Richards leaves reassured

'The International Cricket Council (ICC) have expressed its satisfaction over Dhaka's preparations for the forthcoming Wills International Cup scheduled to begin at the Bangabandhu National Stadium on October 24.

" During our three-day stay we have inspected the venue, its flood lights, the practice venues and also finalised various issues with the government and the board for the upcoming mega event and we are now all set for the tournament," said David Richards, Chief executive of the ICC who arrived in the city on Monday

Richards also disclosed that two different agreements were signed with the board and the government during their stay.

 We have signed a contract with the BCB on Tuesday regarding our sharing of the responsibilities as organiser and hosts. Besides another agreement was signed with the government this morning on the security, traffic, power supply insurance and customs aspects. These are very basic agreements required for official formalities," he added.

It might be added that Sadharan Bima Corporation have decided to extend insurance coverage of the tournament.

State Minister for Youth and Sports Obaidul Quader and BCB president Saber Hossain Chowdhury signed the agreement on behalf of the government and the board respec-



Rawalpindi Test begins today

Taylor set for another try

RAWALPINDI, Pakistan, Sept 30 (Reuters/ Internet): Australian captain Mark Taylor will be hoping to rewrite his personal

record book and Test match history when he leads his team out in the first of a three-match series against Pakistan starting on Thursday. Taylor is bidding to be the

first Australian captain to win a Test series in Pakistan in 39 years and erase memories of the pair he scored on his side's last visit here in 1994/95. "On my last tour here in

1994-95, I had just taken over the captaincy of Australia and started in a new role with a pair in the Karachi Test which Pakistan won, the memory of which is fresh in my mind and I want to erase that," he said.

It was in 1959-60 when, under Richie Benaud, the Australians last won a three-match

series in Pakistan with victories in two Tests but none in 13 subsequent Tests.

But Taylor has grown in stature as a batsman and captain with victories against West Indies, South Africa and England in 22 wins from 42 Tests. "We hope to play as well as

on the last tour here but we would need a lot of luck on this tour. Pakistan is a very strong side and we realise that they are even stronger at home but we are here to play exciting and en-tertaining cricket," he said. "Although Shane Warne is not with us, we do have Stuart MacGill who has done well in the opening game of the tour and he could be useful." he said. Asked about the official

Zimbabwe beat India



BULAWAYO, Zimbabwe, Sept 30 (Internet): Zimbabwe beat India by 37 runs in the third and final one-day cricket match at Harare Sports Club on Wednes-

day. India won the series 2-1. The visitors were on the back foot throughout the afternoon and, hard though they fought, they were never quite able to make up the deficit.

There was a sensational start as Sachin Tendulkar, with only two runs to his credit. clipped Heath Streak to midwicket for Craig Evans to take a good low catch. Genius though he is. Tendulkar has perhaps been a little too casual about keeping the ball on the ground during this series, and his one good score came in the first match only after being dropped twice. This vital wicket inspired Zimbabwe further, and they played with a fire and a passion, which had been lacking in Bulawayo.

When Mohammad Azharuddin also fell for two, caught at slip off Eddo Brandes and the score was 10 for two. Zimbabwe really knew

they could win. Brandes and Streak were together again in partnership and both bowled well, although perhaps not quite as magnificently as they have

at times in the past. Saurav Ganguly and Ajay Jadeja were forced to fight for survival. As the required scoring rate began to mount, they knew they had to take risks and hit a few uppish strokes. Ganguly in particular took his chances against Evans,

hitting him for three uppish fours in four balls. Jadeja was first to go, though, attempting to hit Pommy Mbangwa for six over long-off and being well caught by the tall Andrew Whittall high on the very edge of the boundary. Andy Flower caught Ganguly down the leg side as he attempted to glance Adam Huckle.

Then came a good partnership between Rahul Dravid and Robin Singh.

After a stand of 57 Dravid drove a catch straight to midon, but this was followed by another good partnership, of 54, with Mongia. Singh, who scored 57, looked particularly dangerous, especially when some of the Zimbabwean bowlers allowed him free rein on the leg side, where he hit three huge sixes. In the end, though, he perished by the sword, caught on the deep square leg boundary.

Zimbabwe found their best form too late, but this win will have given them a boost for the Test match. Earlier, Craig Wishart's maiden one-day international century guided Zimbabwe to a respectable total of 259 for five.

Just four fours and two sixes flew of opener Wishart's bat but he grafted superbly for his 102 off 122 balls before he was spectacularly caught and bowled by Ajit Agarkar in the 48th over. an over after reaching his cen-

With Andy Flower, whose 55 included three fours and two sixes and came off 73 deliveries, Wishart shared 113 runs for the third wicket. Their partnership lasted

Later, Craig Wishart's century earned him the player-ofthe-match award; the player-of the-series was rather more difficult. Only Campbell, with two fifties, had really starred in more than one of the three matches, but adjudicators Mike Haysman and Ravi Shastri decided on Tendulkar.


