## Australia name squad for Dhaka meet

MELBOURNE, Aug 26: Left-arm spinner Brad Young was named here today in a 14-man Australian squad to play in a limited-over cricket tournament in Bangladesh in October, reports AFP.

Steve Waugh was named captain of the side for the Wills International Cup with his twin brother Mark his deputy.

The squad is identical to the Australian team to contest next month's Commonwealth Games one-day tournament in Kuala Lumpur.

The selection of Young, 25, is a pointer for the future with the South Australian's lusty late-order hitting and tight left-arm orthodox bowling considered by selectors as ideal for one-day cricket.

Young played one limited over international against South Africa in 1997-98, was a member of recent Australia A side and has twice played in the annual Prime Minister's XI against touring sides.

The Bangladesh knock-out event will feature all nine Test playing nations with Australia drawn to meet India in the opening round.

The tournament is being held to assist the International Cricket Council in raising funds to promote the game worldwide.

**Wills Int'l Cup**  
**BCB forms 9 sub-committees**

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) at a meeting yesterday formed nine sub-committees for the Wills International Cup to be held in Dhaka from October 24 to November 2, reports UNB.

The meeting also discussed State Minister for Youth and Sports Obaidul Quader's request to suspend the one-day matches to be played outside Dhaka due to the devastating flood, said BCB general secretary Syed Ashraf Haq at a press briefing.

Bangladesh were scheduled to play some one-dayers with two or three Test playing nations at Rajshahi, Chittagong, Sylhet and Mymensingh.

However, BCB decided to convince the sports minister about the need to hold the one-day matches outside Dhaka to prove its ability of providing sufficient ground facilities to earn Test status.

**Vasco vexed**

RIO DE JANEIRO, Aug 26 (Reuters/Internet): Libertadores Cup finalists Vasco da Gama threatened to boycott Wednesday's away leg against Barcelona of Ecuador after their bus was attacked at Guayaquil airport, Globo television said on Tuesday.

The Brazilian champions, leading 2-0 from the first leg, arrived in Ecuador's largest city on Monday night for the game.

Globo said local fans pelted the Vasco bus as the players were boarding at Guayaquil airport and one player, reserve fullback Marica, was cut on the head.

Globo showed pictures of Ecuadorian fans chanting rowdily in front of what it said was the team hotel and said the Brazilians had repeated their threat not to play on Wednesday.

Last week, Vasco director Eurico Miranda said his club would not play if the pre-match atmosphere was hostile.

Barcelona and Ecuadorian officials reacted indignantly then, saying that Vasco would be well-looked after. They complained at how Barcelona were treated when they went to Rio de Janeiro for the first leg.

## Entertainers vs experts

LONDON, Aug 26 (Reuters): Sri Lanka, starved of Test cricket in England, are banking on Arjuna Ranatunga's team eloquently stating their case for a better deal over the next five days.

When Ranatunga's side appear at The Oval on Thursday for the one-off Test against England it will be Sri Lanka's first Test in this country for seven years and only their fourth here since becoming a Test-playing nation in 1981.

By comparison, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, India, Pakistan and Zimbabwe have each played at least one three-Test series against Sri Lanka while West Indies met

be particularly anxious to make his mark.

Jayasuriya failed in both triangular matches against England to provide his eagerly-anticipated explosive start, but he has the capacity to adjust his game from the requirements of one-day to five-day cricket.

His 340 against India in Colombo 12 months ago — the fourth highest score in Test history — underlined the point.

While Sri Lanka should not be short of runs, the weakness in their attack is the lack of a strike bowler.

The recall of Ben Hoolioake gives the Surrey all-rounder an opportunity on his home ground to secure a berth for Australia after improved pace bowling performances under the guidance of England bowlers coach Bob Cottam.

Hoolioake's Surrey team mate, leg-spinner Ian Salisbury,

Salisbury has been successful for his county in tandem with Pakistan off-spinner Saqlain Mushtaq at The Oval, where a surface that may be conducive to the turning ball has prompted England to add off-spinner Robert Croft to their squad.

With number three batsman Nasser Hussain nursing a groin injury, John Crawley is set to take his place.

