

Cruyff Franz's Rupert owns Red Devils

FRANKFURT, Sept 9: Franz Beckenbauer once again ruled himself out for the job of Germany's soccer coach Wednesday 'and suggested Johan Cruyff would be the ideal man for the post, reports AP.

But the front runner for the job appeared to be Ulli Stielike. a junior coach with the German soccer federation (DFB).

Beckenbauer, a former star player who guided Germany to their third and last World Cup title in 1990, still exerts great influence in German soccer.

Already in a slump after the ouster in the quarterfinals of the World Cup this summer, German soccer was thrown into further turmoil when Berti Vogts resigned as the national team coach Monday.

DFB officials have been unable to find a successor, with several candidates turning down the job.

"It remains so that I am definitely not available," Beckenbauer wrote Wednesday in his column in the mass-circulation newspaper Bild.

"The coaching job was a part of my life that has been closed for good," Beckenbauer said.

Thais after Brazilian coach

BANGKOK, Sept 9: Thai football authorities today said they will invite a Brazilian coach to train the national squad after accepting the resignation of both the team's manager and coach, reports AFP.

The announcement by the Football Association of Thailand (FAT) comes amid mounting criticism of the side following a farcical Tiger Cup match against Indonesia in Vietnam last week.

The association committee met Tuesday and accepted the resignation of team manager Thirachai Vutthitham and coach Vittaya Laohakul after the team tried to deliberately lose the game. The association will invite

Brazilian coach Carlos Alberto Cavalho, who took Thailand to the fourth place in the 1990 Asian Games in Beijing. If the Brazilian agrees, his

first tournament would be the 13th Asian Games in Bangkok this December. FAT chairman Vijit Getkaew

will take over as acting manager until an appropriate replacement can be found.

However, an official from the football association declined to comment on the resignation of any Thai players. adding that the list of players for the Games would be announced on Thursday.

No more matches in Stockholm

STOCKHOLM, Sept 9 (Reuters/ Internet): No more international club matches will be held in Stockholm because of the high police costs of manning them, Swedish Football Association president Lars-Ake Lagrell said on Wednesday.

"We give up. We have not made a formal decision yet but the mood in Stockholm is easy to interpret." Lagrell told the daily newspaper Svenska Dagbladet.

"It's a matter of politics and internal fights in the police core about money. There is a lot

of grumbling. Policing of last May's European Cup Winners' Cup final in

Stockholm in which Chelsea beat VfB Stuttgart 1-0 cost police an estimated five million Swedish crowns (\$631.200), with about 1,000 police on duty. About 13,000 British and 4.000 German fans descended

per cent. In the seven years since United launched on the Stock Exchange the shrewd Edwards has cut his stake in the club considerably, making millions

of pounds on the way. When Murdoch approached Edwards with a view to him selling his stake his share had dropped to 14 per cent - a figure still big enough to make him the key figure in negotiations over the deal.

For Edwards the sale is a reward for his business skills that have guided United to huge corporate status in less than 10 years.

And he will be thankful that two previous efforts at selling the club failed. He came close to relinquishing control to Murdoch's former media mogul ri-

val Robert Maxwell in 1984. The ex-head of the Mirror Group balked at raising his 10 million bid to 15 million pounds and the deal collapsed.

Then in 1989 the Carlisle chairman Michael Knighton also attempted a 10 million pounds takeover only to pull out "for the good of the club."

So Edwards' failed bids to sell the club have ended up with him enjoying a cash bonanza and a chance to continue the Edwards dynasty with the offer of a seat on the board by Mur-

A seat many believe could become untenable if the unforgiving United fans deliver their promises of showing their displeasure at the man they feel

sold them out. Manchester United fans vowed on Wednesday to fight every inch of the way to stop their club being taken over by Murdoch.

"We call on the board of Manchester United to have second thoughts about what they are doing and reject the offer,' said association chairman Andy Walsh.

"Mr Murdoch may have walked all over the United States of America and the rest of the world, but he's not going to walk all over Manchester."

Seoul for unified host



(Reuters/ Internet): South Korea's ruling party is pushing for a uni-

fied soccer team with North Korea and wants the Stalinist country to host some of the matches in the 2002 World Cup finals, a party document released on Wednesday said.

President Kim Dae-jung's party, the National Congress for New Politics, released the document to brief its lawmakers of the party's position on various issues ahead of a National Assembly session, a

party spokesman said. The document said the World Cup finals "will create an opportunity for national unity and the Korean people's unity" and that the party was pushing to "lure North Korea's participation through forming a single team and holding events in the

North". The document also said that in order to hold matches in North Korea, the South would have to reduce the 10 cities already designated to host the finals and could do that if some cities facing financial difficulties gave up their seats.

South Korea and Japan are scheduled to co-host the upcoming 2002 FIFA World Cup finals. Former FIFA president Joao Havelange has urged North Ko-

past as a bridge between the two Koreas which sent a united team to the 1991 World Youth Soccer championships and fielded table tennis teams for international tournaments in the early 1990s.

The National Congress position on including North Korea is in line with President Kim's

"Sunshine Policy" which aims to open up the reclusive communist North through expanded cultural and business exchanges.

North Korea on Wednesday celebrated the 50th anniversary of the founding of the state, and has recently confirmed the power of its enigmatic leader Kim Jong-il.




