13,548 hectares come under jute cultivation in Netrakona

NETRAKONA, Aug 17: A total of 13,548 hectares of land have been brought under jute cultivation in the ten thanas of Netrakona district in the current season, reports BSS.

of monsoon. Hence, the demand for chemical fertiliser has increased, but supply of Urea, TSP and SSP is not enough to meet the growing

According to Agriculture Extension Department, about 25,000 hectares of land will be brought under the transplanted aman cultivation in the ongoing season.

The district administration received a negligible quantity of Urea for distribution among the farmers in 10 thanas, local farmers said.

The Security Council raised the amount last February to 5.2 billion dollars, although Iraq said it would be able to export only about four billion dollars worth of oil in the period.

The dollar was near its session lows against the mark at Europe mid-session, giving up the ground it gained earlier on Russia's decision to changed its foreign exchange policy. While prospects of turmoil in the Russian markets were likely to bolster the dollar for now, its direction would be determined by how Moscow followed up what was in effect, a rouble devaluation, analysts said. The dollar was trading at 1.7982/87 marks in late afternoon Europe, off the five week high it reached earlier and almost un-

changed from levels seen in late European trade on Friday.

The Russian government and central bank said it was impractical to keep the rouble corridor and said they would let the mar-kets determine the rate. It also declared a 90-day moratorium on repaying foreign debts. Traders were saying that while Germany had the most exposure on Russia, the exposure itself was not so

The Japanese yen was on the backburner, with traders saying Russia was diverting the market's attention from the woes of Japan's depressed economy. While the fear of central bank intervention was preventing dollar bulls from taking dollar/yen toward last week's eight-year high, analysts said it would not be long before the yen's downtrend resumed.

The pound sterling fell further dipping below the eight-month low of 1.6100. At 1830 local time, USD traded against major currencies at 1.7980/85 DEM, 146.25/30 YEN, 1.5050/55 SFR, 6.0285/95 FRF
