Flo-Jo's funeral on Saturday

LOS ANGELES, Sept 24: Florence Griffith-Joyner, triple Olympic gold medalist and women's world record holder at 100 and 200 metres, will be buried on Saturday, it was announced Wednesday, reports AFP.

Griffith-Joyner was found dead at her home Monday in suburban Mission Viejo, having died in her sleep of what was initially described as a heart seizure similar to one she suffered two years ago. She was 38.

Griffith-Joyner won the 100 and 200 metres at the Seoul Olympics and was on the 1988 gold medal 4x100m relay, she set a 100m world record of 10.49 seconds in the US Olympic trials and a 200m world record of 21.34 seconds at Seoul.

She married 1984 Olympic triple jump champion Al Joyner in 1987, becoming the sister-in-law of heptathlon world record holder Jackie Joyner-Kersey.

She and Joyner have a daughter, Mary Ruth, who is seven years old.

Family members announced through Free Kick Promotions that funeral services would be held at Saddleback Valley Community Church in Lake Forest, California, South of Los Angeles. A 10 am service was to be open to the public, but the burial was to be private.

The public could also pay their respects at the Angelus Funeral Home in Los Angeles on Friday.

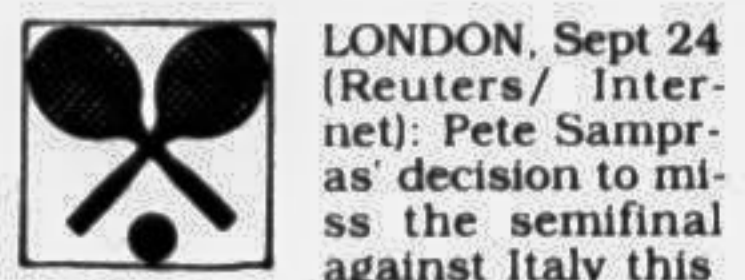
Old friends and relatives held a candlelight vigil Tuesday night in South-Central Los Angeles to honour a girl who grew up in the Watts Housing projects, made good, but never forgot her roots.

"She never forgot about Watts," said Sonya Robertson, who went to high school with Griffith Joyner and graduated with her in 1978.

"That's why she meant so much to us. She never got high and mighty. She remained down to earth, no matter what she accomplished."

One-time schoolmate Cheryl Johnson added: "We were all raised in a poverty area, and to see someone like her make it, someone who was like us, was wonderful, she made us believe."

Davis Cup at a crossroads



LONDON, Sept 24 (Reuters/Internet): Pete Sampras' decision to miss the semifinal against Italy this weekend could be a catalyst for the Davis Cup.

Only Wimbledon outranks the Cup in popularity among tennis fans worldwide and the game is preparing to celebrate the centenary of the men's team tournament next year.

While the Cup's place in tennis history is secure, officials are aware the competition may have to adapt, and quickly, to retain its place in the affections of the game's driving forces.

"We are looking at a number of attributes of the Cup and considering changes and discussing changes with various audiences - the players, television and sponsors," said a spokesman for the International Tennis Federation.

"We have a very strong brand in the Davis Cup but we cannot afford to be complacent. Times are changing... we want it to be viable in five to 10 years' time."

The ITF has instituted regular discussions with Cup captains - the first was at Wimbledon this year - to discuss possible changes to the format and timing of the Cup, which has four rounds every year in the top (World) group including the final.

Traditionalists believe altering the format of the Cup would destroy its unique appeal to spectators and players. But television companies complain having a five-set competition spread over three days is unwieldy and difficult to schedule.

In a small step to adapt to television's demands, qualifying events in next year's Davis Cup will introduce a "no advantage" scoring system for the first time.

When the game reaches deuce, the winner of the next point takes the game.

More radical changes are in the wind.

Some critics, including Sampras, think the Cup should follow the route of golf's Ryder Cup and be played every two years.

Others believe first round matches, or the two opening singles on a Friday, should be reduced to three sets to streamline television coverage.

