DAKAR, Aug 20: Nigeria's rising sprint star Sean Ogunkoya won the African Championships 100 metres title here on Wednesday...

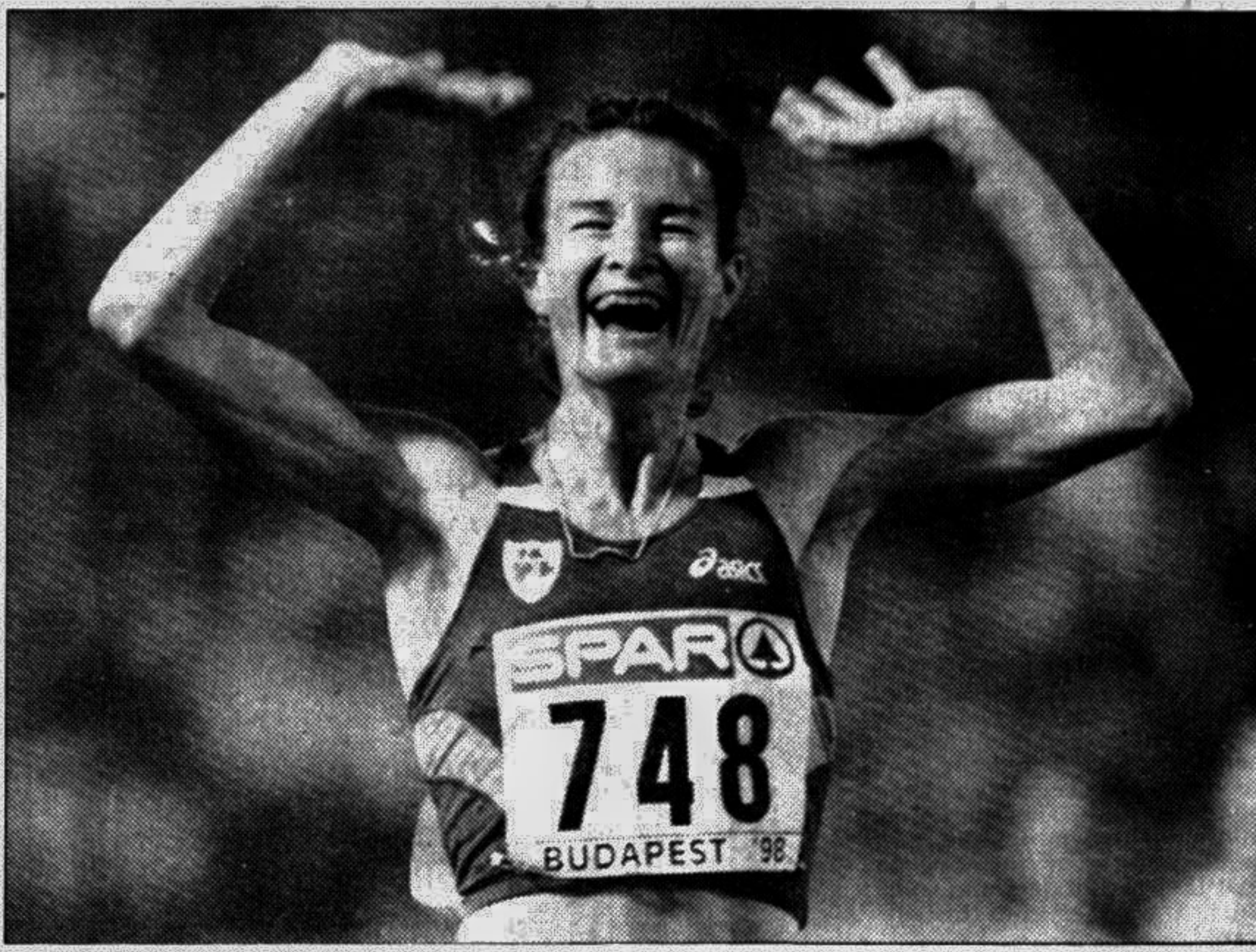

Ogunkoya had given Fredericks ample warning in Zurich earlier this month when he ran 9.96 to beat the Namibian.

Former world champion Samuel Matete of Zambia, meanwhile, won the 400 metres hurdles in 48.67 seconds, well clear of Zimbabwean Kenneth Hirden (49.39) et Senegal's Ibou Faye (49.49).

