# Dow gets two 500-point drops in less than a year

NEW YORK, Sept 5: Bull or bear, after two 500-point tumbles in less than a year, even the longest-term investors may be wondering whether they have what it takes to ride this bucking bronco, says AP.

Before Monday, and ignoring percentages, one might have hoped that one-day drops of that size by the Dow Jones industrial average came only once a decade.

After all, that's how long it took to get from the first ever. the 508-point Black Monday plunge of October 19, 1987, to the second, the record 554-point

#### Northwest striking workers prepare to meet for talks

MINNEAPOLIS, Sept 5: As flight attendants and other union workers at Northwest Airlines rallied, the carrier and its striking pilots prepared for a meeting that was not expected to yield any breakthroughs, reports AP.

The most either side expected from Saturday's meeting in Chicago with US government mediators was a date for future negotiations.

Right now, they are so far apart it's hard to know what could be done," said former Vice President Walter Mondale, who sits on Northwest's board of directors. "Every day the strike goes on, that franchise is imperiled. There's no good in this for anybody."

Two other airline disputes also simmered Friday.

Negotiators for AirTran and its 500 flight attendants continued negotiating thorough a midnight deadline for threatened flight disruptions. Orlando, Florida-based AirTran serves 37 cities with 284 flights daily. The flight attendants have been without a contract since they organized three years ago as employees of what was then ValuJet Airlines. slide last October 27.

The third 500-point drop in history, Monday's loss of 512. will likely be followed by aftershocks for weeks and months to come, but the stock market will probably return to more normal levels of volatility, analysts say. The problem, however, is

that "normal" has little to do with the relative calm that investors have been spoiled by through most of this decade. Not only was last October's

500-point plunge the first in 10 years, it also was the first of at least 400 points, 300 points or even 250 points since 1987. But suddenly, in addition to

Monday's sharp drop, there have been moves of 337 points. 299 points, and 288 points in just the past month alone.

Normal volatility, then, may mean that leaps and dives of 200 points, while not common place, won't be so unusual.

May be investors will get used to it. According to Alan Steginsky, a 42-year-old doctor in Columbus, Ohio, "Anything less than 100 points is a flat market.

It's easier to remain calm, of course, when you're still ahead, said Dan Ascani, research director at Global Market Strategists in Gainesville, Georgia.

"Investors felt a lot of pain (during the recent slide). They've just given back nearly half of the wealth they gained since 1995, when they began to pile into mutual funds at a heavy pace," he said. "If it drops again, investors are not going to want to give back the rest and could begin selling and con-

tribute to a greater selloff." For now, after a sobering 1,700-point, 18 per cent drop from July's record high of 9,337.97, the Dow is still about

twice as high as it was at the end

"It all depends if you're playing with their money or your money," said Dub Cochran, a 75-year-old retiree from Des Moines, lowa. "It's just like a casino. Once you start getting into your money then you start losing your stomach."

But even if the huge losses of recent weeks didn't shake their Pavlovian confidence in Wall Street's ability to bounce back, perhaps a steady diet of 200point swings will make investors reconsider whether they have the stamina to ride out

even a rising stock market. "People aren't used to the violent price moves that we've seen, but one can't expect that in a month's time they will become so alarmed that they bail out," said Richard A Dickson, a

technical analyst at Scott and Stringfellow in Richmond, Vir-

"They're looking at their mutual fund statements and they see it going down, but everybody says, 'No big deal.' People have been told you have to be longterm. It's not going to take one or two months to shake that conviction," he said. "When you're looking at a string of losses on your statement, that's when it becomes a definite concern. It's easy to be long-term in a bull market. It's harder in a

On Friday, the Dow fell 41.97 to 7,660.25 down 411.43 for the week. The decline left the Dow with a loss of 268 points, or 3.4 per cent, for the year. At the July peak, the Dow was up 18.1 per cent for 1998.

#### Asians have lowest Coca-Cola stops unemployment rate among women in US

WASHINGTON. Sept 5: Asian women have the lowest unemployment rate among women in the United States, the US government reported, says

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, women of Asian and Pacific islander ancestry had a jobless rate of just 4.4 per cent in 1996.

White women had a jobless rate of 4.7 per cent, African-American women of 10 per cent, and Hispanic women of 10.2 per cent, the department said.

The Asian and Pacific islander population was estimated at 10 million people in March 1997, or roughly 3.7 per cent of the total population of the United States, according to the Census Bureau.

#### \$75m investment in Zambia

LUSAKA, Sept 5: Coca-Cola company has suspended its plans to undertake a 75 million US dollars investment programme in Zambia and is scaling down its operations in the country, says Xinhua.

This decision followed the Zambian government's failure to honour a pledge to reduce the excise duty on the company's products, the Post paper said

And the price of all Coca-Cola soft drinks will be increased from the current 500 Zambia kwacha (one dollar equals to 2,000 kwacha) to 900 kwacha with effect from Monday or September 7.

The company's Africa presi-dent Carl Ware told the paper Thursday that they would scale down the operations in Zambia.
