ZURICH, Sept 3 (Reuters/Internet): Swiss tennis star Marc Rosset had booked a seat on the Swissair jet that plunged into the sea off Nova Scotia, but changed his plans at the last minute and missed the doomed flight. Swiss media reported on Thursday.

Rosset, the 1992 Olympic champion, was eliminated from the US Open tournament in New York on Monday and was supposed to return to his native Geneva.

But he cancelled his ticket for unknown reasons for the Swissair plane, which crashed on Wednesday killing 229 people. Swiss television reported.

Prince of Asturias award for Vicario

OVIEDO, Spain, Sept 3 (Reuters/ Internet): Arantxa Sanchez Vicario has been Prince of Asnamed the turias award winner for the leading international sports person in 1998.

The Spaniard won the French Open this year for the third time and was called "the greatest tennis player Spain has ever produced" by the voting panel, including International Olympic Committee president Juan Antonio Samaranch.

The Prince of Asturias prize, which also has categories for humanities, arts, literature, science and international relations, was founded in 1981 and named after the heir to the Spanish throne.

Past winners of the sporting award include middle distance runner Sebastian Coe, pole vaulter Sergei Bubka and fivetimes Tour de France winner Miguel Indurain.

Edwards pulls out LONDON, Sept 3: Jonathan

Edwards has ruled out of the World Cup in South Africa later this month, reports AFP.

The triple jump star withdrew from last Friday's Brussels Golden League meeting when the ankle injury which has been troubling him all year became unbearable even after a pain-killing injection. Now he has decided not to compete again this season.

Edwards will lose more than 60,000 pounds (100,500 dollars) for missing this Saturday's IAAF Grand Prix final in Moscow and the World Cup. But the newly crowned European champion is determined to have immediate surgery on his injured left ankle.

NEW YORK, Sept 3 (AFP/ Internet): The controversial father and former coach of French tennis star Mary Pierce is back at the US Open after a five-year banishment and working to rebuild a relationship with his daughter.

Jim Pierce, banned by the WTA Tour in June of 1993, had the punishment lifted last November, allowing him to attend this year's Open in his role as advisor for American firstround loser Vince Spadea.

Venus fined

NEW YORK, Sept 3 (AFP/ Internet): Venus Williams, the fifth-seeded American who was runner-up at the 1997 US Open. was fined for not wearing a WTA patch in a first-round victory and could face fines of 25,000 dollars a match.

The lanky black 18-year-old who wears beads in her hair debuted a yellow halter top and blue skirt combination Tuesday in a 6-1, 6-0, victory over Ger-Open. many's Elena Wagner that lasted only 49 minutes.

The outfit was one of seven specially designed by sponsor Reebok for Williams -- one for her every match if she makes a return trip to the finals at the \$14 million Grand Slam event.

But because the outfit lacked a tour patch, WTA spokesman Jim Fuhse said, Williams will be fined 100 dollars. The fine will be 500 dollars if it is absent in her next match and 25,000 dollars every time thereafter.

"It's more than unfair," said Richard Williams, father of Venus and her WTA-playing sister Serena. "We will take this to court."

The fourth-seeded Korda, whose wife had their second daughter in late July but has been home only five days since the birth, lost 2-6, 6-3, 6-2, 6-1 and said he was mentally exhausted.

"I need to leave the game of tennis for a while and spend some time with the family," said Korda, who won the Australian Open this year for his first Grand Slam title.

Top-seeded Pete Sampras, seeking to tie Roy Emerson's record of 12 Grand Slam singles titles, and women's No 1 seed Martina Hingis had matches wiped out Wednesday night by torrential rain and strong wind.

Their second-round matches were rescheduled for Thursday afternoon.

Men's No 2 Marcelo Rios and No 11 Yevgeny Kafelnikov reached the second round with straight-sets victories.

Wimbledon semifinalist Tim Henman, the 13th seed, beat 46th-ranked Scott Draper of Australia 6-3, 7-6, serving 14 aces to overcome 48 unforced errors.

Michael Chang, the 20thranked Asian-American who reached last year's US Open semifinals, beat Israeli Eyal Erlich 6-1, 6-3, 6-1. Chang has struggled with injuries all year.

Spaniard Carlos Moya, tenth seed, also won. He overcame Mariano Puerta 6-1, 7-6,

6-7, 4-4 as the Argentine retired. Steffi Graf, a five-time US Open winner who missed the tournament last year while recovering from knee surgery, needed only 41 minutes to win her second-round match and move within two victories of surpassing Martina Navratilova as the women's career leader in prize money.

Other women joining Seles and the eighth-seeded Graf in the third round were No 3 Jana Novotna, No 9 Irina Spirlea, No 11 Patty Schnyder, No 14 Dominique Van Roost, Serena Williams, who did not seem bothered by a heavily bandaged right thigh in a 6-2, 6-1 victory over a qualifier, and Croatian prodigy Mirjana Lucic.

No 16 Ai Sugiyama became the first seeded woman to exit the tournament, withdrawing midway through the opening set of her match Wednesday with a sprained left ankle.

Spirlea and Williams will meet in the third round. Last year at the US Open, Spirlea collided with Venus Williams. Serena's older sister, during a changeover in their match.