Mary Onyiah won the women's 100m in 11.05 as Nigeria took all three medals. Endurance Ojokolo second in 11.08 and Rose Aboaja in 11.31.

Ethiopia's Adero Brhane won the women's 5,000m in 15 minutes 54.3 seconds ahead of Kenyan Sally Barosio.

DIARY FROM BUDAPEST



BUDAPEST, Aug 20 (AP): She's a former Olympic and world champion, so you might think the Euro...

Not ever, and in particular — not this year.

The 33-year-old German is coming off operations 10 months ago on both Achilles tendons. She's healthy for the first time in three years and on Saturday will try becoming only the third person to win four straight Euro golds in one event.

This is a new challenge for me to come back after so many problems," she said Thursday. "I'm jumping over 7 meters again and I'm back, really back."

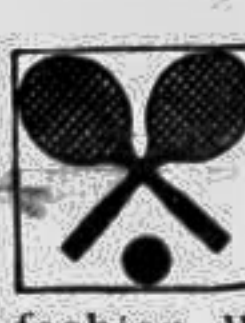

Muster, Bjorkman bow out



INDIANAPOLIS, Aug 20: Andre Agassi continued his comeback from tennis abyss in spectacular fashion Wednesday, routing Australia's Michael Tebbutt 6-1, 6-0 in a second-round match at the RCA Championships, reports AP.

Agassi, the fifth seed, needed just 44 minutes to eliminate Tebbutt. Agassi suffered through a tough season in 1997, but has climbed from the ATP Tour's 122nd ranking at the start of the year to eighth.

He displayed the form that has made him one of the game's greats. Tebbutt was constantly handcuffed by Agassi's lightning-quick service returns, and Agassi broke Tebbutt's serve three times in each set.

Agassi meets Zimbabwe's Wayne Black in Thursday's round of 16. The unseeded Black upset 12th-seeded Thomas Muster of Austria 6-3, 5-7, 6-4.

Greg Rusedski also advanced, but defending champion Jonas Bjorkman did not.

Rusedski, playing for the first time since aggravating an ankle injury at Wimbledon in June, upheld his No 3 seed by defeating Sweden's Magnus Larsson 7-6 (7-2), 6-3.

Bjorkman, the No 4 seed, lost his confidence and his second-round match with Australia's Jason Stoltenberg 7-5, 6-3. His

ouster was the tournament's second major upset, following Thomas Johansson's elimination Tuesday of second-seeded Carlos Moya, the 1997 runner-up.

In other matches, seventh-seeded Albert Costa, No 9 Cedric Pioline and No 10 Felix Mantilla all lost to unseeded opponents.

The hard-serving Rusedski recovered from a slow start to cruise through the first-set tiebreaker, then broke Larsson in the fifth game of the second set. En route, he served up three straight 132 mph aces, and notched a match-high 135 mph serve in the sixth game.

"Today was the big server, shall we speak, coming out," said Rusedski, owner of the fastest serve in ATP Tour history at 149 mph. He had 14 aces against Larsson in his first appearance at the Indianapolis Tennis Centre since 1995.

"I thought I don't serve as well as I could in the beginning, but then I started to get my pop more in the second set, and I started hitting a few more aces," he said. "It's great that the ankle held up. It just great to be back."

Stoltenberg ousted Bjorkman by winning a break-filled first set, then broke service in the eighth game of the second set.

"When I got that (second-set) break, Jonas got a little down,

and I don't think he played as well as he can," Stoltenberg said. "But you know, I feel like I played pretty well."

"I'm not enjoying going out on the court, and I'm thinking negative almost since I lost the first break," Bjorkman said.

Bangladesh squad 73+12 get the C'wealth ticket

Bangladesh will send a 73-member team to the 16th Commonwealth Games to be held in the Malaysian capital of Kuala Lumpur from September 11 to 21, reports BSS.

The team includes 56 sportsmen and women, eight coaches, four team managers and five other officials including chef d'mission. Besides, 12 BOA officials including its president, secretary general, deputy chef d'mission, general manager of delegation will also go to the Games in different capacities.

BOA president, secretary general and a representative will attend the general assembly of the Commonwealth Sports Federation.