But half of the Cup's allure is that players have to show as much mental and physical endurance as skill to win, especially when playing in front of the U.S.

Sampras, Andre Agassi and Michael Chang have decided not to play in the Milwaukee semifinal against Italy, weakening the team's chances of winning the Cup for a record 32nd time.

Agassi is angry that Milwaukee was chosen as the venue and has a prior charity commitment. Chang is not a Davis Cup regular and suffered a terrible weekend when the United States were whipped 5-0 by Sweden in last year's final.

Sampras' pride is still raw after he was forced to pull out of that final with a leg injury.

He blamed the injury on playing one tournament too many at the end of a long year, an age-old complaint among top players who say setting aside four weeks a year for Davis Cup tennis is too big a commitment if ranking points are not at stake.

Sampras said he was also disappointed with the lack of enthusiasm for Davis Cup tennis in his home country, harking back to the 1995 final win over Russia in Moscow.

Milwaukee was chosen as the venue for the semifinal to try and spread the Davis Cup gospel away from the tennis hotbeds.

As in many sports, a strong commitment to American tennis is vital if the Davis Cup is to maintain its standing and continue to attract sponsorship and television revenue.

In men's games not overlaid with charisma and headlines, the top players must turn out regularly to ensure the 16-nation World Group showcases the best tennis can produce.

Boris Becker, Yannick Noah and Arthur Ashe turned out for their countries in the Davis Cup before being asked to guide the teams when their greatest days were over.

In Australia, Chile, Sweden and most other countries there is no commitment problem among players whom fans expect to play Davis Cup for their country.

Former Australian captain and player Neale Fraser is one of those traditionalists who now believe the time may be ripe for a change to adapt to pay-for-view and digital television.

"I am gradually coming round to the idea that we should play best-of-three set matches on Friday, with best-of-five set matches in the doubles and in any live rubber on Sunday.

"Except for the final, that is. I think that the Davis Cup final must have best-of-five set matches in all live rubbers," Fraser said.

Demands for change are also the product of increasing disenchantment among top players said it was inappropriate to speculate.

Bob Kersey said Griffith-Joyner had no history of heart troubles. "She only suffered from exercise-induced asthma and migraine headaches."

In 1989, US sprinter Darrell Robinson said in the German magazine Stern that he bought banned growth hormones for Griffith-Joyner. Robinson was paid 25,000 US dollars for his interview with the magazine.

Griffith-Joyner had denied Robinson's charge, calling him a "compulsive, crazy, lying lunatic."

Arne Ljungqvist, vice president of the International Amateur Athletics Federation and the organisation's top anti-doping official, said it would be unfair to speculate about Griffith-Joyner and performance-enhancing drugs.

"It's very unfortunate for sport if one is accused of doping just for being an extremely good athlete," he said.

Kournikova moves into qtrs

TOKYO, Sept 24: Russian teenage sensation Anna Kournikova breezed past Wang Shi-Ting today to make a quarter-final meeting against Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario in the Princess Cup tennis tournament, reports AFP.

The 17-year-old Russian star, who caused a sensation by reaching the Wimbledon semifinals last season, made quick work of Taiwan's top player 6-0, 6-4.

Sanchez-Vicario, fresh from Spain's victory over Switzerland in the Fed Cup last weekend, showed no ill effects from her long trip and hard work, scoring a 6-0, 6-4 win over Elena Likhovtseva of Russia.

Kournikova, who needed only 16 minutes to take the top-set first set, failed to hold her serve to go down 0-2 in the second set.

But she was quick to break back in the third and never faced a single break point, taking chances to charge to the net, and finished off the 50-minute match using lightning shots to force Wang to make errors.

Dunn sets new world mark

PERTH, Australia, Sept 24: Commonwealth Games gold medalist Matthew Dunn broke his second world record in two weeks at the Australian short course swimming championships Thursday, reports AP.

The 25-year-old shaved more than a second off the old mark for the 400-metre individual medley by winning in a time of 4 minutes, 4.24 seconds in the 25-metre pool.

