"It was decided after talks between both parties to end the contract," Anderlecht deputy manager Robert De Pot told the news agency.

He said deputy coaches Frank Vercauteren and Jean Dockx would take over until a new coach was appointed, but gave no details.

Haan, a former Anderlecht player, had signed an 18-month contract last December, two months after he was sacked by Dutch club Feyenoord.

Anderlecht, who were jeered off their own pitch on Wednesday, have made an appalling start to the season.

Before last weekend's 3-0 victory at Germinal Ekeren they had failed to win any of their first five league games, a run which saw them slump to the bottom of the Belgian first division for the first time in their history.

SA to see three more coaches

JOHANNESBURG, Sept 17 (Reuters/ Internet): Three more candidates are to be interviewed for the position of South African national soccer coach before a final decision is made next week, officials said on Thursday.

South African football federation officials will talk on Friday to former Dutch international Ruud Krol and Gordon Igesund, coach of South African club Manning Rangers.

They also hope to interview Carlos Alberto Pareira, coach of Brazil's World Cup winning team in 1994, before making a final decision next week. He was coach of Saudi Arabia before being fired after this year's World Cup.

There are three other candidates for the job, which became vacant after the World Cup when the contract of Frenchman Philippe Troussier ran out. Those candidates have already been interviewed for the position.

The favourite remains Ron Atkinson, who has extensive experience in the English Premfer League and who has also worked in Spain.

The other candidates are South African under-23 coach Ephraim Mashaba and Trott Moloto, who is the country's caretaker coach for next month's African Nations Cup qualifying match against Angola in Johannesburg.
