

Lancashire lift another trophy

MANCHESTER, England, Sept 8 (AP/Internet): Lancashire lifted their second trophy in 48 hours on Monday by scoring a 16-run victory over Hampshire at Old Trafford to clinch the Sunday League title.

Needing to avoid defeat to add the title to the NatWest Trophy secured by their victory over Derbyshire at Lord's on Sunday, Lancashire restricted Hampshire to 186-7 in reply to their 202.

Andrew Flintoff's quickfire 69 off 58 balls, including three sixes and six fours, propelled Lancashire to their total after they lost three early wickets.

Flintoff shared in a 110-run partnership in 16 overs with Graham Lloyd before his dismissal sparked a collapse with Lancashire losing their last seven wickets for 42 runs in 18 overs.

Hampshire began badly and lost openers John Stephenson and Giles White to leave them struggling on 53-2 after 17 overs.

Robin Smith and Will Kendall added 96 in 17 overs to put them on course to overhaul Lancashire's total until Glen Chapple and Peter Martin struck to virtually end their resistance.

Chapple had Smith caught behind attempting to pull after he had compiled 44 off 66 balls before Martin dismissed both Kendall and Mascarenhas in the same over to leave Hampshire needing a daunting 40 off the final four overs.

That total looked even more impossible with Martin having Nixon McLean caught in the deep and Wasim bowling Keech to leave Adrian Aymes and Shaun Udal, who finished unbeaten at the close, batting out the final over for the inevitable defeat.

