Owen has Gunners in his sights

LONDON, Aug 20 (AP): An-other big test for Michael Owen. The youngest England player this century, youngest of all time to score for his country and scorer on his World Cup debut, the 18-year-old Liverpool star also produced one of the best World Cup goals ever against Argentina in June.

With all the records and accolades behind him, Owen now targets league and FA Cup winners Arsenal.

The two English soccer giants meet at Anfield Saturday only a week into the Premier League campaign and the con-frontation may give a little clue as to where the title will go this

It's probably more impor-tant to Liverpool than for the Gunners.

The 1990s have been painful for the Merseyside team since it won the last of its record 18 league titles in 1990. Watching their traditionally biggest ri-vals Manchester United win four titles out of five was bad enough. Then seeing Arsenal beat them both last season made it even worse.

A Liverpool victory at An-field will ease some of the pain. especially if Owen can continue his amazing run of landmark performances.

At Southampton last week, he set up one goal and scored the other in a 2-1 win to start the season in style.

Meanwhile, the Liverpool defence will be strongly tested by the immensely talented Arsenal strikeforce, which includes Dutch stars Dennis Bergkamp and Marc Overmars and two more Frenchmen. Nicholas Anelka and Emmanuel Petit.

Arsenal started off with a hard-earned 2-1 home victory over promoted Nottingham Forest on Monday and, if either shows signs of any start-of-season weaknesses. Manchester United will take heart.

The Reds are still smarting from the fact that they surrendered a 12-point lead in the title race last season and, having been eliminated from both domestic cups and the Champions' Cup, wound up without a trophy.

Alex Ferguson's team needed a late leveller from England midfielder David Beckham on Saturday to salvage a 2-2 tie with modest Leicester at Old

Trafford. Now his boys go to meet a West Hamside which has been among the busiest in the transfer market, hiring Chilean World Cup defender Javier Margas, Liverpool's Neil Ruddock, Newcastle goalkeeper Shaka Hislop and Arsenal striker lan

Wright. It was Wright's 84th minute strike that gained the Hammers a 1-0 win at Sheffield Wednesday for the ideal start and a vici tory over Ferguson's team at Upton Park likely could put the Hammers top of the standings.

DAKAR, Aug 20: Nigeria's rising sprint star Seun Ogunkoya won the African Championships 100 metres title here on Wednesday by eclipsing World and Olympic silver medalist Frankie Fredericks, reports AFP.



The team includes 56 sportsmen and women, eight coaches, four team managers and five other officials including chef d'mission. Besides, 12 BOA officials including its pres-ident, secretary general, deputy chef d'mission, general manager of delegation will also go to the Games in different capaci-

BOA president, secretary general and a representative will attend the general assem-bly of the Commonwealth Sports Federation.

BOA is also expected to re-duce the estimated budget of Bangladesh team to the Games by 25 per cent, which will be donated to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund.

Bangladesh will take part in seven disciplines — athletics, swimming, boxing, weightlifting, shooting, hockey and

cricket. The team composition is as follows:

Athletics: seven athletes, one coach and one manager,

Swimming: three swimmers and one coach-cum manager, Boxing: Two boxers and one coach-cum manager.

Weightlifting: three lifters and one coach-cum manager, Shooting: 11 shooters, two coaches and one manager. Hockey: 16 players, one

coach and one manager and Cricket: 14 players, one coach and one manager.


