Foreign investors in India pulling their money out of stock markets

BOMBAY, Aug 20: Foreign portfolio investors have been pulling their money out of Indian stock markets this month, reversing their cautious return in July, data showed yesterday, says AFP.

Figures released by the watchdog Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) showed that 56.3 million dollars had flown out of the markets in the first two weeks of August.

Analysts said the pullout was accelerated by a variety of factors, including domestic political uncertainty.

After losing 440 million dollars of foreign portfolio investments in the three months to June, Indian markets appeared to have rediscovered their allure in July, when overseas investors injected 19.7 million dollars into bourses.

But worsening political instability, with the country's four-month-old minority coalition government lurching from one crisis to another, has clearly dampened any newfound enthusiasm.

Malaysia can weather economic woes if riots are avoided: Mahathir

Malaysia can surmount its economic woes if riots are avoided as the government crafts its recovery plan, the prime minister said Thursday, says AP.

"We can overcome this economic crisis if everybody continues to be calm and there's no rioting," Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad told a group of contractors. Rumours of ethnic riots

swept through the capital two
weeks ago, which sparked panic
buying at supermarkets and
forced many to rush home from
work and bolt their doors.

Three people have been arrested under the Internal Secu-

rity Act, which permits jail without trial, for allegedly circulating riot rumors on the Internet.

Mahathir said last weekend the government may adopt drastic new measures to prevent

further economic deterioration.

He warned some people might be shocked.

He reiterated that concern

"We hope all parties will support the government's efforts," Mahathir said. He added the new measures "may seem extraordinary to others, but not to us. Because it is going to save

Mahathir stressed that the country's affirmative action policy, known as the New Economic Policy, would remain in place to promote racial har-

mony.

The social-economic policy began in the early 1970s to help the majority ethnic Malay population get a larger share of the economy, previously dominated by the minority ethnic Chinese, Critics say the plan fosters cronyism and corrup-

"The distribution of wealth under (the New Economic Policy) has to be continued, despite the economic problems," Mahathir said, denying the plan promoted cronyism or favoured Malays with ties to government leaders.

"In fact, all Malays are cronies of the government. There is not a single Malay who has not received benefits under the NEP," Mahathir said.

The Prime Minister also blasted foreign influences, saying he feared they would take advantage of Malaysia's

29 bankers suspected of corruption in Indonesia

JAKARTA, Aug 20: Indonesian police have identified 29 executives in nine liquidated banks as corruption and embezzlement suspects and have detained five of them, a local newspaper reported Thursday,

The daily Bisnis Indonesia quoted police spokesman Togar Sianipar as saying the bankers were commissioners and directors of banks declared insolvent and shut down by the government last November.

The banks are PT Sejahtera Bank Umum, PT Bank Harapan Sentosa, or BHS, PT South East Asia Bank, PT Bank Pacific, PT Bank Anrico, PT Bank Kosagraha, PT Bank Pinaesaan, PT Bank Dwipa, and PT Bank Citra. Togar said Indonesian detectives had contacted Interpol to arrest at least two bankers who had left the country.

"They will continue to pressure us so that we continue to follow the international agencies," Mahathir said.

Although Malaysia has not sought IMF aid for its economic troubles, over the first half of the year it followed an IMF-like programme of anti-inflation and low spending.

In the last few months, however, Malaysia has abruptly reversed its recovery strategies, jacking up the government budget 20 per cent and loosening monetary policy in an effort to fend off an economic landslide.

The government predicts the economy will contract by up to 2 per cent this year, but private economists predict a shrinkage of as much as 4 per cent to 5 per cent.