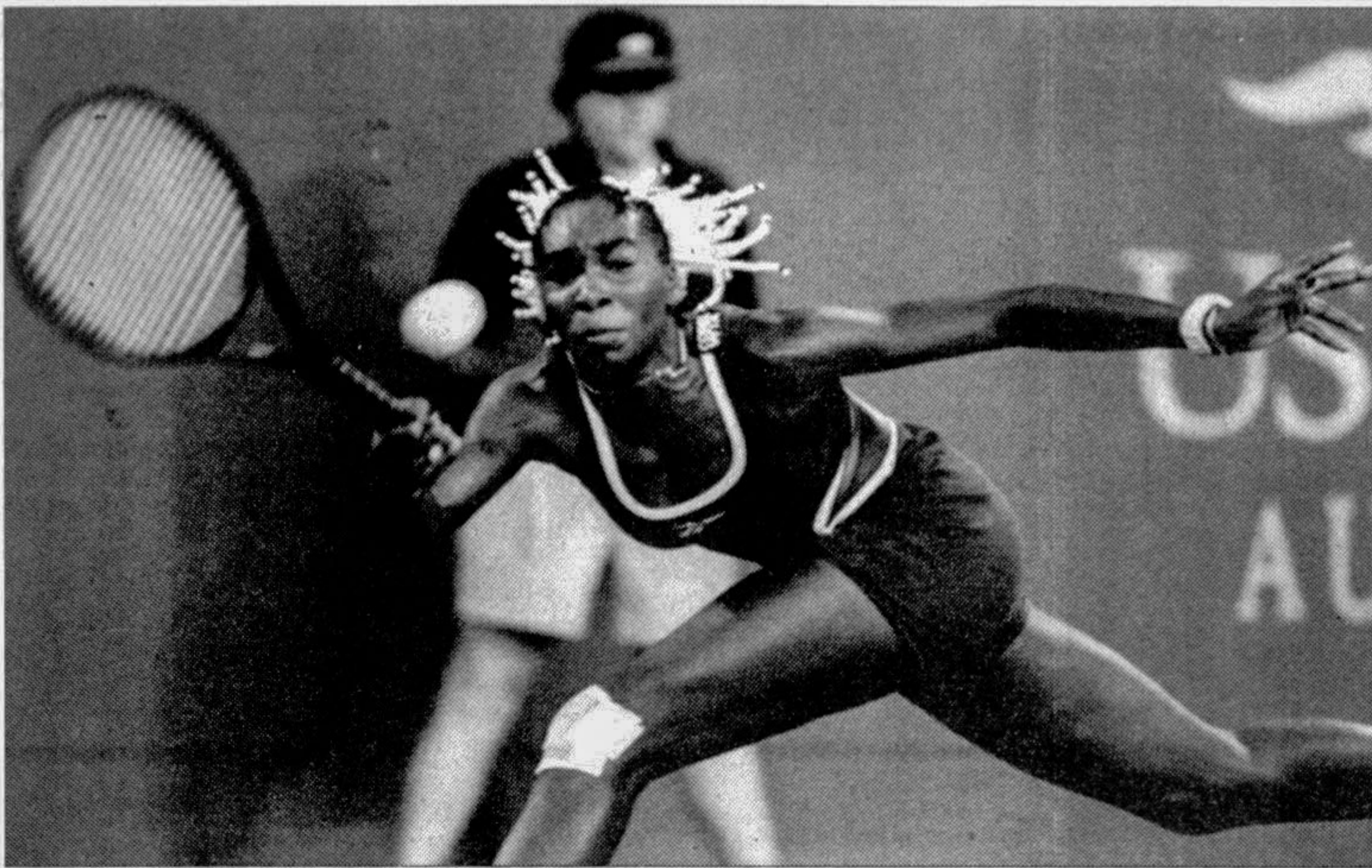
Muttiah in, Wasim out

LONDON, Sept 8: Sri Lanka's devastating off-spinner Muttiah Muralitharan is to replace Wasim Akram as Lancashire's overseas player next season, reports AFP.

The 27-year-old star has signed a one season contract with the winners of both the NatWest Trophy and AXA League title.

With Sri Lanka's commitments in next summer's World Cup Muralitharan will only be available to play half of Lancashire's championship matches and two thirds of their one-day games. He could also be needed for Sri Lanka's planned home Test series against Australia.

Muralitharan produced one of the best performances in Test history earlier this month by claiming 16 for 220, the fifth-best analysis of all time, to help Sri Lanka complete an emphatic 10-wicket victory over England at the Oval.

Venus visible on court

NEW YORK, Sept 8 (AP/Internet): Venus Williams hides nothing on the tennis court.

The peek-a-boo tennis outfits with daring midriff cutouts on each side are only the beginning for 18-year-old "Visible Venus" who advanced to the quarterfinals of the storm-tossed US Open on Monday with a 6-1, 7-6 (7-4) victory over Mary Pierce.

Sometimes she exults. Sometimes she sulks. Always she does it in public, her emotions out there for everyone to see.

Against Pierce, she dominated the first set, then waited out a storm that halted play for more than two hours. When play resumed, she had to hold off Pierce's determined comeback.

When it was over, Williams allowed herself a little victory celebration, something short of an end zone dance but an obvious declaration of joy in a difficult win. Then there was a raise-the-roof gesture to her entourage.

Her excitement was genuine, perhaps because it was a reversal of fortune against Pierce. The last time they played, Williams was forced to retire in the third set because of an aching knee.

"I was pretty happy because in my last match, I couldn't go against her," Williams said.

"It was terrible because I couldn't give my best. And I never really had that situation before where I couldn't move."

Revenge was not a motive, though. "I wanted to win this match because I did well here last year and I should be able to do well again," said Williams, who lost to Martina Hingis in the finals last year. "It would have been terrible if I had an injury again."

Not to worry. Williams played tough, tenacious tennis and enjoyed it thoroughly.

Every time she hit a big shot, especially in her comeback after trailing 4-1 in the tiebreaker, she grinned broadly. Once, she even helped the linesman on a close call with a palms down signal that the shot was good.

Every time she missed one, she grimaced. "There were no secrets. Sometimes, emotions are useless," Williams said. "But am

I emotional? Sure. Not too often."

And what about the dance? "I really shouldn't have done the dance," she decided. "I should have waited for later to dance. I don't know why I did it. I didn't plan to dance. I planned to win the second set really easy."

Pierce torpedoed that plan, forcing Williams in trouble throughout the set, forcing her to play her best tennis.

Williams liked the challenge. "You have to be a player to be here," she said. "I'm really going after it. I'm more focused. I'm trying not to make errors. I want to get away from that, making things together for myself than they should be."

In that respect there was a major contrast between the sets. Williams had 33 unforced errors for the match, 31 in that troublesome second set.

"I don't think I played as well in the second set," Williams said. "I think that I made more errors. I don't think I played exactly the same."

"But still, I had to play my game, no matter what she was going to do. And it's not the easiest thing to play error-free. And sometimes you just have to get your shots. You just can't let someone step up before you do."

Sampras gets rid of Safin

NEW YORK, Sept 8 (AP/Reuters): Pete Sampras strolled off the court after overpowering yet another young challenger. And an apparent runaway victory turned into a dramatic triumph of heart and courage for fifth seeded Venus Williams as she held off the challenge of France's Mary Pierce 6-1, 7-6 to earn a berth in the quarterfinals.

On a Monday when thunderstorms turned the US Open into Wimbledon West, Sampras reached the quarterfinals with a convincing win over a dangerous opponent.

But Andre Agassi was struggling to avoid elimination in a match against Karol Kucera in which Agassi mocked his opponent and the players postured at each other across the net. Kucera was up two sets to one when rain halted play for the night.

Agassi, who had complained that Kucera was stalling by practising his service toss before hitting serves, began mimicking Kucera's practice tosses. The two then exchanged moonballs, lofting soft shots back and forth.

