Woman & child repression prevention bill

Women's team hands over recommendations to PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said her government has a plan to set up homes for distressed elderly people and rootless children across the country, reports

"We are trying to establish such homes where a family type relationship will exist among the inmates," she said.

Hasina was talking to a delegation of women's organisations, led by Jatiya Mahila Sangstha chief Ivy Rahman, at the PM's office. The delegation called on her to discuss problems of women and children.

The prime minister said after forming the government, she was very alert to protect the rights of women who because of the socio-economic circumstances are being subjected to harassment.

Hasina said even when in opposition she tried her best to protect rights of women and save them from harassment. In this regard, she men-

tioned that after the murder of Yasmin she rushed to Dinajpur risking her life and took steps so that justice was done. Ivy Rahman, earlier, handed

over a set of recommendations on the proposed Woman and Child Repression Prevention Bill, 1998 to the prime minister. The recommendations were the outcome of a recent seminar organised by 43 women's organisations, human rights organi-

sation and lawyers' forum. Ivy Rahman thanked the prime minister for taking spe-cial steps to protect the rights

and interest of women and stop

Samad Azad calls on S'pore PM, seeks investment

Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad yesterday urged the Prime Minister of Singapore to encourage his country's businessmen to invest in Bangladesh, reports UNB.

The Foreign Minister highlighted the prospect of investment in infrastructure projects, including construction of roads and highways, generation of electricity. telecommunications industries and composite textiles in Bangladesh.

Samad Azad during his meeting with Singapore Prime Minister Gob Chok Tong at the latter's office also discussed various issues of bilateral interests, said a faxed message from Singapore.

Tong said that Singapore Telecommunication could invest in Bangladesh and he would direct the concerned ministry to look into the mat-

The Singapore premier said the Port Authority of Singapore could send some officials to find out the possibility of extending cooperation with the port authorities of Bangladesh. But the Prime Minister fell short of committing investment from Singapore because of present economic turmoil in the South East Asian region, the official message said.

The Foreign Minister han ded over a letter of invitation from Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to the Singapore premier for visiting Bangladesh. Tong accepted the invitation.

We won't allow by-polls if BNP MPs resign: Khaleda

Leader of the Opposition in Parliament and BNP chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia yester-day rejected Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's plan for holding by-elections, saying there will only be a fresh election under a caretaker government if BNP MPs resign from parliament, reports UNB.

In a statement, Begum Zia termed the Prime Minister's remarks about by-e' ctions as irresponsible utterance and interference in the internal matter of BNP which tantamount to disgrace to the electorate.

Referring to BNP MPs deposition of resignation letters, she said, "We are yet to take any decision to submit our resignation letters to the Speaker but that does not mean that we will not resign if any unwarranted situation arises. "If we are compelled to re-

sign, in that case I want to say in unequivocal term that there will be no election under this government. We will not allow any such election," Begum Zia said, adding, "There will only be elections to the 8th parliament under a caretaker government." Begum Zia said there will be

no scope for implementing any dream of by-elections. "Rather, I would advise this inefficient and subservient government to hold immediate mid-term elec-"If you have courage, seek
