#### Manu in Babu's shoes

The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) appears to have finally filled the hole left by executive committee member Ali Ahsan Babu's reluctance to function as secretary of the senior division league, but only after making a compromise by creating instead the post of member-secretary Cricket Committee of Dhaka Metropolitan (CCDM).

After failing to coax Tanjeeb Ahsan Saad, BCB's former executive secretary, to put on Babu's shoes, Mahmud Ul Haque Manu, a joint secretary of Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB), was last night appointed member-secretary of the CCDM

Earlier, the (BCB) in its meeting on August 20 nominated its vice-president Tanveer Haider to the CCDM chair and three secretaries -- board member Ali Ahsan Babu as secretary senior division league, Hossain Mollah as secretary tournament and Enayet Kabir Chanchal as secretary junior division league.

But Babu, in a quick petition, requested the board to relieve him from the responsibility in view of his professional commitments.

Although, Manu has been selected as the replacement for Babu, the BCB general secretary Syed Ashraful Haque said last night that, as member-secretary CCDM, Manu will be supervising the function of both the secretary tournament and the secretary junior division.



# Susanthika for peace



COLOMBO, Aug 31: Sri Lanka's top sprinter and Asia's fastest woman Susan-

thika Jayasinghe Sunday called for peace with local officials whom she earlier accused of sexually harassing her and framing her on a doping charge, reports AFP.

Jayasinghe, 22, who last week had a suspension lifted after she was cleared of taking performance enhancing drugs. said she faced a bigger challenge now in ensuring reconciliation with sports ministry officials.

"I have absolutely no faith in the ministry officials or the two doctors in the ministry," Jayasinghe said. "But at the same time. I cannot continue my career without ending this stand off. They may try to stop me

again." She said she was financially crippled since the doping scandal broke out following a test carried out by the Amateur Ath-

letic Association in March. "They cut off my sponsor-

ship. I had to cut down on food because I ran out of money." Jayasinghe said. "I train four hours a day now, but the ministry does not allow me access

to the gym." Jayasinghe, the world's second fastest woman, had earlier accused a top ministry official of spiking her urine sample with banned steroids after she refused his sexual advances.

The doping scandal eventually become in international controversy and she sought help from local lawyers to prove her innocence.

She said she wanted to get on with her life. "I want to bring win Sri Lanka's first gold medal at an Olympic Games by winning the 200 metres at Sydney," Jayasinghe said. "That is my

In the meantime, she said she wanted to take part in invitation meets to earn money for

her upkeep. She regretted not being able to take part in a commercial meet in the 30,000-capacity

stadium in Chegdu, capital of

the southwestern province of Sichn in China April because of the doping scandal.

"I missed about 5,000 dollars because of that and I need the money," she said. She will face a timing test Wednesday to qualify for the Commonwealth Games but said

she will not take part unless she

is able to record a timing better

than 22.5 seconds. Jayasinghe's indefinite suspension slapped in April was lifted last week after a 2-1 vote cleared her of charges of taking performance enhancing

steroids. The lifting of the ban was subject to Jayasinghe undergoing urine tests every three months but her lawyer, Daya Perera said she would agree only if there was a qualified officer to take the test.

"Our position was that from the very beginning the authorities had not followed the correct procedure in taking a urine sample from her in March," lawyer Perera said.

crushed England by 10 wickets in the one-off Test at The Oval today, reports AFP. Muttiah Muralitharan, who finished with 16 wickets in the

match, claimed figures of 52.2-

27-65-9 as England crashed to 181 all out. Sri Lanka's openers Sanath Jayasuriya (24 not out) and Marvan Atapattu (nine not out) knocked off the 36 runs needed for victory in just five overs with more than half an hour to

spare on the final day of the match. It was Sri Lanka's first Test victory in England and came af ter the home side had amassed

445 in their first innings. Muralitharan, whose action was questioned by England coach David Lloyd on Sunday night, finished with match fig-

ures of 16 for 220. But while the Sri Lankan players were celebrating their historic victory, officials were involved in a row over Muralitharan's action.