Kucera led 6-3, 6-3, 6-7, 0-3 when play was stopped. It was the second rain delay of the match, which will resume Tuesday afternoon.

Sampras had 18 aces and never lost his serve in a 6-4, 6-3, 6-2 win that included a 2 1/4-hour rain break, turning his power lunch with Marat Safin into a late-afternoon snack for the world's top player.

"I was cracking it pretty hard throughout the match," Sampras said. "I got the serve going, which has been a little bit up and down throughout this past week. Today it seemed like it clicked."

The top-seeded Sampras, a four-time US Open champion, next will face the winner of the match between No 8 Agassi and No 9 Kucera.

Sampras lost only 20 points on his serve in the match and closed out his 600th career win with three consecutive aces — including one at 135 mph (216 kph). He won 41 of 48 points on his first serve in the match.

Safin, 18, who opened crowds at this year's French Open with a string of upsets en route to the fourth round in his Grand Slam debut, showed off plenty of power, including 10 aces. But he was no match for the steady Sampras.

"He's very talented, but also very young. The first set I couldn't believe the pace of his serve. I really had a hard time reading it. The talent is there, maybe he just needs to tone it down a little bit," Sampras said.

"He's 18 years old and he's got plenty of years to learn from mistakes. My game at 18 was pretty bad."

Agassi was pumped up. With his wife, actress Brooks Shields, cheering wildly, he

held for 5-5, pumping his fist at Kucera and yelling "Come on!" The eighth-seeded American then ran off eight straight points to win the 12th game and take a 4-0 lead in the tiebreaker

before converting his first set point of the rainy evening on a blistering forehand into the corner.

The momentum held through the opening three games of the fourth set, before a light mist turned into steady rain.

Williams was facing a likely third set trailing 4-1 in the tiebreaker before she rattled off the last six points to claim the breaker 7-4 for a hard-fought one hour, 35 minute win.

But Williams could not wrap up the match, dropping her serve at 30-40 for the first time in the match to set up the climactic tie-breaker.

Earlier, South African Amanda Coetzer beat longtime nemesis Conchita Martinez, the seventh seed, 4-6, 6-4, 6-2 to earn a spot in the quarterfinals for the third time in the last five years.

"It's very nice. Definitely she's been a very tough opponent for me my whole career," said the 13th-seeded Coetzer, who had won one of 13 previous meetings with the Spaniard.

"It's great, especially because it's at a Grand Slam," Coetzer said. "I was pained by her 57 unforced errors and a sore neck throughout the two hour, 38 minute match."

"It was difficult for me to play my own game because I was injured," said Martinez, who had a trainer work on her neck several times during changovers.

American defeated 10th seeded Wimbledon runner-up Nathalie Tauziat 6-1, 6-4.

Williams' quarterfinal opponent will be No 4 Spaniard Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario, who won 7-6, 6-3 over No 15 Anna Kournikova of Russia.

Fredericks pulls out of C'wealth

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 8: Namibian sports officials Tuesday expressed shock at the withdrawal of their star and key athlete, Frankie Fredericks, from the Commonwealth Games, reports AP.

"He was our main hope," said Daan Nel, Chef de Mission of the Namibian contingent. He said he would be sending a letter to the Games' organising committee to inform them of Fredericks' withdrawal.

"We are shocked by his decision. The athletes feel the same way. He is a role model for them and suddenly that has been washed away," Nel was quoted as saying by Bernama news agency.

Fredericks reportedly was upset about Namibia's prime minister describing the country's new world boxing champion, Harry Simon, as Namibia's greatest athlete because Fredericks had never won an Olympic title.

Namibian officials thought Fredericks was affected by the tight scheduling of events in the lead up to the Commonwealth Games, which include the World Cup and Nelson Mandela competitions in South Africa, but had been confident that Fredericks would compete in Kuala Lumpur.

"This is really a personal thing. Fredericks was put in a tight situation and, in spite of that, we hoped he would have come here," Nel said.

"I think, though, we must be human about this. He is entitled to his own choices."

Fredericks was to have run the 100-metre sprint and 4x100-metre relay event here, a rare double for him in international competition. He normally competes in the 100- and 200-metre dashes, but with these events scheduled close together at the Games, he had decided to skip the 200-metre, the event in which he was crowned world champion in 1993.

The Namibian 4x100-metre team will still compete, but with a considerably weaker combination.

"I don't think they will achieve anything this time," said Nel. With Fredericks' withdrawal, spectators will miss seeing one of the best sprinters. He is ranked third on the all-time list for the 100-metre with a personal best of 9.86 seconds. Fredericks is also the second fastest 200-metre runner in history, behind the world record holder Michael Johnson of the United States.