If the in-form Lancashire batsman plays, it will provide a contest within a contest as he and Graeme Hick are effectively battling for the remaining spots.

## Stewart's reward

LONDON, Aug 26 (Reuters): Alec Stewart was Tuesday confirmed as captain of England's cricket team until next year's World Cup.

Stewart, appointed as Mike Atherton's successor at the beginning of the season, will lead England in the Ashes tour a one-day series in Australia and the Sharjah tournament next April, before captaining the World Cup squad.

Stewart will not, however, take part in the International Cricket Council Cup in Dhaka, which is scheduled from October 24 to November 1, as that clashes with the start of the Ashes campaign. A captain for that tournament will be announced when England's various touring parties for the winter are revealed on September 1.

"Captaining your country is the highest honour you can have in the game and I'm enormously grateful to be given the chance to continue in that role," said Stewart.

**Sri Lanka take lead**

AGRA, Aug 26: Riding on Brendon Kuruppu's half-century, Sri Lanka beat India by 14 runs in the opening match of the Independence Cup veterans' series here yesterday, reports PTI.

Electing to bat after winning the toss, Sri Lanka scored 171 in 36 overs helped by Kuruppu's hurricane 54 off 44 balls (6x4, 4x6), Amal Silva's 33 of an equal number of balls and skipper Duleep Mendis' 27.

For India Nayak was the main wicket-taker with three for 29 followed by Raghuvhar Bhatt (2/25) and Sandeep Patil (2/9).

**No night soccer**

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina Aug 26 (AP): An Argentine judge ordered Tuesday the temporary suspension of night games in the country's first-division soccer league, reports AP.

One Saturday night game has already been rescheduled for Sunday afternoon and league officials are meeting Tuesday night to determine how to rearrange the times of upcoming night games.

Worried about continuing fan violence and behaviour, Judge Victor Perrota had threatened Monday to suspend league play for a second time this year if league officials didn't take additional security steps.

Perrota ordered a suspension of play in May, reacting to a violent weekend which involved two shootings and an outbreak of scuffles and rock throwing.

This time Perrota was motivated by a weekend game cut short by an electricity outage where fans lit fires and set off fireworks.

"I'm almost sure the firecrackers and confetti were set off inside the stadium," Perrota told a local radio station Monday night.

"It was neglect on the part of some stadium official and someone is going to have to give an explanation," he said.

Perrota said fan movements are more difficult to follow during night games. League officials say the new arrangement may be finalised already agreed upon "pay-per-view" contracts with cable station.

Nevertheless, Perrota says he is undeterred.

"I'm not going to wait for something bad to happen," the judge said.

## WC 2002 S Korea wants it in May

SEOUL, Aug 26: A South Korean soccer official suggested on Wednesday that the 2002 World Cup be rescheduled to start in May to avoid the rainy season in South Korea and Japan, reports AP.

Park Seh-jik, chairman of South Korea's World Cup organizing committee, said he will discuss the idea with co-host Japan before proposing it to FIFA, soccer's world governing body.

"I think there is no reason Japan would object to the idea, because the two countries are in the same seasonal belt," Park told reporters.

Japan and South Korea are jointly hosting the 2002 World Cup, soccer's first premier event to be held in Asia.

The quadrennial, month-long World Cup traditionally has started around June 10, after the professional soccer season in Europe and South America ends in April.

But the period exactly overlaps the rainy season in both Japan and South Korea.

Chung Mong-joon, head of South Korea's Football Association, suggested in July that the 2002 World Cup be rescheduled for September to avoid the rainy season in this part of the world.

But that idea met strong objection from key FIFA member countries in Europe and South America because of their pro league schedules.

Park said starting the tournament in late May would avoid the rainy season, the pro league season in Europe and South America and the 2002 Asian Games to be held in Pusan, South Korea, in September.

"It is just like catching three birds with one stone," he added.

This year's World Cup in France ran from June 10 to July 12.

In Zurich, FIFA said it would have no official comment on the proposal but could discuss it at the World Cup planning committee meeting on September 15.

FIFA has said previously that it does not contemplate changing the dates, mainly because it would affect all the national championships in Europe.

A FIFA official, speaking on condition of anonymity, said Wednesday that the South Korean proposal appeared to be "simply not feasible."
