

C'wealth hockey Pakistan beat Kenya

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 9: Penalty specialist Imran Yousuf scored four goals Wednesday to lead Pakistan to a 5-4 victory over minnows Kenya in a Commonwealth Games field hockey preliminary match, reports AP.

Kenya had a chance to level the match in the final minute but failed to convert a penalty corner.

Yousuf was in supreme form, converting three penalty strokes and one penalty corner as Pakistan beat back an impressive challenge from the Kenyans.

Pakistan, a four-time world champion, led 5-2 but had to withstand a fierce comeback.

Kenya's tough-tackling defence kept out the favourites until the 19th minute, before Yousuf opened the count on a penalty stroke from a foul on a Pakistani forward by Kenyan goalkeeper Jotham Omari.

Kenya's Raymond Ondong then scored the first of his two penalty corner goals to equalise in the 26th minute. Yousuf converted a second penalty stroke to make it 2-1 in the 31st minute after centre forward Khalid Mohammed was brought down by the Kenyan goalkeeper.

Pakistan scored their lone field goal six minutes into the roof of the cage and two minutes later he converted another penalty stroke to give Pakistan set piece penalty corner conversion.

Libregts set to sign contract with Nigeria LAGOS, Sept 9 (Reuters/Internet): Dutchman Thijs Libregts is set to sign a four year contract to coach Nigeria, the head of the Nigerian Football Association said on Wednesday.

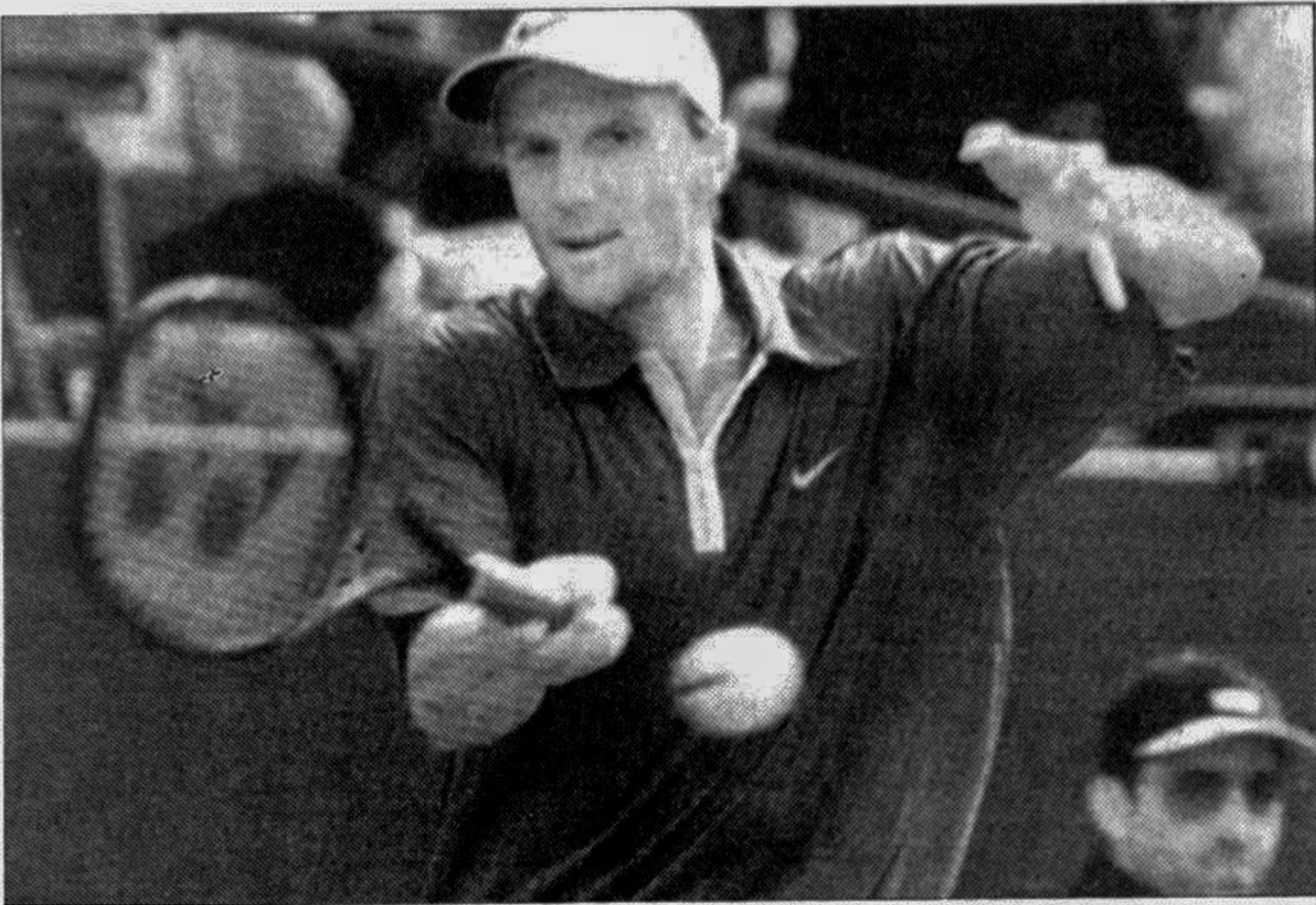
"Libregts will arrive here tonight to seal the deal and sign the contract papers on Thursday," said Abdulmumini Aminu, who gave no financial details.

