#### Anwar blasts harsh conditions on ailing economies

KUALA LUMPUR, Aug 18: Malaysian Finance Minister Anwar Ibrahim hit out at global institutions. accused them of imposing harsh conditions on ailing economies and practising double standards, reports AFP.

International financial institutions, Anwar said, should not turn their economic prescriptions, such as liberalisation and privatisation, into a "new theology" crisis-hit nations must implement at all

The "complexities and peculiarities" of each country must be considered. Anwar said in his opening remarks at a Muslim forum here, according to Bernama news agency.

He also took exception to the pace at which the International Monetary Fund (IMF) had put together bailout packages for various troubled economies, calling it an example of double standards.

"Disbursement (of aid) to Mexico was fast, to Russia it was very efficient, but negotiations with Indonesia had gone on for too long and had been the most rigid and toughest," said Anwar, who is also Deputy Premier.

The IMF, he added, was too slow in disbursing its rescue package to Indonesia at a time when the country badly needed assistance to alleviate the plight of its poor and unemployed with its economy in a deep slump.

### HK finds itself on front line of Asian crisis

HONG KONG, Aug 18: Hong Kong found itself on the front line of the Asian crisis last week when markets slumped on growing doubts that China's newest city can stomach the pain that goes with supporting its pegged currency, reports

Speculators spent billions of dollars shorting the Hong Kong currency, sending the Hang Seng Stock index into a tailspin and prompting fighting words from chief executive Tung Chee-

We are totally able and determined to keep the linked exchange rate system," Tung said on Friday. "People who think we will budge from this line are wrong.

But analysts said Hong Kong was in for a drubbing, despite Tung's valiant remarks. In fact, they say Tung is

largely to blame. "Hong Kong is still overpriced and badly run, and it puts pressure on this place. which is still being run for the property developers," Philip Moffitt, Executive Vice President at Tokai Asia, said last

week. Moffitt said publicly what most analysts are only prepared to say in private - that the Hong Kong government, has failed to "walk its talk" and act with credibility.

Some 991,755 shares and debentures valued at Tk 5.01 crore were transacted as against 585,690 shares worth Tk 3.44 crore of the previous day.



The introduction of Value Added Tax (VAT) on a range of goods has caused consternation and confusion among Tanzania's business community.

Tax officials concede that the situation is chaotic, and the government is planning to hold seminars throughout the country on the workings of the new tax.

"It is true that VAT has confused some of the traders and that is why TRA (Tanzania Revenue Authority) is busy charting out a strategy to educate the public," said Protas Mmanda, TRA manager for public rela-

tions and taxpayers education. VAT project manager Wilson Ndyetabula points out that VAT is an innovation and says it will take time for people to grasp the concept.

"We are going to launch a countrywide campaign to educate the masses on VAT," he promised.

All businesses on the mainland with a turnover of at least 20 million Tanzanian shillings a year are required to register and charge VAT a 20 per cent. Failure to register can incur a fine of up to TSh200,000 and a maximum of one year in jail. Certain goods and services are exempt, including health services, agricultural produce and farm inputs, petroleum products and some foodstuffs.

On the island of Zanzibar, the turnover threshold has been fixed at TSh 15 million. The tax did not immediately come into effect on the islands, another reflection of the poor state of relations between the two parts of the federation.

Amex notes on Tuesday's market The demand for the dollars in the inter-bank market continued to increase today largely due to the greater importer requirements. In response the USD/BDT rate moved upto the 46.97/47.00 level from yesterday's 46.97/46.99 range.

Inter-bank call money rates dropped a per cent today after banks consolidated their positions after yesterday's T-Bill payment of around 500 crore taka. Rates ranged between 6.5 and 7.5 per cent.

In the International markets, the dollar was steady near its session highs against the German mark at European midsession after traders were very vigilant about any developments in Russia, either economic or political.

Against the yen, the dollar was struggling near its session low but had calmed down after being driven down by Japanese Finance Minister Kiichi Miyazawa's comment that Japan was ready to intervene at any time. However, traders said that the bullish dollar/yen fundamentals were firmly intact. Traders said that they were keeping an eye on the Russian markets after the effective devaluation of the rouble on Monday.

President Boris Yeltsin dismissed his top economic advisor Alexander Livshits, while Intertax news agency said Yeltsin rejected resignation offers from Prime Minister Kiriyenko and central bank chief Dubinin. Analysts said that the markets could not yet afford to be

complacent about the Russian financial crisis. Apart from the Russian issue, analysts said that there were fundamental economic factors which should put a cap on dollar/mark. "There's the growth cycle, with the US economy clearly slowing down and the European economies gathering pace," said Julian Jessop, chief European economist at Nikko Europe." And there's the euro story with a growing number of investors becoming

comfortable with the euro and increasing their holdings of European assets. Also, evidence that Germany suffers less from the Asian crisis than the United States should dampen dollar/mark, analysts

The US Federal Open Market Committee meets for its regular policy making meeting tonight, but economists expects the Fed to leave interest rates unchanged when it announces its decision around 1815 GMT.

At 1800 local time, USD traded against major currencies at 1.7992/97 DEM, 145.74/79 YEN, 15087/92 SFR, 6.0314/34 FRF, and GBP 1.6139/44 USD.
