Donors urge govt

Gear up distribution of VGF cards

By Reaz Ahmad

Donors have urged the government to expedite its postflood relief operation following press reports on non-distribution of VGF (vulnerable group feeding) cards among flood affected people in the countryside, sources said.

According to a government plan, some 40 lakh families are supposed to be provided with cards which would ensure supply of 16 kilograms of foodgrains per month to each family in October and November under an extended VGF pro-

With only two days left for the beginning of October, the government is left with the huge task of distributing 27 lakh VGF cards in addition to 13 lakh cards distributed in August and September.

Against this backdrop, donors and the UN system operating in Bangladesh have urged the government to gear up its post-flood relief operation

among the people-in-need. "We're fully aware of press reports regarding flood-affected peoples' complaint of not getting VGF cards. The government must accelerate the card distribution process as, so far, only a little share of the cards have been distributed," said one UN official in Dhaka.

A senior official of the relief ministry, when contacted, told The Daily Star yesterday that the government would make sure that deputy commissioners send the VGF cards to unions by early October. Then, unionlevel committees, headed by See Page 12 Col 1

Civil society should act as watchdog: President

President Shahabuddin Ahmed believes that the 'civil society' should see whether relief goods are properly distributed among the flood victims and post-flood rehabilitation work is carried out prop-

This is important because the government is claiming that the relief work is being carried out 'satisfactorily', while the Opposition is claiming that the relief operation is being done 'perfunctorily', the President observed.

He made this observation while opening a day-long seminar on "Civil Society and Democracy in Bangladesh" yesterday morning. The Bangladesh Institute of International and Strategic Studies organised the seminar. Barrister Syed Ishtiaq Ahmed chaired the inaugural session, while Major General Mustafa Kamaluddin of BIISS delivered the address of welcome. The President said that this year's prolonged flood had caused enormous damages

to life and property, particularly to standing crops. "But instead of cooperation,

the government and the Opposition are blaming each other as if the flood has been brought about by some conspiratorial means", the President said. "It is here where the civil so-

ciety must step in and see that relief goods are properly distributed, sufferings of the people are mitigated and post-flood rehabilitation work is carried out properly" He termed the civil society 'a

watch dog' that 'represents ordinary members of a society'. They are either organised professional groups or unorganised people, such as the rural poor. the President said "A civil sociis meither pro-government nor anti-government; it is in fact a pro-people entity".




