

DURBAN, Sept 3: Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina today sought an end to all nuclear weapons in a comprehensive and non-discriminatory way to ensure global peace and secu-rity, reports UNB.

We believe, however, that the time has come for concrete steps for the elimination of nuclear weapons and other weapons of mass destruction," she said in her speech to the 12th conference of NAM in South Africa.

The speech of the prime minister was read out by Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad who led the Bangladesh delegation to the conference.

Hasina, earlier, cancelled her programme to attend the Non-Aligned Summit in the wake of severe flooding in the country.

JU expels 2 BCL leaders for assaulting teacher

Jahangirnagar University (JU) authorities yesterday expelled two leaders of the ruling Awami League-backed Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) for assaulting a teacher of the university on August 23.

Meanwhile, students under the banners of General Students Unity (GSU), Ganotantrik Chhatra Oikkya (GCO) and the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal, started a fast-unto-death in front of the VC's office protesting the authorities' 'failure' to punish the culprits in rapes of three students of the university. The fasting was continuing till filing this report at 11:30 pm vesterday.

The tenure of the Fact Finding Committee,' formed to probe the rape cases, were extended for more investigations, syndicate sources said.

JU BCL general secretary Jasimuddin Manik was expelled for a period of one year Another BCL leader Meer Mehedi Hasan Titu was expelled for two years with a fine of Tk 5,000. Three other BCL leaders accused of assaulting the teacher Rehnuma Ahmed, were however, acquitted of charges 'for lack of evidence' against them, JU Syndicate source said.

BCL brought out a procession on the campus and threatened of dire consequences for the expulsions of their leaders. JU Syndicate, at a meeting

with the VC Prof Alauddin Ahmed in the chair, yesterday finalised the expulsions following recommendation by Disciplinary Committee. The Committee forwarded the recommendations after examining statements of the five accused BCL leaders, the complainant and witnesses.

Annual WB lending to Bangladesh up by 50 pc

The World Bank's annual lending to Bangladesh has gone up by 50 percent (200 million US dollars) following the country's better performances, reports UNB.

From between 400 and 450 million US dollars a year, it has now become 600 to 650 million dollars, World Bank's outgoing mission chief Pierre Landell-Mills told newsmen in the city yesterday.

"Bangladesh's performance has always been better than other low-income countries," said Landell-Mills, who is leaving Dhaka on October 23 on completion of his four-year tenure in Bangladesh.

Poverty alleviation is the main mission of World Bank's activities in Bangladesh, he said, while releasing the Bank's document titled "Partnership in Development: The World Bank's Assistance to Bangladesh" at its

Paribagh office in the city. Giving an account of the Bank's assistance in transportation, health and population, agriculture and other sectors, he said, "Everything we do is adjudged to have an impact on poverty alleviation."

He hoped poverty will signif icantly come down if growth rate can be escalated to seven to eight percent and population growth rate be kept below two percent.

The Bank in its document said: The government's vision of achieving faster, broaderbased and sustainable growth with low inflation by the turn of century looks to be an attainable objective provided political stability remains undis-

The WB country director pointed out the failures of policy-based adjustment lending, mainly to the jute sector.
