-

cense was seen as a calculated gamble by Finkel. But many in boxing criticised the move and said that if states did not respect each other's decisions that a federal commission might be formed to regulate the sport.