BOA is also expected to reduce the estimated budget of Bangladesh team to the Games by 25 per cent, which will be donated to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund.

Bangladesh will take part in seven disciplines — athletics, swimming, boxing, weightlifting, shooting, hockey and cricket.

The team composition is as follows:

Athletics: seven athletes, one coach and one manager.

Swimming: three swimmers and one coach-cum manager.

Boxing: Two boxers and one coach-cum manager.

Weightlifting: three lifters and one coach-cum manager.

Shooting: 11 shooters, two coaches and one manager.

Hockey: 16 players, one coach and one manager.

Cricket: 14 players, one coach and one manager.

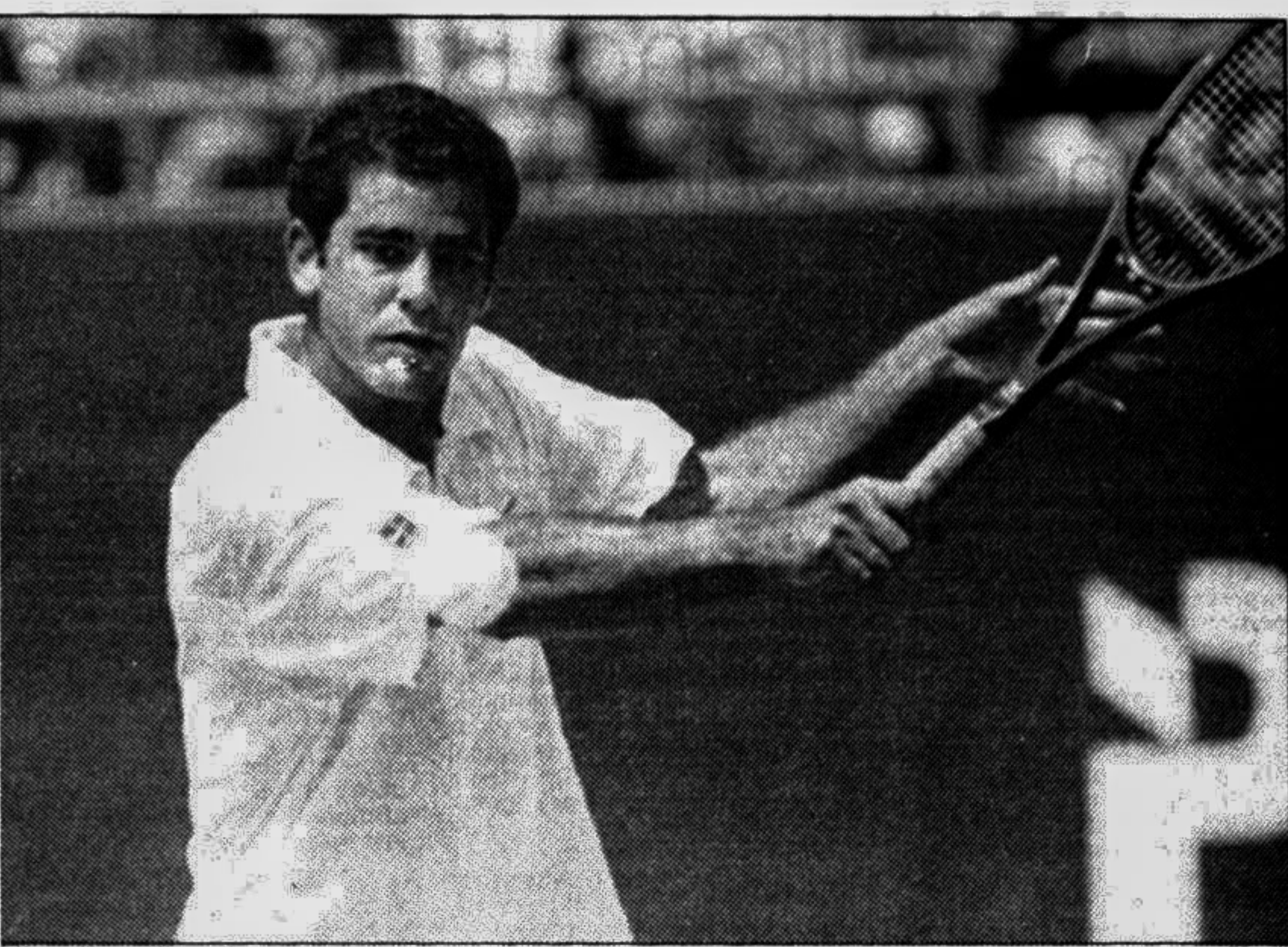
Chelsea don't want Hooijdonk

NOTTINGHAM, England, Aug 20: Chelsea have turned down a bid from English Premiership rivals Nottingham Forest to exchange Pierre van Hooijdonk for Norwegian World Cup star Tore Andre Flo, reports AFP.

