SCF to submit memo to Education Minister Oct 4

Samajtantrik Chhatra Front (SCF) will submit a memorandum to the Education Minister on October 4 demanding exemption of tuition fees till December next and supplying educational appliances to the country's flood affected students, reports UNB. Disclosing this at a press conference at Madhu's Canteen yesterday, the SCF leadership also demanded of the government to supply food, clothing and medicine among the flood-hit students through ration.

Project on road maintenance by distressed women taken up in CHT

The government, for the first, has taken up Tk 15.26 crore project for 'road maintenance by distressed women' in three hill districts of Rangamati, Khagrachhari and Bandarban, reports BSS. WHO top official lauds Dhaka's progress in health sector

Dr Gro Harlem Brundtland, Director General of World Health Organisation (WHO), yesterday said in Geneva that Bangladesh could prevent large scale catastrophe in the aftermath of floods due to its efficient disaster management system, reports BSS. 'Bangladesh has made remarkable progress in the areas of health and development,' Dr Brundtland, who is a former prime minister of Norway, observed while talking to Bangladesh ambassador to the United Nations office in Geneva Dr Iftekhar Ahmed Chowdhury.

The combination of these two factors have 'prevented any large scale catastrophe in the aftermath of the current floods,' she told Dr Chowdhury when he called on her at the WHO headquarters. The Bangladesh ambassador apprised Dr Brundtland of the relief operations being carried out in the country under the personal supervision of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

Dr Brundtland said WHO Regional Office in New Delhi, which has already responded to the UN-sponsored flash appeal, is focussing on 'prevention of communicable diseases and strengthening disease surveillance through supporting the laboratories along with some curative supplies.' She assured that in addition to earlier contribution, WHO headquarters in Geneva will provide health kits worth 60,000 US dollars.

Polish PM assures aid for flood affected people

Prime Minister of Poland Jerzy Buzek has expressed deep sympathy for the tragic flood disaster in Bangladesh and assured Polish aid to mitigate the sufferings of the flood victims, reports UNB. In a personal letter to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, he said the scale of this calamity in Bangladesh and heavy losses suffered by both the people and national economy have shocked him.

The enormity of tragic consequences caused by the floods is severe more as the flood has taken a heavy toll of human life, the Polish Prime Minister said. In this difficult time - on behalf of the entire Polish nation and my own, I wish to convey to you and to the people of Bangladesh our sincere expressions of solidarity. Buzek hoped that the government would be able to recover the heavy losses caused by the flood and the life would be recovered soon with the efforts of the people and assistance from international community.

Pandemonium at AL reception in NY

Two senior Awami League presidium members, Abdus Samad Azad and Amir Hossain Amu, were silent witnesses to a fist-fight and pandemonium at a meeting on Sunday in New York, UNB reports from New York. The two leaders who are now in New York to take part in the current session of the UN General Assembly were present at a reception organised by the party's US chapter.

The meeting arranged in honour of the two visiting party leaders, ended with police entering the hall and taking a local Awami League leader into custody after pandemonium broke out between rival factions. He was later released. A few chairs were tossed and some damage was done to the meeting room.

Factional rifts within the US chapter of Awami League has in the past caused serious disruptions at organisational meetings. However, this was the first time such a scuffle broke out in the presence of national leaders. Amir Hossain Amu said he had nothing to say. 'I am not interested in the subject,' he told UNB after attending a SAARC ministerial meeting at the United Nations.

Abdus Samad Azad also had a similar reaction. The Bangladesh Foreign Minister had to swallow the ignominy to witness the scuffle, despite his repeated requests for calm. Azad told journalists that he had no comments. 'What do you want me to say?' he snapped when a correspondent insisted him on commenting.

A Bangla weekly in New York later reported that the Foreign Minister had singled out two local Awami League leaders, Nurul Islam Onu and Farasat Ali, for masterminding the incident. A member of the Foreign Minister's entourage at the United Nations, however, told UNB that it was unlikely that Azad had made any such comment. Onu was not present at the Sunday meeting.
