Grandpa Pele!

BRASILIA, Aug 16: Pele, widely acclaimed as the world's greatest soccer player ever and hailed by some as the athlete of the century, won a new title on Friday — Granddad, reports Reuters.

Pele's first grandchild, a boy, was born in the Brazilian city of Santos, news reports said.

It was not immediately known if the soccer legend would be rushing to see the baby.

The mother of the child, Sandra Regina Arantes Do Nascimento, won a five-year legal battle in 1996 to prove she was the biological daughter of Pele, whose full name is Edson Arantes Do Nascimento.

Pele, now 57, previously denied he was Sandra's father but a court ruled that and evidence showed otherwise.

Earlier this year, Sandra published a book, 'The Daughter The King Did Not Want' recounting the story of how her mother, a maid, had a love affair with Pele while he was a young player with local soccer club Santos.

The secret traumas of Desailly

Perhaps, it is because he has already lost so much that was valuable in his life that Marcel Desailly likes winning so much.

The casual listener who heard him admit his fervently held belief that 'the manner in which you win is unimportant — victory is everything' would probably dismiss this as some times naughty Frenchman as just another footballer whose sensibilities extend no further than the goal line or the financial bottom line.

In fact, Desailly is an emotional, intellectual survivor who has already dealt with enough trauma to keep a Haley Street psychiatrist in expensive holidays, nice leather couches and sports cars for life.

Separated from his father in Africa aged only four, Desailly was not reunited until he was 18, by which time, his half-brother, Seth Odonkor, had already died in a car accident on the road between Nantes and St Nazaire. Seth, who was six years older than Marcel, was part of the Nantes squad which won the French championship in 1983 but died the following year at the age of 22 before he could fulfil his great potential.

To this day Desailly, still, oddly, refers to his stepfather as 'Monsieur Desailly' and cannot even talk to his mother or his other brother about Seth's death in the way that he can cry and seek solace with former Marseille teammate Didier Deschamps, who has shared an identical loss.

Despite having adopted France as his native country, Desailly is still most comfortable in Accra where he was born. He holidays in Ghana and feels bitterness for the government of that country which turfed his family, at gunpoint out of the home his mother bought with Seth's life insurance money.

Although he is far from being unaffected by the ravages of these debilitating experiences it remains astonishing that Chelsea's 30-year-old import is a rounded, same — never mind

successful — individual. What he regrets is that he and his real father will never be more than people who know each other, that he and Seth never shared the joy of being professional footballers together and that his mother still weeps daily for the home which was a memorial to her dead son — but which was simply stolen from her.

Just like Emmanuel Petit and Deschamps, the World Cup was a time when the wounds were even more raw than usual but Desailly explains that his fear of failure was dulled by the close spiritual connection he felt with both Seth and his stepfather. 'I fight for Seth and my father. I call him Monsieur Desailly'.

'I'm talking about helping people and not about power because power is dangerous and it scares me... look at people like Silvio Berlusconi and Bernard Tapie.

'I have so much affection for Africa. The idea of sharing is so much stronger even if it doesn't exclude jealousy. But, there, all the doors lie open and an old person is not condemned to live out their life watching television.

'In Ghana there is more life, more peace — life is hard but happier and I would love to rediscover that element of life.'

Anyone who watched the intense concentration and massive drive to win which made Desailly the best defender in the World Cup might conclude that he doesn't expect or even desire to be around for the next one in four years' time. This spell at Chelsea will put the final seal on financial security for not only him but his immediate family including his brother, sister and mother.

His prevarication before signing at Stamford Bridge centred around the fact that he felt he could play for two, perhaps three years at Real Madrid and for two or three more in

England. But he appears content to play out his career for his second-choice nation and division. Both Marcel and his wife Virginia believe that some portion of their future should be devoted to good works — probably in Africa rather than France.

Hopefully, that return to his mother country will be a more fulfilling experience than in 1986 when he met his natural father for the first time in 14 years.

'My mother took me back because I had to choose my nationality but there was no problem. I love France,' he states with conviction.

'I met my real father and I think it was harder for him than me. He probably expected to give advice to the young boy who had left for France, instead he found that the boy had become a man without his help.

'I never felt that I lacked a father because I had one in Monsieur Desailly even though I always knew he wasn't my real father.'

Family substitutes come in all shapes and sizes depending on need and it is Juventus and France midfielder Didier Deschamps who has become Desailly's replacement brother.

Close to a friendship which began when he was 15, and because Deschamps also lost his brother at a tragically young age, the French captain has been the footballing sibling Desailly still yearns for.

Through the national team you experience real popularity but the emotions of the fans evaded me during the World Cup because I didn't play in the same World Cup as the one they enjoyed.

'When we won or even scored a goal, complete strangers embraced each other and that was lovely. If I could have enjoyed that then the summer would have been complete — perfection.'

How typical of Marcel Desailly. He is always in search of something better always in search of perfection.

UNDATED: Aug 16(AFP/Reuters/AP): England midfielder David Beckham silenced the 'boo-boys' by striking a lost gas equaliser as Manchester United came from two goals down to snatch a 2-2 draw against Leicester in the English Premiership while there were impressive wins for Monaco in France and favourites Bayern Munich in the German Bundesliga on Saturday.

ENGLAND: Beckham, who was jeered by the visiting supporters every time he touched the ball, curled in a 25-yard free kick three minutes into stoppage time to save United from an embarrassing home defeat on the opening day of the Premiership season.

Beckham has been the subject of a hate campaign since he was sent off against Argentina in the World Cup with many fans blaming him for England's exit.

But the 23-year-old, who signed a new five-year contract with the Old Trafford club on Friday, responded to the taunts with an inspirational display, setting up United's first in the 79th minute for Teddy Sheringham before sealing a dramatic draw at the death.

United, bidding to bring back the title they won for four years out of five before Arsenal's triumph last season, were hopelessly off form early on and Leicester took full advantage to take a 2-0 lead through Emile Heskey and Tony Cottee.

United manager Alex Ferguson admitted his side had been lucky. 'I think it was a good result for us although whether we deserved a draw or not is debatable,' he said. 'It took us 30 minutes to get going but they defended absolutely fantastically.'

Elsewhere, Chelsea, parading 12 million pounds (20 million dollars) of new foreign talent, crashed 2-1 at Coventry, who stormed into a two-goal lead inside 15 minutes with goals from Dion Dublin and Darren Huckerby.

Italian international Pierluigi Casiraghi, World Cup winner Marcel Desailly and Albert Ferrer were all included in the starting line-up, though there was no place for Brian Laudrup, who was ruled out with a back injury.

Uruguayan Gustavo Poyet pulled one back for the Londoners but they could not manage an equaliser against a well-organised and vibrant home side.

Coventry boss Gordon Strachan put the victory down to hard work and team spirit. 'We didn't catch them cold,' said Strachan. 'We caught them because we had worked hard at the training ground every afternoon of the week.'