Forest manager Dave Bassett said: "Flo is a player I admire greatly and he would have been an ideal replacement for Van Hooijdonk. Unfortunately, Chelsea weren't interested in taking Pierre."

Dutch striker Van Hooijdonk has been on a one-man strike after accusing Forest of lacking ambition by failing to reinforce their squad with major signings over the summer.

Chelsea boss Gianluca Vialli, meanwhile, is considering a 2.5 million pound (four million dollars) bid from Forest for defender Michael Duberry.

Seeds sail smoothly



NEW HAVEN, Connecticut, Aug 20: Pete Sampras, still haunted by a 3-day-old controversy over a tiebreaker before dismissing the young Australian 6-1, 7-6 (7-4) Wednesday and advancing to the third round of the Pilot Pen International, reports AP.

Sampras, the No. 1 seed, dropped the first game of the match, serving, and later said he was having trouble acclimating himself to his first appearance in New Haven.

"My tennis will get better. I certainly hope it will get better," he said, after the 72-minute duel.

Sampras also said he was still dwelling on Sunday's loss to Patrick Rafter in the final of the ATP Championship in Cincinnati, which placed in jeopardy his goal to end the year at No. 1 in the world. The match ended on a serve by Rafter that was first called out, then ruled an ace by the umpire.

"I don't like losing matches. I don't like losing periods, especially that way," he said, adding that he most wants to play Rafter this week.

Rafter, seeded second, beat Jeff Tarango 6-2, 6-1 Wednesday

night to advance to the third round. Rafter, ranked No. 3 in the world, and Sampras would meet in the tournament final.

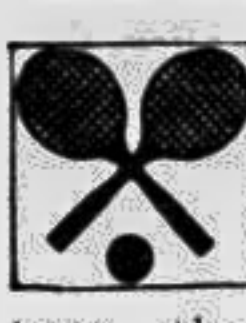

Henman's milestone



NEW HAVEN, Connecticut, Aug 20: Britain's Tim Henman played like someone celebrating his entry into the world top 10, overwhelming Italy's Vincenzo Santopadre here Wednesday at the ATP international, reports AP.

Henman who has become the 100th player to crack the elite group since ATP rankings began in 1973 won 6-2, 6-3 to reach the third round of the one million dollar tuneup for the US Open, which begins August 31.

Henman's entry at number 10 marks the first time Britain has two players ranked in the top 10, last year's US Open runner-up, Greg Rusedski is ranked seventh.

"It's another milestone another goal, but there is a lot more to be achieved," Henman said.

Playing in fresh and bright conditions after rain had blighted the first two days of the tournament Henman used his superior volleys to overcome the adventurous left-handed Italian.

Henman who dropped just two points on serve in the first set, had an opportunity to break serve as early as the third game, but two backhand errors one on his return denied him.

Henman's breakthrough was not long in coming though, he took a 4-2 lead when he struck a volley that hit his opponent as both players rallied at the net, Henman then held to love and claimed the set with a pass to gain a second break.

Anxious to turn the tie, Santopadre earned his only break point of the match with a stinging return, but then put his next return into the net.

Henman responded to the threat by breaking to lead 2-0 when pressure from the birth forced Santopadre to hit the ball wide.

"I felt fresh and very eager," said Henman. "And I set up a lot of volleys with my first serve. I played a solid game and didn't let him play his. I felt confident coming into the match, but having lost in the first round last week I wanted to get back into winning ways. Other times I've played someone in the early rounds ranked lower than I've lost."

Henman will next face Davide Sanguinetti, after the Italian outlasted Fabrice Santoro of France 6-1, 6-7 (2-7), 7-5.