The previous record of 4:05.41 was held by Martel Wouda of the Netherlands.

Dunn was also a member of the world record-breaking 4x200 freestyle relay team in Kuala Lumpur last week.

Dunn paid tribute to his coach Gennadi Touretski following the swim.

"Over the last few years I've been finding it easier and easier to back up," he said. "I suppose it's got a lot to do with Gennadi Touretski's mentality of becoming more professional."

"I've been preparing myself for it over the last week or so, it was something I really wanted to target."

Tyson begins psychological tests

BOSTON Sept 24 (AP/Internet): Mike Tyson is being tested by a team of Massachusetts General Hospital doctors to determine whether he is psychologically fit to return to the ring.

The suspended former heavyweight champion arrived in Boston on Wednesday to begin the psychological and neurological tests ordered by the Nevada Athletic Commission, which gave him a list of three facilities to administer the tests, and a deadline of next Monday for doctors to submit reports on his mental state.

Besides MGH, the other facilities were the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn., and C.F. Menninger Memorial Hospital in Topeka, Kan.

The examination was ordered by the commission following a six-hour hearing Saturday on Tyson's request for reinstatement. He has been banned since the commission revoked his license July 9, 1997 for biting Evander Holyfield's ears in their championship fight.

"We're putting together a complete evaluation, like any evaluation involving the ability of people to return to work," Dr. Ronald Schouten, who heads MGH's law and psychiatry program and is overseeing Tyson's comprehensive work-up, told The Boston Globe.

"It's a very sensitive matter, so we're being very careful about confidentiality," said Schouten. Schouten would not discuss details of the exams, or say when the results might be completed.

Mark Ratner, spokesman for the Nevada commission, told the Boston Herald the battery of tests was expected to last three days.

A letter sent to Tyson and his advisers on Monday from the Nevada commission said

"What we expect from the team that will be evaluating him is a team approach to Mike's cognitive abilities and his psychological abilities, and his ability to go back into the ring," Dr. Edwin "Flip" Homansky, chairman of the medical advisory board to the Nevada commission, told The Globe.

Ex-Arsenal scout fined

LONDON, Sept 24 (Reuters/Internet): Former Arsenal chief scout Steve Burtenshaw was fined 7,500 pounds and ordered to pay costs by the English F.A. on Thursday after he admitted accepting money in a 1992 transfer deal.

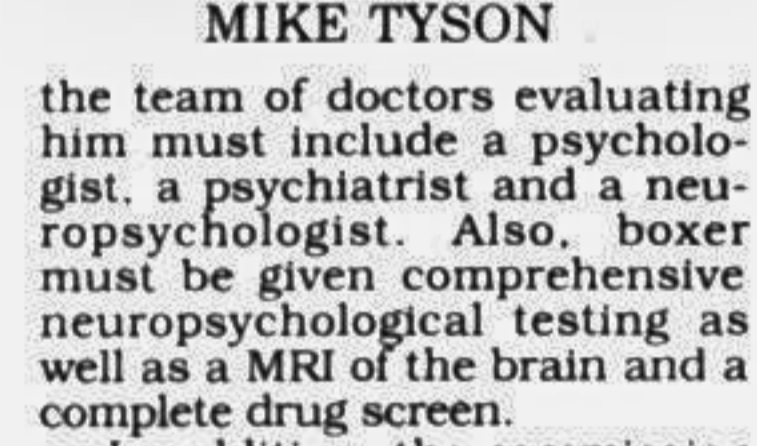
BBC radio quoted the 62-year-old lawyer as saying the punishment was unduly severe and he was considering an appeal.

The F.A. said this month that Burtenshaw, now with first division Queen's Park Rangers, admitted receiving 35,000 pounds from an agent in connection with the transfer of John Jensen from Danish club Brondby to Arsenal.

The much-publicised deal was one of the transfers which led to the sacking of Arsenal manager George Graham in 1995 in a so-called "bung" (unauthorised payment) scandal.