Last week, Libregts, 57, said he would come to Nigeria to finalise the deal. The former coach of the Dutch national team was approached last month to replace Serbian Bora Milutinovic, whose contract ended after the World Cup finals in July.

Aminu said he expected Libregts to take the national team to new heights, adding: "We believe in him, that he can do it."

As Olympic champions, much was expected from Nigeria at the World Cup but their campaign ended in the second round with a 4-1 defeat by Denmark.

Aminu said Libregts' first assignment would be preparing the team for the 2000 African Cup of Nations in Zimbabwe. Nigeria face Burkina Faso on October 4 in their first qualifying match.

US OPEN NOTEBOOK



NEW YORK, Sept 9 (AP/Internet): The winning trophy at the Chase Championships will be named after tennis great Billie Jean King.

King founded the WTA and became its first president in 1974, and led the fight that gave women equal prize money with men at the US Open.

"The trophy is a tribute to all of the women who paved the way for the tour," King said. "I truly hope it will be a bridge from our generation to the future players of this great sport."

King's win over Bobby Riggis in the "Battle of the Sexes" on Sept. 20, 1973, was among the highlights of her career, attracting the largest audience at the time for a single tennis match.

In all, she won 39 Grand Slam titles, including six Wimbledon and four US Open singles titles.

The season-ending Chase Championships brings together the top 16 singles players and the top eight double teams. This year's event will be played Nov. 16-22 at Madison Square Garden.

ARANTXA EDGES JORDAN BY 10 Score is Arantxa Sanchez Vicario 1, Michael Jordan 0.

Sanchez Vicario, the 1994 US Open champion and three-time winner of the French Open, will receive Spain's prestigious "Principe de Asturias" award for her lifetime achievement in tennis.

Sanchez Vicario was informed of the award by another Spaniard, Juan Antonio Samaranch, president of the International Olympic Committee and a member of the voting panel.

"This is a great honour," Sanchez Vicario said. "I have been nominated several times before and when I least expect it, I get it."

Sanchez Vicario also led Spain to the Fed Cup victory four times since 1991.

The award is the Spanish equivalent of the Nobel Prize and Sanchez Vicario is only the third female athlete to receive this honour.

Sanchez Vicario edged Jordan by 10 votes.

PARENT AND PLAYER More than 97 per cent of junior players said they feel imposed pressure to win, while 53 per cent reported their parents put "a little" pressure on them, according to a survey released Tuesday.

Rodney Harmon, director of the US Tennis Association's Multicultural Development program, pointed out the differences between European countries and the United States in developing players.

"The survey, on the relationship between junior players and their parents, also found little distinction between amateur and pro abroad, which allows for a competitive advantage for foreign players in the junior rankings."

And more than 90 per cent of the players questioned believe that foreign players are not more talented but give more priority to tennis than to schoolwork.

Despite the number of personal coaches, tennis academies and developmental programs, a majority of the families endorsed the need for better guidance in dealing with the competitive system as well as the pressure.

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 9 (Reuters/AP/AF): Blood sausage, spotted dick, steak and kidney pie, in the heyday of the British empire these were the breakfast, lunch and dinner of Commonwealth Games champions.

Not any more. Now most teams travel with a nutritionist spouting the merits of isotonic concoctions to combat dehydration and healthy diets to maintain strength and stamina.

Nevertheless, feeding the 4,000 athletes from 70 countries and territories in Kuala Lumpur for the 16th Commonwealth Games opening on Friday is a major challenge.

They have escaped the banalities of British cuisine for an east meets west fusion of spicy Malay curries and an enormous international menu in the Games Village cafeteria.

For the Village chief it's round the clock feast.

"They're all consuming it twenty-four hours a day," said head chef Zainuddin Ismail.

