



\$ 330m sought from IMF, WB as emergency **BOP** support

Bangladesh has sought over 330 million US dollars in emergency balance of payment support from two donor agencies for financing massive foodgrain imports.

Official sources told APB yesterday that the government sought some 130 million US dollars from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) under its emergency assistance facility

The facility is intended to improve the balance of payment situation of Bangladesh.

The government had initially sought 200 million dollars from the World Bank, but later raised the amount due to increased need for import financing for the exigencies of floods, the sources said.