Lloyd cast a cloud of suspicion over the world's best finger spinner on Sunday and revealed he would make his observations "known to the proper authorities.

The Sri Lankans responded angrily to the comments. claiming Lloyd was wrong to make his reservations public instead of going directly to the match referee.

England, resuming on 54 for two and 92 runs adrift of the tourists' massive first innings 591, struggled from the outset against Muralitharan.

England's hopes of winning three consecutive Test matches for the first time since 1981 had effectively disappeared over the weekend when the world oneday champions posted a massive 591 in their first innings.

#### HIV-positive footballer fights ban

MELBOURNE, Aug 31 (AP): An amateur footballer who is HIV-positive has taken legal action after being banned by his state association because of his condition.

Matthew Hall, who plays Australian Rules football, is fighting a ban by the Victorian Amateur Football Association in an anti-discrimination tribunal.

an AIDS expert told the tribunal Monday that there was no justification for the ban.

Professor John Dwyer, who is the medical director of Prince Henry's Hospital in Sydney and head of medicine at the University of New South Wales, told the tribunal he would advise football coaches that the risk of an HIV-positive footballer infecting his teammates was in-

finitesimal. "We're talking totally extraordinary odds," Dwyer told the tribunal. "I'm very comfortable with telling people who ask my opinion that people with HIV should be allowed to play

their code of football." Dwyer said the World Health Organisation had stated there was no scientifically verified case of HIV being transmitted in a sporting arena.

He said there was overwhelming evidence to show the vast majority of infections occurred through sexual contact and the sharing of needles.

LONDON, Aug 31 (Reuters/Internet): Muttiah Muralitharan completed the fifth best match haul in Test cricket history of 16 for 220 at The Oval on Monday to spin Sri Lanka to their first Test triumph in England. Off-spinner Muralitharan added nine for 65 to his first innings seven for 155 as Sri Lanka won the one-off test by 10 wickets on the final day. England, 146 behind on first innings, crumbled from the

overnight 54 for two to 181 all out and Sri Lanka, needing 36 to win, romped home in five overs in the final session. Muralitharan now has the seventh best performance for a

single innings in a Test. He also became the first bowler to take 16 wickets in a Test at The Oval.

# Lloyd irks Lankans



Sri Lanka reacted strongly to David Lloyd's remarks on off-spinner Muttiah Muralitharan's action and demanded an explanation from the England and Wales Cricket Board

LONDON, Aug 31:

(ECB) Monday, reports AP. Lloyd, the England coach cast cloud of suspicion over Sri Lanka's double-jointed bowler, as his side slumped closer to a defeat in the one-off Test.

Muralitharan, 26, was no-

balled seven times by Australian umpire Darrell Hair during Sri Lanka's second Test against Australia at Melbourne on Boxing Day 1995. But Muralitharan, who has over 200 Test wickets in 42

matches so far, has since been cleared after medical evidence confirmed a physical deformity on both his arms. Muralitharan, bowls with a bent right arm that cannot be

straightened "We don't want a repetition of what happened before," said an angry Thilanga Sumathipala, the president of the Board of Control for Cricket in Sri

Lanka (BCCSL). "If there were any concerns he should have gone to the match referee, not the media," said Sumathipala.

"I will make my opinions known to the appropriate authorities," Lloyd said of Muralitharan. "I am not going any further than that, I am not prepared to make any more comment." Lloyd said after the fourth day's play.

"I have brought it to the attention of the ECB and I want to know what concerns he has, it was all highly uncalled for." Sumathipala said.

Sri Lanka, the reigning oneday world champions, went into the Test following their triumph in the triangular series that included England and South Africa.

Match referee Ahmed Ebrahim confirmed he had studied Lloyd's comments but decided against a hearing. "Claiming someone had an 'unorthodox action did not

contravene the ICC's code of conduct," Ahmed said Richard Peel, the ECB's Di rector of Corporate Affairs said. Lloyd would be spoken to

at the end of the Test.