"At the end of the day I start replenishing the food and then I realise there is no end to the day."

There are six meals prepared a day in the athletes Village, using up to 500 loaves of bread, about 500 kg (1,100 lb) of rice, 1,000 kg of chicken and 600 kg of meat per meal, Ismail said.

Hosts' GOOD START Too seeds Malaysia took just 90 minutes today to wrap up their Commonwealth Games badminton match against Jamaica and set their sights firmly on another gold medal.

That was the time it took the Malaysian men to get a winning 3-0 lead, a margin soon extended to 5-0 without the loss of a game.

Although this was a hollow victory in which a world class team conceded only 21 points in 10 games against one of the lesser badminton nations, it was significant because the Malaysians had begun a journey down a path which appears to have been created for them.

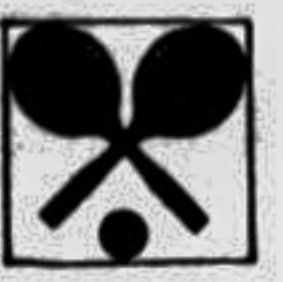

"Rafter is playing very good tennis at the moment. He's confident. He's not going to be tough to beat," he said.

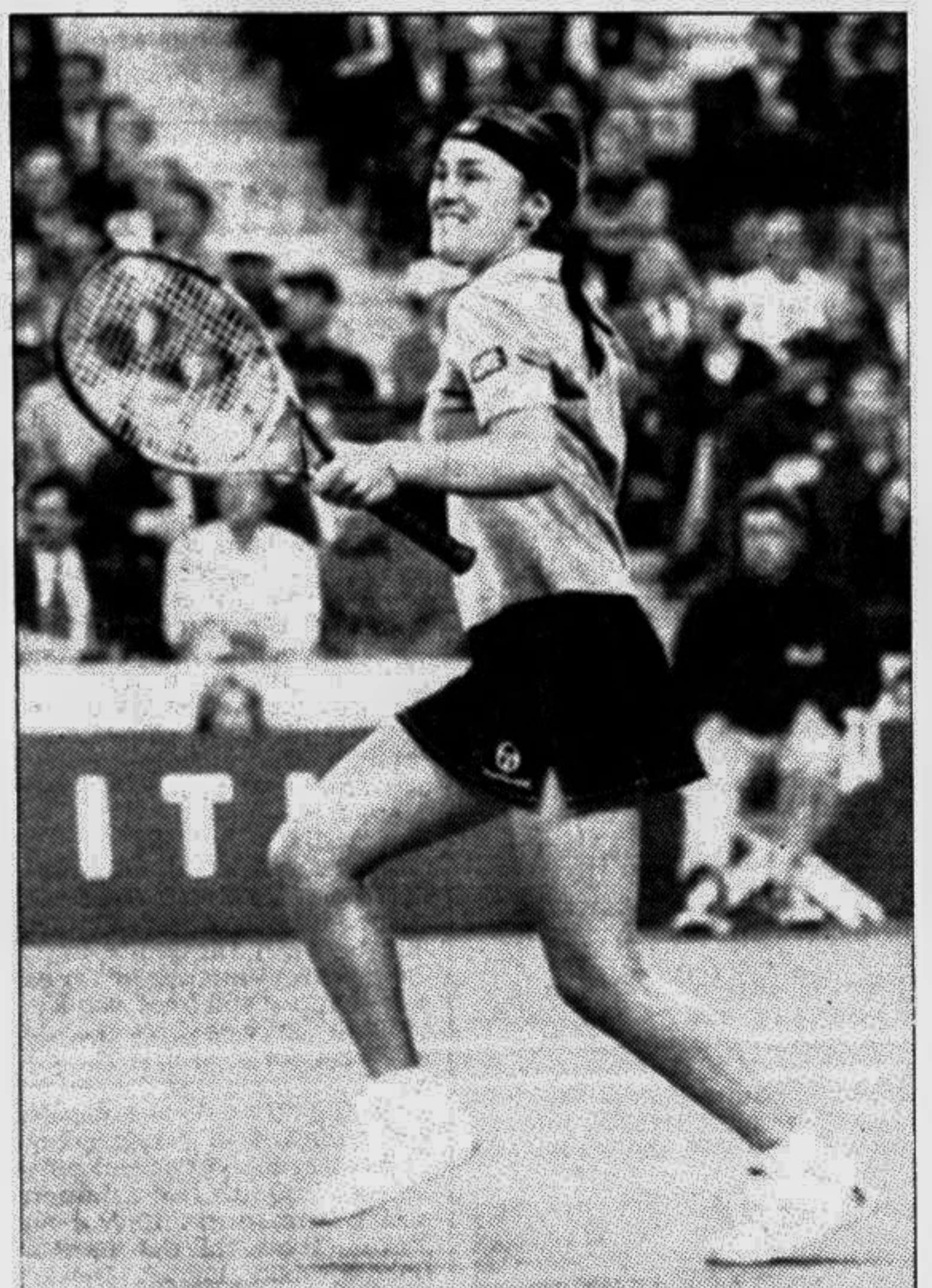
Australia's Rafter is now three matches away from making former world number one John McEnroe eat his words after the American described him as "a one Slam wonder."

