Country's population may stabilise at 200 to 250 million by 2050

Bangladesh achieved "tremendous progress" in population control, attaining an annual growth rate of 1.7 per cent now from three per cent in 1973. according to the annual "State of the World Population Report" of UNFPA released here yesterday.

"Yet the potential for future growth is absolutely tremendous as 43 per cent of the total population is below 15 years," the report said.

The report was released by UNFPA representative in Bangladesh Alain P Mouchiroud at the Jatiya Press Club.

"The proportion of adolescents aged 10 to 19 will grow up to 22 per cent in 2000 and 2005. The youths aged 15 to 29 will reach 28.3 per cent of the population in 2010 which was 22 per cent in 1974. In 2010, adolescents will be 31.8 million and youths 41.3 million," the reports said.

It, however, said that the population of Bangladesh may stabilise at around 200 to 250 million by the middle of next

"The percentage of elderly people will increase from six per cent in 1995 to 7.7 in 2000 and 9.1 per cent in 2010 bringing their total number to 13.3 million in 2010," the report

The number of elderly people will be growing all over the world as a result of reduced fertility, reduction in mortality and increase in life expectancy. The number of people over 65 will grow by around nine mil-lion this year, 14.5 million in 2010 and 21 million in 2050. By 2050, around 97 per cent of older people will be living in to-day's developing countries, with more than one fourth in India alone, it said.

The report said, the world population is 5.9 billion now and it will be six billion by mid-

The population will reach 9.4 billion by the year 2050. It was 2.5 billion in 1950, three billion in 1960 and five billion

Refuting the recent wellpublicised claims that "Population explosion is over", the report said, world population is currently growing by more than 80 million a year though the growth rate has come down to 1.4 per cent now from two per cent in the sixties.

If, starting in 2025, the global fertility rate remains at 2.2 children per woman, the population will reach 18.3 billion by 2150. On the other hand, if global fertility remains at 1.8 report said.



Rape of students, assault on teacher at JU



river through Turabo, Gobindaganj, Demra and Kanchpur, and also construct a single lane road instead of a double lane road," said one source requesting anonymity. With the new concept, the cost of the 30 kilometre long embankment-cumbypass could be 'reduced to

about 100 million dollars'. Asked to comment on the new proposal, WASA experts said that with the embankment, there must be 'large water retention points' within the embankment to hold the accumulated water coming from this vast area. "Then the government will have to install very powerful pumps to pump out the water, which is an expensive operation," said a WASA official.

Communication Ministry sources said if the donors agreed to finance it, the embankment could be completed

within the next three years. At present the entire area between Tongi and Kanchpur is under water. About one million people live in the area. The rate of constructions on the eastern fringe is very high despite the risk of floods because "There is hardly any place left for construction within the embankment on the other fringes of the city," said a WASA source.

cropping Bangladesh has sought 879 million dollars in foreign aid for immediate relief and rehabilitation. OCHA said international donors had pledged just over 22 million dollars so far.

Meanwhile, the overall flood situation in the country has once again aggravated yesterday with rise of water levels of major rivers, report agencies.

The Relief Ministry control room said the flood situation vesterday further deteriorated in eight districts. These are Narayanganj, Gopalganj, Narsingdi, Brahmanbaria, Bogra, Laxmipur, and Chapainawab-

The situation remained unchanged in 13 districts. They are: Dhaka, Munshiganj, Mymensingh, Kishoreganj, Faridpur, Madaripur, Rajbari Shariatpur, Rajshahi, Pabna, Chandpur and Noakhali. Improvement continued in

districts. They are: Manikganj, Jamalpur, Sherpur, Netrokona, Rajbari, Kurigram, Gaibandha, Sirajganj, Comilla and Barisal.

The control room said floodrelated death toll rose to 451

with 11 more deaths reported in last 24 hours till 3 pm yesterday. Fresh deaths included five in Kishoreganj, four in Manikganj and two in Chand-

Health Directorate control room said 6,673 more people were afflicted with diarrhoea in the 24 hours till 12 noon. Seven of them died.

With this, the death toll from diarrhoea since July 15 rose to 101 while the number of those attacked by the disease to 1.34.866.

According to Flood Forecasting and Warning Centre (FFWC) the Brahmaputra-Jamuna recorded rise at all points, the Padma displayed rising trend at upstream but fall in downstream. Rivers in the Meghna and South-eastern Hill basins fell in most places.

The Buriganga at Dhaka and Sitalakhya at Narayanganj remained static and continued to flow above the danger marks by 59 cm and 100 cm respec-

However, the Turag at Mirpur in the capital and at Tongi recorded fall by 2 cm and 1 cm. The rivers were flowing above the red marks by 137 cm and 102 cm respectively.

Mandela urges Western countries

Reduce debt burden of developing countries

DURBAN, Sept 2: Colombian President Andres Pastrana formally opened the 12th Nonaligned Movement Summit here today, before handing the chairmanship of the body to South Africa's Nelson Mandela, report agencies.

Addressing more than 60 heads of state from the 113-nation movement, Pastrana called for a moment's silence to honour NAM leaders who have died since the 11th NAM summit held at Cartagena, Colombia in 1995.

Delegates from the 113 countries - senior government officials - have worked since Saturday on resolutions on diverse world issues, from labour laws

to terrorism. However, by early today, there were still sharp differences over nuclear weapons. Foreign ministers due officially to endorse resolutions for presentation to the summit postponed their meeting until

Mandela, who took over the chairmanship of the Nonaligned Movement from Colombian President Andres Pastrana, addressed the summit and called on Western countries to reduce the debt burden of developing nations. He said leaders of developing countries should refrain from abusing

"The challenge we face is that we too should strive to lead by the example we ourselves set." Mandela said.

UN Secretary General Kofi Annan appealed to African leaders at the summit to resolve their problems by peaceful rather than military means.

Annan, addressing leaders of the 113-nation NAM at the opening session, said a world conference on terrorism, which had hit three African cities in the past five weeks, was "something that should be seriously considered."


