BCB EC meet's today

A new captain? What about Saad?

A meeting of the executive committee of the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) will be held at the Dhaka Stadium this afternoon from 2 pm.

Although, according to the notice issued by the board's general secretary Syed Ashraful Haque, the meeting has as many as 14 items on the agenda, it will mainly focus on Bangladesh's dismal performance in the recent tour of Ireland, England and Scotland.

The board will also approve around 14 standing committees and as many sub-committees for the forthcoming Wills In-ternational Cup where nine Test-playing nations will be competing. The knock-out tourney will be played at the Dhaka Stadium from October 24 to November 2.

Besides, the meeting will also announce the captaincy of the Bangladesh team for the 16th Commonwealth Games and discuss the status of Tanjeeb Ahsan Saad, who earlier this month tendered his resignation as the board's Executive Secretary.

Tendulkar's rendezvous with Sir Don

MUMBAI, Aug 19: Sachin Tendulkar has been provided with the unique and rare honour of meeting Sir Donald Bradman in Adelaide later this month on the occasion of the legendary Australian batsman's 90th birthday celebrations on August 27.

Confirming news reports that he has been extended an invitation to attend the celebration by the South Australian Cricket Association (SACA), the Indian maestro told PTI, "Yes, the invitation has gone to WorldTel. Sir Don Bradman is going to give me some of his time. It's a great honour.'

Television company World-Tel, owned by Indian-born and USA-based Mark Mascarenhas. handles the Indian star's business interests.

Sir Don, who has gone on record to state that Tendulkar's style of batting reminded him most of his own, would not attend his birthday celebrations, including a grand dinner for 1,300 guests, as the Australian sports icon wants to be with his family on the occasion, according to the reports.

The only hitch for Tendulkar, who returned home last night from the Arabian gulf after playing a series of matches for Mohammad Azharuddin XI against Rashid Latif XI, is the fact that the date clashes with the August 21-September 4 training camp at Chennai.

"WorldTel are going to ask for permission from the Indian board". Tendulkar said when queried whether he has sought the green signal from the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) to go to Adelaide midway through the camp.

KUALA LUMPUR, Aug 19: Red-carpet treatment for dignitaries at next month's Commonwealth Games will extend even to the toilets, reports AP. Inside the "VVIP Royal

Lounge" -- where Very, Very Important Persons will sit and watch the games - two state-ofthe-art toilets have been installed in the restrooms for use by the likes of Britain's Queen Elizabeth and Malaysia's King l uanku Ja aler.

Operated by a push-button control panel with an accompanying manual, the toilets feature options including a heated seat, wave spray, bidet and drier.

"Everything about these toilets is high-tech," the royal lounge's senior designer. Edward Ng. said Wednesday. He added that he had tested the Japanese-built toilets and found them to "work well."

The wave spray in the toilet bowl oscillates water to the user's right, left and bottom side. The bidet jets from a separate nozzle. And the cool-orhot-air drier eliminates the need for toilet paper, although purists will still have that option, said Ng.

In the run-up to the 10-day games, which open Sept 11, Malaysia has unveiled a slew of ultra-modern mega-projects, from 5-star hotels and new roads to a multibillion dollar airport outside the capital, Kuala Lumpur, and a sports stadium with seating capacity of 100,000.

from my best. I didn't realise just how much the World Cup drains you.' Even though Bergkamp fired


blanks, Marc Overmars, Arsenal's other Holland World Cup star, again made a major contribution to a hard-fought victory. He scored 16 goals last season, more than any other winger in the Premiership. He has two this season, and manager Arsene Wenger believes he has the ability and confidence to challenge Bergkamp again as the club's leading marksman.

Overmars said: We all know the championship is going to be harder to win this season. Players such as Dennis and I have been used to winning all our careers and if you have that strength and personality it makes you strong mentally. I'm not sure there is any se-

cret about it. It's just being hungry enough to want more and more success. I am still very hungry. When you are the champions

and playing at home every team makes it difficult. I we... hree titles in a row with Ajax and every season was more difficult because of the pressure and expectancy on us. But if you can live with that, you will always be successful. That is why we have to show

everybody that we are still hun-

gry. In England it is far more difficult to keep a high level of concentration. Every game is a battle, every team can beat you. but that's not the case in Holland.

'Nobody really felt we could win anything last season so it was a little easier for us. Now everybody thinks we should win every game.

If 25-year-old Overmars had a World Cup hangover he must have been drinking champagne. So far he has produced a goal that helped Arsenal win the Charity Shield against Manchester United at Wembley, and now their first league win.

Wenger said: 'He won't reach his peak for perhaps another two or three years but I still expect him to get more goals than last season. He is good enough, and despite the medals he has won, still wants to prove him-

Arsenal's next test of their status as champions comes with their first away match of the season at Liverpool on Sat-

Liberia striker Christopher Wreh, who scored in the Charity Shield win over Manchester United, has returned from international duty and will be available for the visit to Anfield but Wenger is still short of an experienced front man and has abandoned any hope

of signing Patrick Kluivert from Milan.



Bielsa new Argentine coach?



BARCELONA, Spain, Aug 19: Marcelo Bielsa said on Tuesday that he was "taking steps" to leave

gentina coach, reports Reuters. Bielsa said he had the authority to break his contract with the Spanish club, although he wanted to depart "in harmony, with an agreement and consensus." Espanyol were believed to be

(AFA) over compensation for Bielsa's departure. He joined from Velez Sarsfield only two months ago. Espanyol president Daniel Sanchez Llibre has denied that

in negotiations with the Ar-

gentina Football Association

Bielsa has a get-out clause in his contract. But Bielsa's comments indicate that he believes he has the right to leave - although he reiterated that he has no desire to quit the club under a cloud.

"I would feel very uncomfortable if it wasn't on good terms," he said. "But the AFA made offer knowing that I had the power to

accept it. AFA president Julio Grondona asked Bielsa to replace Daniel Passarella in a new coaching structure to be headed by national youth team coach Jose Pekerman. Passarella quit after Argentina's World Cup

Pekerman had been hot favourite and the popular choice to take over from the combative Passarella, but will now coordinate both Argentina's senior and youth teams Pekerman has led youth teams to victory in two junior World Cups, but has never trained any senior selection.

Argentina's football community welcomed the choice of Bielsa, but some were baffled by the new coaching structure.

"I don't understand the reasons for this type of decision. When a team has two coaches it's the same as if it hasn't got any at all," World Cup-winning coach Cesar Menotti was quoted as saying by Daily Clarin.

Grondona said it was Pekerman who suggested the new structure and put forward the name of Bielsa.

"There was the problem that Bielsa has just signed a contract with Espanyol, but Pekerman told me we had to try," Grondona said.

Bielsa only played four matches in a short career as a professional at Argentine First Division side Newell's Old Boys. He has had more success as a coach, and led Newell's to the league championship in 1990-91 and 1992 and Velez Sarsfield last season.

Argentine media speculated

that by making Bielsa subordinate to Pekerman, the AFA hoped to lessen the chances of the personality clashes which marred Passarella's reign. Passarella, tough captain of

the 1978 Argentine national

team, was hired to bring disci-

pline to a side left in disarray by the antics of wayward genius Diego Maradona. But his hard-man style brought him enemies. Soon af-

ter taking the job he banned players who were homosexual, had long hair or wore earrings. Talented Real Madrid midfielder Fernando Redondo said he could not cut his hair and re-

fused to play under Passarella when the coach relented and called him up anyway. Redondo welcomed Bielsa's appointment and said he

dreamed of playing again for Argentina.