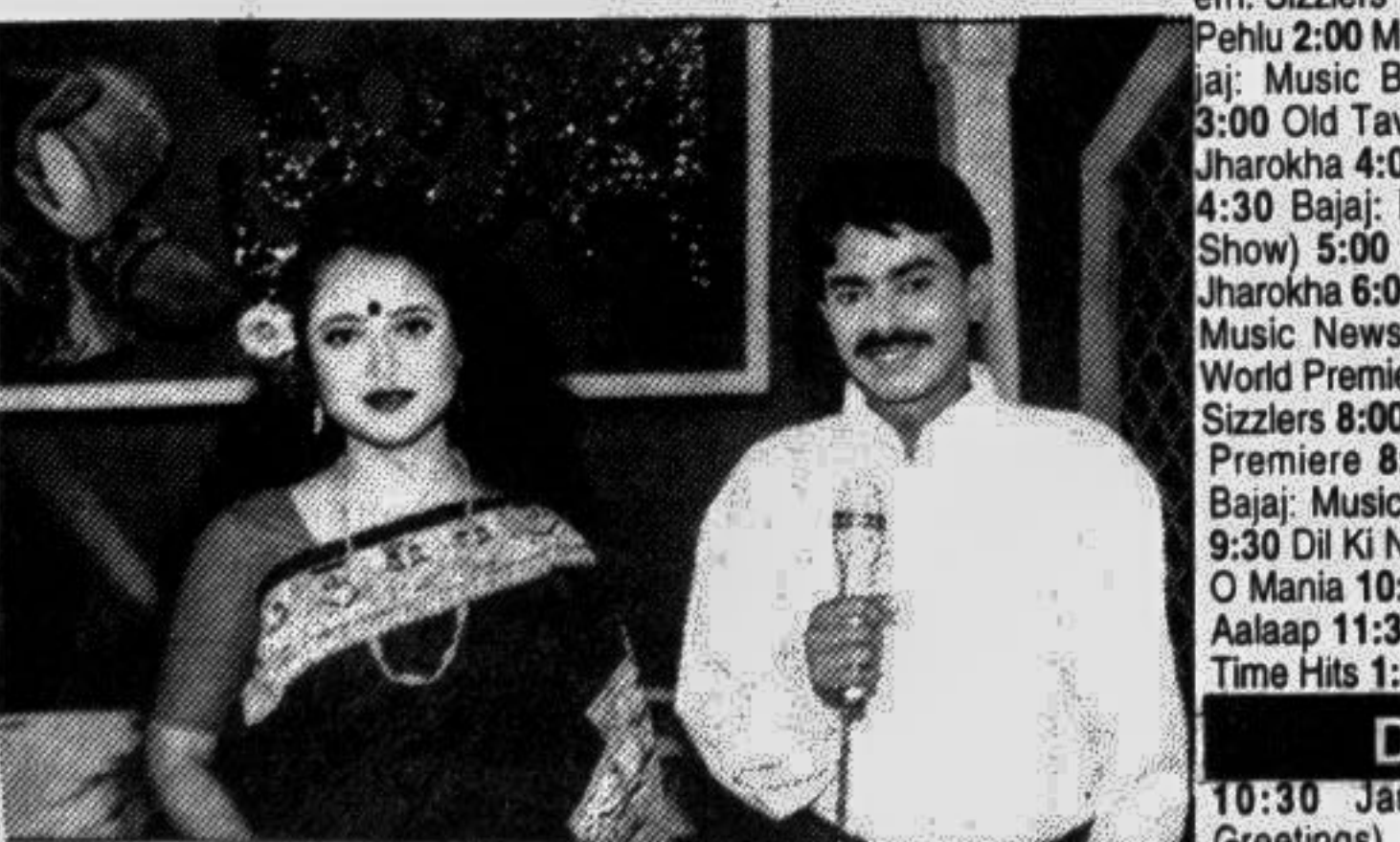
