Davenport the road-warrior

NEW YORK, Sept 6 (AP/ Internet): Looking for a shortcut from Midtown to the US Open? Ask Lindsay Davenport, the third-ranked player in the world, who drives from her hotel to the tournament each day.

While most of the players, especially at the top of the fields are chauffeured to the National Tennis Centre in Queens, Davenport gets behind the wheel for the daily commute, dodging potholes, taxis and other components of New York's highway mayhem.

In three years, Davenport said Saturday after reaching the fourth round with a 6-2, 6-1 victory over Virginia Ruano Pascual, she's never even been stuck in a traffic jam.

"You know, so far I've been pretty lucky," she said. "But I really like being able to drive yourself. You know, you feel like you're in control and you can just talk amongst yourselves with your family. Re-laxes me, I think."

Davenport comes from the land of freeways, Southern California, and says New York traffic isn't much better than Interstate 405 back home.

"Especially this weekend, it's great. It only takes 15 minutes on Labour Day weekend, no traffic," she said.

And she seems to fit right in with the local driving style that borders on permanent road "My coach has a hard time

when I drive, a little aggressive," she said. For others looking to get here quick, Davenport suggests

this route: "Normally I take the Triboro Bridge," she said. "But if I hear there's traffic on the radio, which I listen to, I take the Midtown Tunnel.

Even this road warrior has her limits, though. "I'm not driving cross-town." Davenport said. "I'm just getting

on the FDR (the highway that runs up Manhattan's East Side) and I'm out."

English hooligans atitagain

STOCKHOLM, Sept 6: Police arrested 11 people, one of them English, after fans vandalized Rasunda Stadium following Sweden's 2-1 European Championship victory over England on Saturday, reports AP.

The mob kicked out humansized panes of transparent plastic on the top tier of the stadium and threw beer and debris. Swedish news agency TI

quoted police as saying 11 were arrested. However, police told The Associated Press that details of the arrests were not available.

Several fights broke out around Rasunda Stadium after the match ended about 8 pm, but there were no immediate reports of injuries.

Dozens of police in riot gear and accompanied by German shepherds surrounded the rioting fans and cleared the scene with minimal force.

Downtown Stockholm's nightlife neighborhoods were loud and lively after the game, but well-behaved

Several hundred fans watching from the street in the residential neighborhood about 5 kilometres (3 miles) from central Stockholm, cheered when police dispersed the groups of young men, who shouted and sang through the destroyed window frames, kicking and punching out more in full view of police.

Several were led away in handcuffs. Two police helicopters with searchlights circled overhead.



LONDON, Sept 6 (Reuters/ Internet): A newspaper report that Rupert Murdoch is set to buy England's biggest and most

prestigious soccer club, Manchester United, alarmed British politicians and sports fans on Sunday.

The Sunday Telegraph said the media magnate would use his satellite television company BSkyB to offer up to 575 million pounds (\$958.1) for the world-famous Red Devils. Neither BSkyB nor Manch-

ester United would comment but Sky's own television news. while describing the report as "speculation", did not deny it outright.

Since 1992, BSkyB has held exclusive rights to the broadcasting of the premier league in which England's top teams compete. Two years ago, it paid 647 million pounds to renew those rights until 2001.

Sports Minister Tony Banks said he was worried that a takeover of Manchester United. one of the wealthiest sports clubs in the world, would give Australian-born Murdoch too much dominance of soccer and its broadcasting.


"I have not consulted on this but my immediate feeling is that it is not something that can just be allowed to happen without any studying of the consequences," Banks told BBC television.

"It is a matter, of course, for ministers responsible for competition policy but I would imagine alarm bells are ringing somewhere."

Joe Ashton, a Labour MP who chairs parliament's allparty football group, said there would be massive concern

among parliamentarians. "If parliament were sitting tomorrow, there would be a hundred MPs literally who would be complaining very strongly to the Department of Trade and Industry," he told BBC radio.

Andy Walsh, a spokesman for the Manchester United Supporters' Association, said fans would be disgusted if club

chairman Martin Edward accepted the offer, which could net him some 80 million pounds for his 14 per cent stake in the

"The fans I have spoken to this morning have demanded

that Martin Edwards sells to anyone other than Rupert Murdoch," he said.

Manchester stockbroker Neil Harding agreed that the deal would increase Murdoch's influence over English soccer. "Any premier league...just would not be the same without Manchester United," he said.

Murdoch has bought three major US sporting clubs -- the Los Angeles Dodgers baseball side, and the Los Angeles Lakers and New York Knicks basketball teams.

Manchester United, one of English soccer's most successful clubs, was floated on the London stock market in 1991 for 47 million pounds. In its latest financial year, it made profits of 27.6 million pounds. Funds were boosted by mas-

sive sales of shirts and other souvenirs to youngsters ambitious to follow in the footsteps of most famous former Red Devils, such as Bobby Charlton, Eric Cantona and George Best.

Ivanisevic served 21 aces, the last 117 mph on match point, and has dropped only one set in three matches. 'I'm hitting the ball great. I'm playing good tennis, any-

thing is possible." Ivanisevic said. "I'm looking forward to playing Patrick. It's going to be a great match. If I play great tennis he has to beat me. Ivanisevic would enjoy see-

ing a Sampras Agassi quarterfinal showdown.

"Pete is always looking good. Even when he doesn't look good. he looks good," he said. Andre is another great player. He's hitting the ball well. If they meet in the quarters it's going to be a hell of a match.

Britain's Greg Rusedski, last year's US Open runner-up, was ousted 4-6, 6-4, 5-7, 6-2, 6-4, by 21st-ranked Dutchman Jan Siemerink, who won on his fourth match point after three hours and 22 minutes with a 123-mph ace, his fastest of 10 in the match.

It was 13th seed Rusedski's

him in the tournament. Siemerink next faces 12thseeded Swede Jonas Bjorkman. who lost to Rusedski in the 1997 semifinal here. Siemerink is 1-4 against Bjorkman but lost their most recent meeting in July at Wimbledon in five sets.

"I'm going to be tough to beat," Rusedski said. "I'm hitting the ball better, getting more confidence. I feel as good as I did in '97".


